NEW TESTAMENT COMMENTARY

'What you did to the least of these you did to me'

The Gospel today recalls the vivid image of Michelangelo's famous depiction of the final judgment. A powerful Christ figure gathers the blessed with one arm and with his other condemns the wicked to the ravages of the demons. Both Michelangelo and Dante have provided the Christian imagination with a portrait of the afterlife. It is important to make the distinction between art and theology. For most of the Old Testament the people of Israel had no conception of any life after death. At times they spoke of Sheol as the realm of the dead, but this was not really life. This was a vague underworld; it was not considered a place of life, of punishment or blessing. Such punishment or blessing was thought to occur in this life, thus illness, or an early death was considered a sign of sin, while a good life was thought to be rewarded with long-life and wealth. Around two hundred years before the birth of Jesus, some began to think that if God were really just then surely God would reward the just who in this life had suffered for their faith and even been martyred. This was the view the Pharisees adopted. In this theology, at the end of time God would raise all the dead, then there would be a final judgment and the good would go to their reward and the others would be banished from God's presence. Much later, around fifty years before Jesus, a second theology developed which considered that right now, while a person lives, they are already being judged on the choices they make, choices to live according to God's ways or not. The person choosing the way of God was given in this life, the gift of God's own life in eternity - this was called Wisdom, in the Book of Wisdom. In this theology, the person who receives the gift of God's life never really dies. While their body may experience death, this only appears to be death, in fact they live on `in the hand of God'. Judgment has already happened. There could be a final resurrection of the body at the end of time but even this was not quite determined.

In the Gospels we get both of these theological perspectives. Matthew's Gospel takes up the position of the Pharisees and the Gospel today depicts their view about a final resurrection and judgment. John's Gospel presents the other theological view that here, now, we can participate in God's eternity life and this life will not come to an end, even though bodily life may cease. Both views have continued in Christianity, with Matthew's being popularised in art and poetry, and so this is a common understanding most have of life after death.





We pray for the Holy Father; as he fulfills his mission, may he continue to accompany the flock entrusted to him, with the help of the Holy Spirit.



While I have spent time looking at views of life after death in the first century, in fact the Gospel today is far more interested in life before death. How we live now matters. In today's Gospel we see Matthew's understanding of what lies at the heart of our Judeo-Christian tradition. The King in the story identifies himself with the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked, the sick and imprisoned. Responding to God necessarily involves our response to the needy in this world. Christianity is not simply a set of pious practices, dogmas or rituals; the spiritual person is necessarily ethical. It means making real choices here and now with an eye to the most vulnerable around us.

As I write this reflecting on the past year I fear our society may be found wanting in this judgment. Strangers to our shores have not been made welcome; the hungry and thirsty have not found nourishment; the sick and naked have been turned away; prisons have been renamed as detention centres. The Gospel of Jesus rebukes our lack of compassion, 'in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me.'

In Matthew's infancy story last Christmas, the name of Mary's child is Emmanuel, 'a name which means God-with us'. This final episode in Jesus' ministry continues this proclamation. God is with us in the poor and the destitute of our world, 'what you did to the least of these you did to me'. As we leave this year of Matthew and move into a new liturgical cycle and prepare again for the coming of the child, may we keep this Gospel image in mind so that we will truly recognise God-withus in a naked child lying in an animal's feed bin. God comes to us among the least of this world but will God find a welcome?










PWBB APPEAL STARTING THIS WEEK



All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate men one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left. Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me." Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do

neglected to do it to me." And they will go away to eternal punishment, and the virtuous to eternal life.'
