SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY BY DIANNE BERGANT CSA

The poem from the Book of Wisdom declares the limitations of human wisdom. Arguing from the more important to the less important, or vice versa (e.g., 'If it is like this in the green wood, what will it be like in the dry?' [Luke 23:31]), it insists that no one can fathom the mind of God. The author exclaims that we will attain the wisdom we so sorely seek only if God bestows it upon us. The holy spirit of which the author speaks should not be understood as the third person of the Trinity. The sense of the spirit found here eventually may have been incorporated into Christianity's Trinitarian theology, but here it probably only refers to the immateriality of the things of God.

The responsorial psalm has features of the lament, but its primary theme comes from the wisdom tradition. The issue that seems to consume the psalmist is the transitoriness of human existence. Unlike God, for whom a thousand years are but a blink of the eye, humans have a very brief life span. This prayer comes from a community that is in great distress. The people feel deserted by God, unable to free themselves from their plight. Daybreak usually brings thoughts of hope. However, when it appears that relief is not on the horizon that is slowly taking shape, discouragement turns to desperation and hope evaporates





like early morning dew in the light of day. The psalm ends with petitions.

Paul makes a personal appeal to accept back with no recriminations a slave who had escaped Philemon's household. Paul has been criticised by many for not condemning slavery itself. However, he asks that Onesimus be treated like a brother, an attitude that will eventually undermine slavery. Paul taught that in Christ there were no longer slaves or free persons; all were children of God. Now he challenges Philemon to witness to his own belief in this teaching. Paul claims to be Onesimus' spiritual father and he looks upon him as his child. He even considers him his very heart. This personal relationship probably placed even more pressure on Philemon to receive the slave warmly upon his return. Here Paul appeals both to Philemon's Christian conscience and to his indebtedness to Paul.

The cost of discipleship is the basis of the teaching of Jesus in this gospel passage. It is important to note that despite what appear to be extreme demands, the instruction is addressed to the crowds and not simply to those who have already committed themselves to basic discipleship and who are now being called to even deeper commitment and intimacy. Three conditions for discipleship are given here: subordination of everything, even family, to commitment to Jesus; acceptance of the cross, in imitation of Jesus; and relinquishment of all possessions in order to possess and be possessed by Christ alone.





A reading from the letter of St Paul to Philemon

Receive him, not as a slave anymore, but as a very dear brother.

This is Paul writing, an old man now and, what is more, still a prisoner of Christ Jesus. I am appealing to you for a child of mine, whose father I became while wearing these chains: I mean Onesimus. I am sending him back to you, and with him - I could say - a part of my own self. I should have liked to keep him with me; he could have been a substitute for you, to help me while I am in the chains that the Good News has brought me. However, I did not want to do anything without your consent; it would have been forcing your act of kindness, which should be spontaneous. I know you have been deprived of Onesimus for a time, but it was only so that you (R.) In every age, O Lord, you have could have him back for ever, not as a slave any more, but something much better than a slave, a dear brother; especially dear to me, but how much more to you, as a blood-brother as well as a brother in the Lord. So if all that we have in common means anything to you, welcome him as you would me.

children, brothers, sisters, yes and his own life too, he cannot be my disciple. Anyone who does not carry his cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.

'And indeed, which of you here, intending to build a tower, would not first sit down and work out the cost to see if he had enough to complete it? Otherwise, if he laid the foundation and then found himself unable to finish the work, the onlookers would all start making fun of him and saying, "Here is a man who started to build and was unable to finish." Or again, what king marching to war against another king would not first sit down and consider whether with ten thousand men he could stand up to the other who advanced against him with twenty thousand? If not, then while the other king was still a long way off, he would send envoys to sue for peace. So in the same way, none of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions.'
