SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

The same Greek word (glōssa) is used for the tongues of fire and for the foreign tongues that were subsequently spoken. There is question whether the reference here is to communicative speech (foreign tongues) or ecstatic speech called glossolalia. Since the spectators did understand the bold proclamations, the meaning here seems to be communicative rather than ecstatic speech. The exact nature of this marvel is less significant than is its meaning. It was clearly a manifestation of the universal presence and power of the Spirit.

This hymn is remarkable in its depiction of God as the creator and sustainer of all life. God is robed in majesty and glory, wrapped around with radiant light. God is perceived through the glories of creation. God is also extolled as the one who cares for all living things. All creatures look to God for sustenance. The act of creation and power of the creator are perceived in the constant renewal of life that unfolds before our eyes. In a very real sense, creation is more than a primordial event, it is a personal experience.

Finally, God not only creates but also re-creates. The ongoing forces of nature are re-creative. Life is sustained and perpetuated.

The acclamation 'Jesus is Lord!' is rich in both Jewish and Christian meaning. Lord (kýrios) was the official title of the Roman emperor. To proclaim Jesus as Lord was to set up a rivalry between the followers of Jesus and political authority. The word 'Lord' is also used in the Greek version of the First Testament as a substitute for God's personal name. To use this title for Jesus is to ascribe to him the attributes of God. Paul's discourse on the varieties of functions within the Christian community includes his analogy of the diversity in the human body. Each part has its own unique function, but all parts work for the good of the whole.

In this gospel, the bestowal of the Spirit occurred on the evening of the day of resurrection. Sabbath, the conclusion

of the week, now the focus is on the beginning, on the future. The doors are locked, underscoring the mysterious character of Jesus' risen body. He wishes them peace, the eschatological blessings of health, prosperity and all good things, thus proclaiming the arrival of this time of fulfilment. He calls attention to his wounds, lest they think he is a figment of their imaginations or some kind of ghost from the nether world. He wishes them peace again, bestows the Spirit on them by breathing on them, reminiscent of the creation of Adam (cf. Gen 2:7). He then commissions them to go forth to declare salvation and judgment. With the bestowal of the Spirit, the disciples are authorised to continue the mission of Jesus.



They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

In the one Spirit we were all baptised, making one body.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.


