

LETTER FROM BISHOP ANTHONY

REGARDING THE SYNOD

Dear Fathers and Deacons,

As I depart Rome for Australia, I would like to take this opportunity to share with you my gratitude for your support and prayers for me and Kelly Paget and all the members of the Synod. While it has been a marvellous encounter, it has also been quite exhausting. The programme was relentlessly full-on. Kelly and I arrived in Rome at 1.30PM and we were both on the steps of Saint Peter's Basilica by 3PM. It did not slow down at all for the next month.

And yet, I must say that it has been a most graced time. I cannot imagine all the details that must have demanded the attention of Cardinal Grech and the Synod Team, and yet each time I had the opportunity to meet with him or speak with members of the Team, they were gracious, hospitable, and fraternal. As you well know, it is not possible to keep everyone happy all the time, and yet such a demonstration of charity and care was, I felt, exemplary of what is needed in a Synodal Church. Patience, charity, and kindness go a long way in making the Gospel real in our lives.

I was also quite humbled by the opportunities that were given to me to contribute, by presiding at Mass and preaching, leading the prayer in the Synod Hall, participating in the Commission for Information, and leading the Oceania Bishops in fraternal dialogue with Cardinal Grech and Cardinal Hollerich.

The Oceania Team was front and centre every day for the month. Apart from eight bishop members, there were 10 non-bishop members, four facilitators, and one theological peritus. For a continent of almost seven million Catholics (that is, the smallest Catholic continent) we were very well represented and extremely well engaged. The number of times people commented to me positively about the Oceania Team, and in particular Kelly Paget, was quite overwhelming. I am particularly proud of Kelly's participation and leadership. She has been acknowledged and respected by others at the Synod as a woman who is zealous for mission, deep in faith, and highly intelligent. I hope that our not-so-small contribution was positive and



that we have in some way contributed to building the culture of a Synodal Church.

These next eleven months, I pray, will be a graced time of reflection, prayer, discernment, participation, and action in the Church. I will be looking to walk more closely with you, my brother priests and deacons, along with the people of Broken Bay who have been entrusted to our pastoral care, in a renewed spirit of communion, participation, and mission.

Might I also encourage you to revisit the Instrumentum Laboris as well as the Synthesis Report, which has just been released following the First Synod Assembly. Both documents are on the Diocesan website as well as FAQs on the Synod official website.


I am sure that many of the questions will be familiar to you already, however, we need to avoid that tired old attitude that says, "we are already doing that". If the Synod has taught us anything, it will be to remain open to the voice of the Holy Spirit, who is the protagonist of a Synodal Church.

With these few thoughts, I would invite you to ponder the movement of the Holy Spirit in your own life and ministry. When we open ourselves to the regenerating love and mercy of God, the Holy Spirit does great things in and through us. My hope is that each of us, bishop, priest, or deacon, will see this movement of the Spirit as a time of personal conversion, renewal, and regeneration as well as a time of communion, participation and mission for Christ's Lay Faithful in our community of the Church.

I look forward to seeing you all very soon,


