It is clear that the mysterious figure of Woman Wisdom is not human, but is she divine? She is called the first of God's ways, the one before all of God's other deeds. If she comes from God, might she be the personification of some quality of the creator? Whatever her origin, she is present and active during God's wondrous acts of creation. There is only one God, and that God effortlessly establishes the entire universe in tranquility and order. Woman Wisdom acted as craftsperson or architect for this magnificent project, and so the principles of wisdom are woven into the very fabric of creation. Finally, this same Wisdom takes delight in the human race.

LIVING THE GOSPEL TRINITY

Every time we make the sign of the cross we reaffirm our belief in a God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Although some people have difficulties with the gender-specific language of 'Father' and 'Son' and look for other ways to express this reality, all Christian people profess a belief in the one God who is experienced in three distinct ways. We are baptised 'in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit' and we remind ourselves of this reality when we pray and when we bless ourselves or others.

The responsorial psalm praises God for some of the wonders of the universe. It is the splendour of the moon and the stars, once thought to be celestial deities but now considered creatures of God, that brings the psalmist to stand in wonder of God's plan for weak and limited human beings. God is an incalculable honour, it is also a tremendous responsibility.

According to Paul, the justification of the Roman Christians is an accomplished fact. They have already been reconciled with God; their guilt has already been forgiven. They are now in right relationship with God through their faith in Jesus Christ. It is through Christ that believers are granted the grace to stand in the presence of God.

There is a touch of already-but-not-yet eschatological thinking here. Those justified by faith already have peace with God, already have access to grace. However, they still wait in hope for the ultimate glory of God. The Trinitarian nature of Paul's faith and teaching is clear. Because of the reconciliation won for us by Christ, the love of God is poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit.

The gospel writer shows the relationship between the Father, Jesus and the Spirit by relating all three to the teaching of Jesus. What we find here are only seeds of Trinitarian theology that will come to fruition at another time. Jesus states that his disciples will not understand his teaching until they are taught by the Spirit of truth. It will be through the Spirit's unfolding of the depths of the mysteries which Jesus proclaimed, that this same Spirit will glorify Jesus and reveal him to be the chosen one of God. This Spirit is sent from the Father to bring these teachings to fruition. The Spirit glorifies Jesus by bringing to light the deeper truth of his teaching, teaching that also belongs to God.




