SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

The first reading for today is a narrative about healing, gratitude, conversion and worship. Israel had many regulations governing leprosy (cf. Leviticus 13-14). Washing was part of the rite of reincorporation into the community, but it was not itself a remedy for the illness, as is the case here. Miraculously the waters of the Jordan transformed Naaman's flesh into that of a child. When Naaman realised that he had been cured, his indebtedness prompted him to return to Elisha and offer a gift in thanksgiving. Having experienced the power of Elisha's God, he proclaims that there is no other God. This story champions monotheism and universalism. It demonstrates God's love and concern for all.

The psalm praises God as king over all. God is first depicted as a triumphant warrior, whose right hand and outstretched arm have brought victory. The divine warrior is the one who conquers the primordial forces of chaos. This psalm focuses on Israel's salvation by God. This victory is really vindication meted out in order to rectify a previous injustice. It follows God's recall of the covenant promises made to the house of Israel. The psalm also features the relationship between God's saving action and the promises that God made. It is because of the promise made to the ancestors that the divine warrior stepped in and triumphed over Israel's enemies.

Paul exhorts Timothy to remember the heart of the gospel that Paul has preached: Jesus Christ is raised from the dead; he is a descendant of David. The first statement of the testimony is the very basis of Christian faith. The fact that he came from the line of David shows that he fulfilled all of the expectations and promises that were associated with that royal family. This is the gospel to which Paul committed himself and for which he was now suffering imprisonment. The agony and indignity that Paul bears are seen by him as a share in the 'birth-pangs of the messiah', that necessary suffering that would precede the birth of the reign of God.

In the gospel, Jesus recalls the story of a foreigner who suffered the pain and indignities of leprosy. Those suffering from leprosy in this story recognise Jesus, stand at a distance, and cry out to him by name. Only one man returns to thank him, and he is a Samaritan. He is not surprised

that Jesus healed him. Nor is he the only one who had faith. They all believed that Jesus had the power to heal them and they all went off to show themselves to the priests. What makes this man unique is his gratitude. Jesus commends the man for his faith. Once again the last (a Samaritan) will be first (held up as an example).

Just 13 Sleeps to go!

MANY THINGS ARE FALLING INTO PLACE FOR THE INSTALLATION MASS.

Thanks to the work of Fr Greg and the organising Committee.

1. The Statue of St Pope John Paul II will arrive at St Patrick's this coming week and will be installed at the top of the front steps of York Street. The Statue is a life size stone sculpture and will be installed onto a 80cm high stone plinth. **A huge thank you to Grace and Philip Russo who have covered the cost of the Statue** and to Fr Paul who found a sculptor in Vietnam and placed the order for us.
2. The reliquary to hold the Relic of St Pope John Paul II has arrived and will be installed, including a Marble surround at the Sacred Heart side of the church.
3. The re-surfacing of the concrete paths is almost complete. I am sure you will all agree the work done so far looks amazing. Weather permitting the work will be completed on Tuesday.
4. New signs proclaiming St Patrick's Church as a Shrine, have been ordered for the front of St Patrick's on York Street and side on Victoria Street. These signs will be installed on Friday 21st October just prior to the installation on Saturday 22nd.
5. A new church sound system has been installed and is in final testing over this weekend.
6. All the AV equipment has been moved upstairs into the choir loft to facilitate tighter integration between the sound system, slide shows and the live-streaming
7. Work has commenced on preparing the new Pastoral Centre at 58 Victoria Street, in readiness for the installation date. The Pastoral Centre will include.

- i. Display room to include JPPII memorabilia.
- ii. Conference room to hold 30 to 40 people.
- iii. Meeting rooms
- iv. Hospitality rooms including an existing kitchen and large dining room.
- v. Store room
- vi. Toilets
- vii. Large Sign on the Building at 58 Victoria Street advertising the Pastoral Centre




