HOPE: A MISUNDERSTOOD VIRTUE

We all face difficult moments of darkness and anxiety when things can become difficult. Some may become disillusioned with life and lose hope. During these challenging times, hope can also be misunderstood. We may think that it is having a positive attitude or being optimistic. We may place our hope in things of this world, such as our work or charitable projects, thinking they will bring us happiness.

Pope Francis reminds us that true hope is not built on human words or assurances, but on God's Word and His promise of salvation and eternal life. The Easter season is a time to reflect on the effects of Jesus' Resurrection, the opening of heaven for humanity. It is a time of joy together. It can also be a good time to reflect on the true nature of hope and on those who can act as models of it for us today.

THE THEOLOGICAL VIRTUE OF HOPE

Hope is perhaps the most difficult of the three theological virtues to understand. It can be described as an unshakable trust and assurance that the promises of God will be fulfilled. This trust is based on what He has done for us in His Son Jesus, through His Death and Resurrection. Like faith, it is not a human attitude or opinion, but it is a gift of the Holy Spirit. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* describes the true nature and meaning of the virtue. It states:

God has placed in each of our hearts the desire and longing for true happiness. The virtue of hope responds to this innermost desire and helps us to place our trust in God. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* describes the work and function of hope. It states:

Jesus used the image of the kingdom of God to express the content of our hope. He used parables, images, and symbols to describe what is eternal and invisible to the human eye. St. Paul declares, "Now hope that sees for itself is not hope. For who hopes for what one sees?" (Romans 8:24). This gift of the Holy Spirit helps us envision what still cannot be seen and which would otherwise be impossible to expect.

MODELS OF HOPE

For St. Paul, hope is a person, it is Christ Himself. It is more than simply a desire for the joys of eternal life, rather is a desire to be with Jesus. To be with the Lord forever is the heart's deepest desire, even more profound than its desire for life itself (Thessalonians 4:17). It stems from the believer's sincere love of Jesus. St. Paul assures us, "I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to

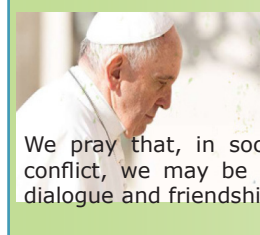


separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:38-39). It is this assurance of the love and presence of Jesus and His Father that allows anyone who is suffering to find encouragement and comfort. Jesus Himself, and His love for each of us, is the reason for our hope.

Pope St. John Paul II mentioned that the Blessed Virgin Mary is a model of this virtue for the Church. She was also called to believe what was unbelievable in human terms. The archangel Gabriel announced to her that she would become the mother of God. She opened her heart and trusted in God's guidance. Mary placed her trust in the everlasting kingdom which her Son had come to establish. She stood faithfully by His cross. Hope is what filled the Blessed Virgin Mary's heart during the dark days after her Son's death on the cross. From Friday afternoon until Sunday morning, Mary's heart remained filled as she waited for Jesus to rise from the dead just as He had said (Mark 8:31). She waited patiently for God's promise to be fulfilled. After Pentecost, she strengthened the Church's hope when they encountered difficulties, suffering, and persecution.

Pope John Paul II stated in *Mary: Model of Faith, Hope, and Charity*:

[Mary] is thus the Mother of hope for the community of believers and for individual Christians, and she encourages and guides her children as they await the kingdom, supporting them in their daily trials and throughout the events of history, however tragic.

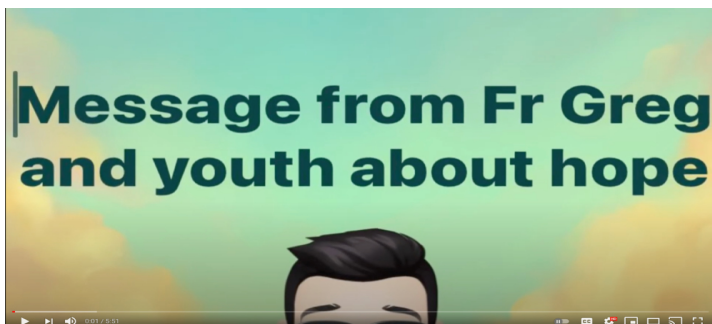

Dear Grandfathers and Grandmothers, Dear Elderly Friends,

"I am with you always" (Mt 28:20):

this is the promise the Lord made to his disciples before he ascended into heaven.

They are the words that he repeats to you today, dear grandfathers and grandmothers, dear elderly friends.

"I am with you always" are also the words that I, as Bishop of Rome and an elderly person like yourselves, would like to address to you on this first World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly.

The whole Church is close to you – to us – and cares about you, loves you and does not want to leave you alone!

I am well aware that this Message comes to you at a difficult time: the pandemic swept down on us like an unexpected and furious storm; it has been a time of trial for everyone, but especially for us elderly persons.

Many of us fell ill, others died or experienced the death of spouses or loved ones, while others found themselves isolated and alone for long periods.

The Lord is aware of all that we have been through in this time.

He is close to those who felt isolated and alone, feelings that became more acute during the pandemic.

Tradition has it that Saint Joachim, the grandfather of Jesus, felt estranged from those around him because he had no children; his life, like that of his wife Anne, was considered useless.

So the Lord sent an angel to console him. While he mused sadly outside the city gates, a messenger from the Lord appeared to him and said, "Joachim, Joachim! The Lord has heard your insistent prayer".

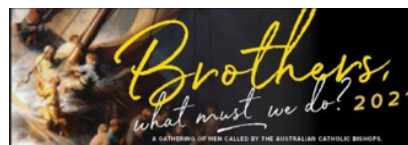

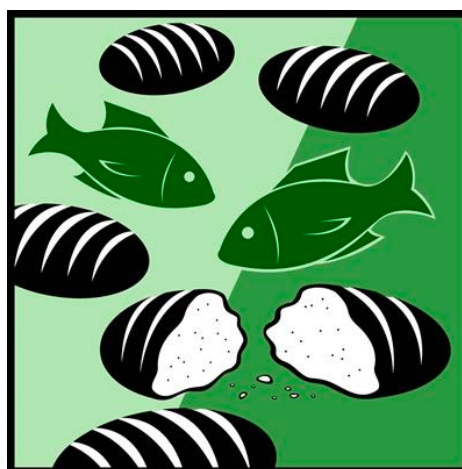

JN 6:1-15

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

He distributed to those who were seated as much as they wanted.



Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee – or of Tiberias – and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover.

Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks and gave them out to all who were

sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

In an episode in the life of the prophet Elisha, a man who brings grain comes from a place that is named for and probably devoted to Baal, the Canaanite god of fertility. Presumably he intends it to be offered to the god worshipped at that shrine. The prophet directs that the bread and grain be given to the people who were suffering from famine. Those who ministered at the shrine objected, but Elisha insisted, and his insistence overrode their objection. This is clear evidence of the authority that the 'man of God' wielded, and that the others recognised. One hundred men were fed by a mere twenty loaves. The miracle reveals the bounteous generosity of God.

The responsorial psalm is a hymn of praise. The psalmist invites all of God's works to give thanks, proclaims the Lord's universal providence, and extols divine righteousness. The works of the Lord include everything that God has made as well as everything that God has done. The faithful of the Lord are those who are bound to God in covenant loyalty. They are summoned to praise God in reverence and awe. A vivid image is used to depict both the dependence of all living creatures and the generosity of God. All of life stands needy and trusting before God in whose hands is the sustenance upon which life depends, and God is open-handed in satisfying this need.

Paul exhorts the converts to live according to social virtues that characterise the Christian life. His imprisonment demonstrates the price that he himself is willing to pay for his convictions. All the virtues are relational attitudes that foster community harmony. This harmony is grounded in their belonging to the one body of Christ, their being filled with and fashioned by one Spirit of God, and their being moved by the one hope of their call to salvation. Their life is Trinitarian; they

have all been called by God to salvation in Christ through the Spirit. This unity is expressed in their allegiance to one Lord, their commitment to one faith, and their celebration of one baptism.

The power of Jesus had a mesmerising effect on the crowds. They followed him from place to place. However, they did this less out of faith than out of the hope that they might witness the performance of some marvel. Jesus took the barley loaves (note the link with the Feast of Unleavened Bread), gave thanks (eucharisté), distributed them, and then did the same with the fish. The Eucharistic allusions here are obvious. Once again the crowds were overwhelmed by Jesus. They had followed him to the other side of the lake in order to witness his exceptional power. They were not disappointed. However, they now recognise him as more than a wonder-worker. He is the long-awaited prophet like Moses (cf. Deut 15:18), the one who would usher in the messianic age.

Dianne Bergant CSA was a Professor of Biblical Studies at Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, where she taught from 1978 to 2014. She holds a BS in Elementary Education from Marian College, Fond du Lac, WI; an MA and PhD in Biblical Languages and Literature from St Louis University. Amongst other things, she served as President of Catholic Biblical Association of America (2000-2001) and has been awarded honorary doctorates from several other universities. She was an active member of the Chicago Catholic/Jewish Scholars Dialogue (1988-2017) and sat on the editorial boards of The Bible Today (1979-2005), Biblical Theology Bulletin (1990-2014), Catholic Biblical Quarterly (1992-2001), New Theology Review (1997-2003), Teaching Theology and Religion (2003-2005), and Chicago Studies (2003-2009). She has taught and lectured in many places in the United States and abroad and has written numerous books, articles and chapters in books.

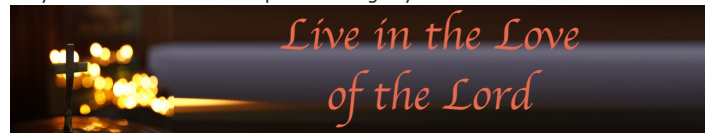
