SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

The first reading is a short discourse on humility. The author admonishes the student to be content with things that are possible: Don't reach for what exceeds your grasp; don't try to do what is beyond your strength. The value of this advice, as with all wisdom teaching, depends upon the circumstances. The reading ends somewhat abruptly with a poetic phrase that introduces a new theme. Both the water and the alms wipe out what is detrimental. The advice contained in this passage directs the student to develop an attitude of humility regardless of status within the community and to meet the needs of the less fortunate. It is good counsel for all regardless of one's social standing.

The psalm response begins with a statement describing the praise that God receives from the righteous. The phrase 'before God' (in the face of God) is frequently associated with being in the presence of God during some cultic celebration. Later mention of God's holy dwelling (v.6) confirms this meaning. God is depicted as father of orphans and defender of widows, two categories of people who, in a patriarchal society, had no legal protection. The people are called the inheritance of God (v.10) and the flock of God (v.11), both references to their special election. God is also cast as the storm god from whom comes the fertility of the land, an image of the creator. Thus Israel sees God as both creator and redeemer.

The second reading compares ancient Israel's experience of God on Mount Sinai and the eschatological experience of God on the transformed Mount Zion. On Sinai, darkness, fire and storm imply an experience of God. However, the people were forbidden to advance too closely. As basic as was the covenant established at this time, these features discouraged access to the divine. The encounter with God on Mount Zion is different. In the age of fulfilment, all people would eventually gather there to worship. Through his blood, Jesus is the mediator of the new covenant, a covenant that does not repudiate the first covenant, but brings it to its eschatological fulfilment.

Jesus was watched by other guests at a dinner. However, he is the one who found fault, and he is the one who delivered two ethical directives, one intended for the guests and the other for the host. Proper placement at banquets was important for a society preoccupied with questions of honour and shame. Jesus does not criticise this, but he finds fault with the arrogant attitude of those who think that they are more important than they really are. He then criticises the practice of inviting only those who are able to reciprocate in kind. The poor and needy should be invited. Jesus first redefines what is honourable behaviour, and then he redefines who are honoured guests.

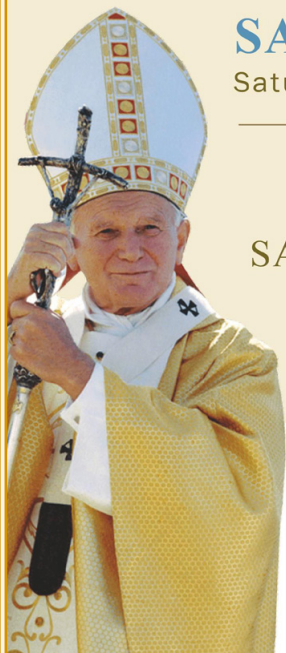

PARISH COMPLEX UPDATES SAFETY RAMP AND PATHWAYS

Firstly thank you for your patience whilst we undertook the work providing ramped access from Victoria Street for the disabled or infirm which should be open for use very shortly. Though considered safe as it is, handrails will be attached in the very near future. We are sure you would agree that this ramp answers the needs of 2022 when safe access should be available to all.

We would like to thank bricklayer, Mark Bennett, for his construction and management skills, together some of our MenAlive group who came to assist where possible. We were lucky in that we managed to sell the brick pavers that were lifted to make way for the concrete paths. We'd also like to thank the parishioner who prefers to remain anonymous for her generous sponsorship of this project.

Resurfacing our Pathways

On September 19 work will commence on making our York Street entrance and pathways to the church more uniform. We have contracted a concrete coating specialist to apply a resin coating over the old pebblecreted areas as well as all other pathways to the church building [including the new ramp] creating a fresh and consistent look with this non-slip surface. We have had a hotch-potch of materials used at these areas over time and know that this will be a great improvement.

NEW EXTERNAL DOORS

You will see the first of the new doors has been installed at the western York Street access to the church and that we are working towards a more open and inviting façade. Work will be slow but will be completed by the opening of the Shrine. For those concerned about the fate of the copper doors, please be assured that will not be going to the tip, but recycled elsewhere.

BUS DRIVER NEEDED

WE DO NOT HAVE A BUS DRIVER TO BRING OUR ELDERLY TO MASS ON THE 4TH SUNDAY OF EACH MONTH

This situation is desperate. We need a Light Rigid licenced driver to bring our beautiful seniors who have no other method of getting to Mass, to help out only once a month. Currently some of our other drivers are doing double shifts and that is too much to ask. If we do not find a driver we may have to delete this service each 4th Sunday. A designated helper will assist with passengers. If there are times when you couldn't manage the 4th Sunday, swapping could be arranged with one of the other drivers. Please speak with Father or call the office urgently.

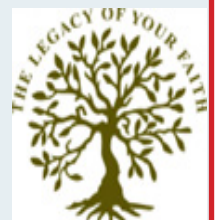

A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'
