


SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY


The reading from Genesis follows a classic story form well known in the ancient Near East. Heavenly beings in human guise receive hospitality from simple people and reward them with the announcement of a future birth of a child. Israel made use of this story to tell of God's promise of a child to Abraham. Sarah's significance im the story is clear. She is named rather than merely identified as Abraham's wife. Furthermore, the child is identified as her son not Abraham's. Obviously this woman will play an important role in the life of the child. All of this points to the extraordinary nature of the yet unborn child.

The psalm addresses the question of the moral fitness required for standing in the divine presence. The requirements, communal in nature, require that one live virtuously with others. 'Walk' denotes a way of life rather than individual actions. The foundation of this way of life is righteousness or justice, a characteristic of God. Whatever conforms to God's norm is considered righteous. In the

human sphere it takes on the meaning of justice. Such faithfulness is not merely external conformity; it originates in one's innermost being. What follows are examples of concrete behaviour in everyday life, particularly in economic matters. The psalm ends with a promise of blessing for those who live with others in this righteous manner. They will know peace and security.

Paul believes that his sufferings fill up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ's body (the church). He does not mean that the sufferings of Jesus were in any way lacking in their atoning efficacy. Rather, he believes that, joined to Jesus, his own sufferings have merit and are part of the sufferings that inaugurate the messianic age. This is why Paul can claim to rejoice in his sufferings, regardless of the agony he might be enduring. He also considers the doctrine of salvation to the Gentiles a mystery hidden for ages. According to Paul, all those baptised are transformed in Christ; they are the saints. Having tasted the glory of Christ at the time of their baptism, they await in hope the fullness of that glory.

The scene depicted in the gospel is quite extraordinary. The house belongs to Martha, and she is the one who welcomes Jesus. She fulfils the customary responsibilities of hospitality. Mary is seated at Jesus' feet, the customary place of a disciple, and she is listening to his words, a technical phrase that connotes either the fundamental proclamation of the good news or instruction that flows from it. Though both sisters are faithful disciples of Jesus, one listening to his word and the other performing service, Mary is said to have chosen the better part, which is immediate attention to Jesus. This attentiveness will eventually express itself in appropriate service.

Enrollments close on July 18 which is the first day back at school. If you have any questions please call the office.





Members of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia met for a final session last weekend to bring to a conclusion the second general assembly, held across six days in Sydney. In addition to celebrating the final Mass on Saturday

In addition to celebrating the final Mass on Saturday morning, Members also approved a concluding statement, reflecting on the discernment that took place during their week together.

The statement said there had been an "expression of synodality that Pope Francis has identified as a key dimension of the Church's life in the third millennium".

While some moments during the week had been "calm and harmonious", the statement also acknowledged there were times that were "tense and difficult", however "every moment has been blessed, the entire week has been grace-filled, though never a cheap grace. The Holy Spirit has been both comforter and disrupter".

Attending the Council with Bishop Anthony Randazzo

Newell; Director, Catholic Schools Broken Bay, Danny Casey and Hornsby Cathedral parishioner, Raj Rajasingham.

Bishop Anthony said after the closing Mass while there were tense and challenging times, the Holy Spirt was very much alive in the room during the Council and there was great energy.

Danny Casey said; "The Plenary was called to strengthen the faith life in Australia and to find new ways of bringing all closer to Christ. This must remain our focus.

The journey has been a memorable experience with good discussion among those who love the Church."

He said all new proposals need to be assessed against the main purpose – bringing people closer to God and His Church.

After nearly four and a half years in preparation, on Saturday morning Council Members confirmed the decrees of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia, which were then signed by all bishops present. After the November meeting of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, the decrees will be sent to the Holy See.

On behalf of the Holy Land Custody of the Franciscan Friars and the Christians of the Holy Land, I would like to sincerely thank you and your parishioners for your generous contribution of \$2,585 to the Good Friday Holy Land Collection for 2022.

As I mentioned in my Good Friday Letter to all the Catholic faithful, since the outbreak of the Covid pandemic, it has been a particularly difficult time for the Church and people of the Holy Land and the countries that make up the Franciscan Custody. 


