LENTEN PENANCE

In the liturgy and liturgical catechesis of Lent, the reminder of baptism already received or the preparation for its reception, as well as the theme of repentance, renew the entire community along with those being prepared to celebrate the paschal mystery, in which each of the elect will share through the sacraments of initiation. For both the elect and the local community, therefore, the Lenten season is a time of spiritual recollection in preparation for the celebration of the paschal mystery. RC/A 125

This year the season of Lent commences on Ash Wednesday, 26 February, and concludes on Thursday 9 April. In our Catholic tradition, it is marked as a time for conversion, repentance, and renewal. It begins on Ash Wednesday with the imposition of ashes coupled with the words of invitation, "Turn away from sin and believe the good news". In this annual invitation, we recognise our human frailty and our reliance on the grace and mercy of God.

As Jesus fasted for forty days and forty nights in the desert (Matthew 4: 1-1 I); he accompanies us as we too make the journey into the desert of our souls. It is there that we are encouraged to resist and turn away from sin, which places limitation on our lives and relationships. It is precisely in those moments of vulnerability that we are called to take refuge in the God of mercy and compassion.

Lent is a time of pruning back the obstacles in our relationships so that we might flourish and have "life to the full" Uohn I 0: I 0). Through the season of Lent we come to Easter, which is a celebration of the life, death, and resurrection of Christ. It is a joyful time to celebrate the new life promised to us and the whole world by the risen Jesus, our hope and our salvation.

DAYS OF PENANCE

On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, abstinence from meat is to be observed by those who have completed their fourteenth year of age. Those who are aged between 18 and 60 are to fast on these days. Priests should encourage those under their pastoral care to embrace the spirit of abstinence and fasting. This Lenten practice is not to be a burden upon those who have health issues or special needs.



On all other Fridays of the year the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing any one of the following:

I. Prayer - for example, Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to a church or chapel; reading the Bible; making the Stations of the Cross; praying the Rosary; or in other ways;

2. Self-denial - for example, not eating meat; not eating sweets or desserts; giving up entertainment to spend time with the family; limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor in one's own country and elsewhere; or in other ways; 3. Helping others - for example, special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or overburdened or feeling isolated from our Church community; or in other ways.

Lent is from Ash Wednesday (26 February 2020) until to Mass of the Lord's Supper

(9 April 2020) inclusive. Fasting is also observed on Good Friday and if possible on Holy

Saturday until the Easter Vigil.

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY **BY DIANNE BERGANT CSA**

two-part passage that serves as the first reading for today. The first part is an injunction to be holy as God is holy. The holiness of God is the ground of all religious living. God is holy, and the people with whom God is in covenant are required to be holv as well. Holiness is much broader in scope than mere goodness. It might best be understood as 'godness'. The life of holiness to which we are called requires integrity, honesty, and faithfulness to one another. These are very demanding values, but they give us a glimpse of what the holiness of God is like.

The responsorial psalm begins with a

reason for praising God is God's willingness to pardon, to heal, and to redeem or save. These are all acts that flow from God's loving kindness and compassion, two attributes closely associated with covenantal commitment. God's compassion is immeasurable, extending from 'east to west'. It is much more than empathy. It comes from the Hebrew word for 'womb', suggesting that God's compassion love is like the love a mother has for the children of her womb. In other words, God's compassion might be called 'womb-love'.

Paul insists that the temple of God is no longer a material building. Rather, it is the collection of people gathered in God's name. According to him, the Corinthians are this temple. Paul then contrasts the wisdom of the world with the wisdom of God. He argues that the standards the world uses to determine wisdom are frequently diametrically opposed to the standards of God. Therefore, those who wish to be wise with God's wisdom will have to choose a path that may be judged foolish by the standards of the world. The reading ends with a discussion about boasting, that false pride the Corinthians took in identifying with various religious leaders. Such boasting is evidence of the wisdom of the world, a wisdom which must be overturned

'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth', known as lex talionis, was really a moral advance over the common custom of blood vengeance, that is, exacting a price that far exceeds the wrong that was done. Jesus instructs his disciples to offer no resistance at all when someone tries to take advantage of them. He then reinterprets the law of love in an even more radical manner, insisting that his disciples' love must be patterned after God's love, which is given unquestioningly to the just and the unjust alike. If they only love those who love them, but harm those who harm them, they are merely fulfilling the lex talionis admonition. Those who would be known as children of God are expected to love as God does.


