
ARCHBISHOP FISHER WRITES:

A bill is due to be debated in NSW Parliament on Tuesday which, if passed,

would see abortion made legal in NSW up until birth.

The bill was only announced a week ago, and then pushed for debate and vote as a priority, meaning that the general public, and those concerned about abortion in this state, were denied the opportunity to make their views known to their MPs.

It should come as a surprise to no one that there are strong views in the community regarding vulnerable human life. But it seems that those behind this bill, with the assistance of leaders in the



main political parties, are determined to stop the people from NSW having their say on this important matter.

Despite the lack of consultation and the rush through Parliament, it appears that co-ordination was occurring in secret for a long time in a co-ordinated effort that involved representatives from most political parties.

No other state has acted so swiftly and with such lack of consultation when it comes to abortion legislation. Both Tasmania and Victoria spent many months consulting the public and debating their laws in parliament.

As concerning as the process is, the proposed change to the law is even more troubling.

If passed, the bill would allow abortion right up to birth, for any reason, if two doctors agree.

It makes no mention of, nor provides any support for women who find themselves distressed and unsupported in their pregnancy, and feel as if they have no option other than abortion.

It provides no protection for women experiencing violence (According to the Australian Bureau of Statistics' Personal Safety Survey, 48 per cent Continued on Page 7


THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD JESUS CHRIST

FEAST DAY TUESDAY AUGUST, 6 2019

Our divine Redeemer, being in Galilee about a year before His sacred Passion, took with him St. Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, Sts. James and John, and led them to a retired mountain. Tradition assures us that this was Mount Thabor, which is exceedingly high and beautiful, and was anciently covered with green trees and shrubs, and was very fruitful. It rises something like a sugar-loaf, in a vast plain in the middle of Galilee. This was the place in which the Man-God appeared in His glory.

Whilst Jesus prayed, he suffered that glory which was always due to his sacred humility, and of which, for our sake, He deprived it, to diffuse a ray over His whole body. His face was altered and shone as the sun, and his garments became white as snow. Moses and Elijah were seen by the three apostles in his company on this occasion, and were heard discoursing with him of the death which he was to suffer in Jerusalem.

The three apostles were wonderfully delighted with this



glorious vision, and St. Peter cried out to Christ, "Lord, it is good for us to be here. Let us make three tents: one for thee, one for Moses, and one for Elijah" Whilst St. Peter was speaking, there came, on a sudden, a bright shining cloud from heaven, an emblem of the presence of God's majesty, and from out of this cloud was heard a voice which said, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased; hear ye him" The apostles that were present, upon hearing this voice, were seized with a sudden fear, and fell upon the ground; but Jesus, going to them, touched them, and bade them to rise. They immediately did so, and saw no one but Jesus standing in his ordinary state.

This vision happened in the night. As they went down the mountain early the next morning, Jesus bade them not to tell anyone what they had seen till he should be risen from the dead. https://www.catholicculture.org/culture/liturgicalyear/calendar/day.cfm?date=2018-08-06

ST MARY MACKILLOP

MASS OF THE SAINT, THURSDAY AUGUST 8 SEEK FIRST THE KINDOM OF GOD

Colossians 3:12-17; Matthew 6:25-34

Reading the Gospel in the context of this feast, it is difficult to step aside from the life experience of Mary Mackillop to offer an objective commentary. So much of this text speaks to the spirituality and also the struggle of this great Australian Saint.

It is important to place this short text within its wider literary context as a part of Matthew's great Sermon on the Mount, which begins in Matthew 5. Here, as Matthew describes it, Jesus goes up a mountain and sits down. By this action Matthew indicates Jesus' role as a teacher in the tradition of Moses. As Moses delivered the Law on Mt Sinai, now Jesus teaches the values for his community: the poor are considered blessed, as are those who seek peace, and those persecuted for the sake of righteousness.

The Sermon continues with Jesus reinterpreting the Mosaic Law, placing more emphasis on the inner attitudes a person has and not simply on external actions. This reinterpretation takes the form, 'you have heard it said ... but I say to you'.

Chapter 6 then moves into teaching on prayer and fasting. In all these ways, Jesus teaches his disciples that what matters

attitude one has towards others, towards wealth especially towards God. This attitude is summed up in the first beatitude to have a poverty of spirit that with lives utter confidence in God's gratuitous love. Gospel Today's then follows.

This passage goes into more detail about what poverty of spirit looks like. Jesus uses many images to teach



his disciples the foolishness of anxiety. God's generosity in nature should lead them to trust God's generosity towards them. The birds of the air are fed; the flowers in the field are arrayed in splendid colours. For disciples, the true treasure is the life of God. This is to be the primary concern.

This section within the Sermon on the Mount is referred to as the 'teaching on anxieties'. Scholars note that there is here an essential paradox between two different horizons – the present and the future. In the present disciples are counselled – 'be not anxious'; and for the future, 'seek first the Kingdom and righteousness of God'. Security in this world seems to be only possible through having sufficient wealth for food and clothes. This can create an illusion that life is under control. Jesus' teaching is a reminder that such a sense of self-sufficiency is an illusion. Life is not under my control. Life is utterly gift of God, and so the only truthful way of living is to live within the graciousness of God and let go the illusions of management.

When reflecting on the Religious Congregation she founded and its difficulties, Mary Mackillop spoke in words that reflect Jesus' teaching on anxiety.

'Don't be troubled about the future of the Institute; I am not. He Whose work it is will take care of it.'

The passage from Colossians, chosen for this Feast, expresses the Christian virtues that were obvious in Mary MacKillop's life – compassion, kindness, humility, meekness and patience. Above all, Mary exemplified the virtue of patient forbearance and forgiveness in her dealings with Church authorities. She suffered through excommunication with dignity and faithfulness to the church, while also being a woman of courage and single-minded determination to provide education for those in need. There is much in her life to celebrate and give thanks for – and much to emulate.

* The Greek term basileia is usually translated as reign or Kingdom of God. This can suggest a spatial reality rather than a relational concept. I use the term 'kindom' in an attempt to show that Jesus' teaching about the basileia is not about a political or spatial concept but rather a new relationship with God. © Mary Coloe

Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed - and he is your life - you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

That is why you must kill everything in you that belongs only to earthly life: fornication, impurity, quilty passion, evil desires and especially greed, which is the same thing as worshipping a false god; and never tell each other lies. You have stripped off your old behaviour with your old self, and you have put on a new self which will progress towards true knowledge the more it is renewed in the image of its creator; and in that image there is no room for distinction between Greek and Jew, between the circumcised or the uncircumcised, or between barbarian and Scythian, slave and free man. There is only Christ: he is everything and he is in everything.

Then he said, "This is what I will do; I will pull down my barns and build bigger ones, and store all my grain and my goods in them, and I will say to my soul: My soul, you have plenty of good things laid by for many years

Seek the things that are above to come; take things easy, eat, drink, have a good time." But God said to him, "Fool! This very night the demand will be made for your soul; and this hoard of yours, whose will it be then?" So it is when a man stores up treasure for himself in place of making himself rich in the sight of God.'

COMMENTARY

Where is your treasure?

Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11; Luke 12:13-

Today's Gospel gives us some insight into the concerns of Luke's community living towards the end of the first century. The issues of money, possessions and inheritance reflect the wealthier urban context of Luke's community rather than the rural village life of Jesus' mission. These same issues are very relevant for us today. How does a Christian live within the complex world of economics and global profit?

Jesus' words offer much wisdom. Security, and I would add happiness, does not come in owning more and more possessions. Security lies elsewhere. Having possessions is not the problem in this passage; it is insatiable greed in wanting more and more. This is the point of the parable.

Matthew's Gospel teaches the same point this way: 'Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.' (Matt 6:21) So today might be well spent reflecting on these questions: 'Where is my treasure?' 'What is it in my life that I really value?' 'Where does my heart lie?' Where the parable speaks of harvests and barns, translate this into your own circumstances, a second car, a mobile phone, a bigger ..., the latest ..., a better ...

Sometimes life itself forces a person to reflect on the point of today's Gospel - a person hears s/he has a malignant tumour, or a failing heart. At these crisis times we can quickly re-evaluate the priorities in life, sometimes regretting that this lesson is learnt with little time left. Today, with life and time still available, check up on your true wealth, your real security.

Using the images and terms of his age Paul addresses much the same issue in this section from Colossians. Paul says, focus on God – this is to be your treasure. Anything that gets in the way of this wealth needs to be cut out from your life. At the heart of both readings lies the question of where to find true happiness, and deep inner peace. These passages remind me of a story told by the Indian Jesuit priest Anthony De Mello -
