My dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

It is with great sadness we mourn the passing of Pope Francis. The Holy Father passed away at Casa Santa Marta at 7:35am local Rome time.

A prophetic leader, Pope Francis served as the Bishop of Rome and shepherd of the world's 1.4 billion Catholics since 2013 following the resignation of Pope Benedict XVI.

Born in Buenos Aires, Argentina, Jorge Mario Bergoglio became Archbishop of Buenos Aires in 1997 before Pope John Paul II made him cardinal in 2001. During his years in Argentina, and later in Rome, his lifestyle was simple and humble, living in a small apartment, using public transport and working with the homeless and poor. Even when elected Pope on 13 March 2013, he chose not to live in the official papal residence in the Apostolic Palace but instead in the Vatican guest house. Pope Francis was the first Jesuit pope, the first from the Americas and the first from the Southern Hemisphere. His parents and grandparents were from northern Italy.

He convoked synods on the family (2014) and youth (2018), however the Synod on Synodality in 2023/2024 is seen by many as the culmination of his papacy, and one of the most important events in the Church since the Second Vatican Council.

As we grieve the passing of Pope Francis, let us remember in our prayers his commitment and unwavering dedication to justice, peace, and hope. A courageous leader, his papacy will be remembered for its call to reform, to embrace mercy, and to build bridges of understanding. May we find strength in his papal teaching as we continue the journey of faith in this Holy Year that Pope Francis dedicated to hope, asking us all to be Pilgrims of Hope.



Pray for our dear Holy Father who has fallen asleep in the Lord. Pray that Jesus, the Good Shepherd may receive him into the green pastures in Paradise.

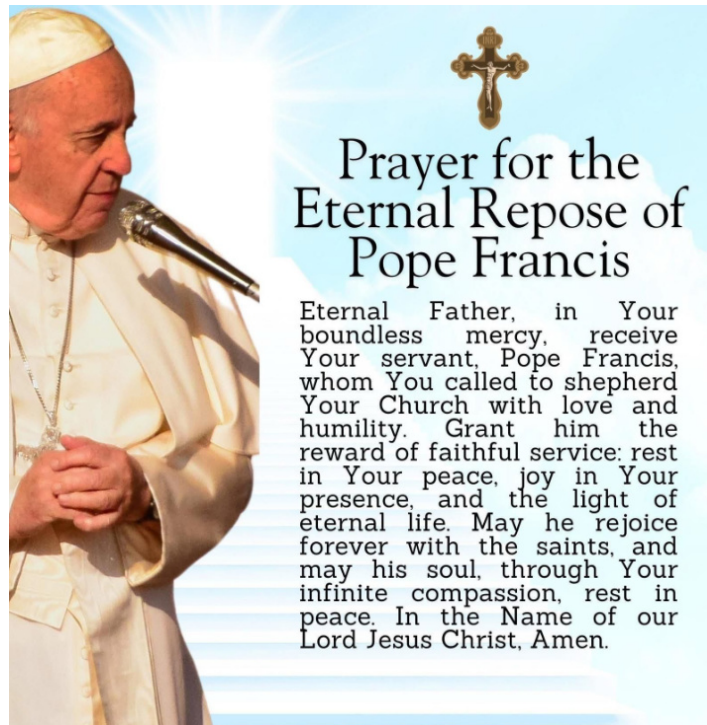

In the hearts of the faithful, your love is laid.

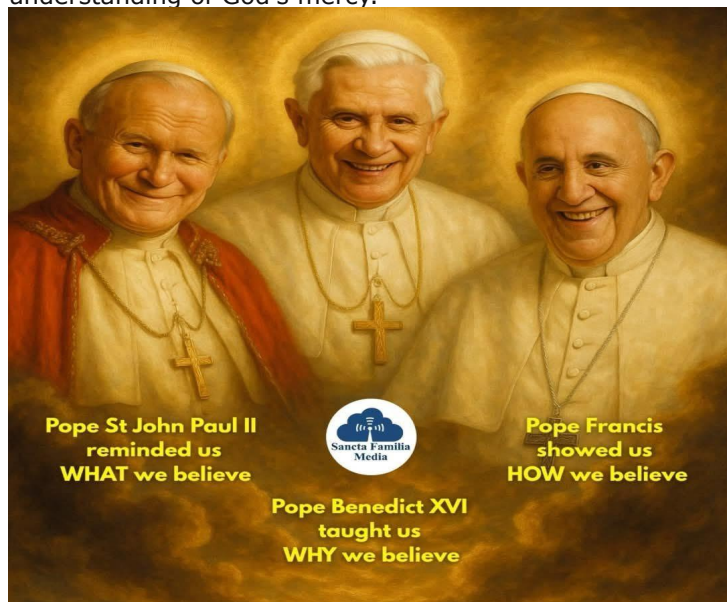


Prayer for the Eternal Repose of Pope Francis

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY THIS SUNDAY 27TH APRIL - 3PM ST PATRICKS CHURCH

Divine Mercy Sunday, observed on the Second Sunday of Easter, is a cherished celebration deeply rooted in the hearts of many believers. Originating from the private revelations of St. Faustina Kowalska, this day emphasises devotion to the Divine Mercy and underscores the significance of mercy in our lives as inspired by biblical teachings. This feast holds profound meaning, especially following the spiritual journey of Lent and the celebration of Jesus' resurrection during Easter. Divine Mercy Sunday invites us to reflect on God's boundless mercy and grace that continually uplifts and sustains us. It also reminds us of the importance of extending mercy and compassion to others, mirroring the love that God lavishes upon us. Declared by Pope John Paul II on April 30, 2000, following the canonisation of St. Faustina, Divine Mercy Sunday remains a relatively recent addition to the liturgical calendar. St. Faustina, the patron saint of mercy, dedicated her life to spreading the message of God's mercy. Born in Poland in 1905, she joined the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy and received visions of Jesus as the "King of Divine Mercy." In one of these visions in 1931, Jesus instructed St. Faustina to have an image painted portraying Him as she saw Him, with the words "Jesus, I trust in you" inscribed below. He further directed her to have the painting blessed on the first Sunday after Easter and to establish the Feast of Mercy on that day. Lastly, Jesus asked that this feast be preceded by a novena, consisting of nine days of prayer, starting on Good Friday. This novena serves as a spiritual preparation for the celebration and deepens participants' understanding of God's mercy.

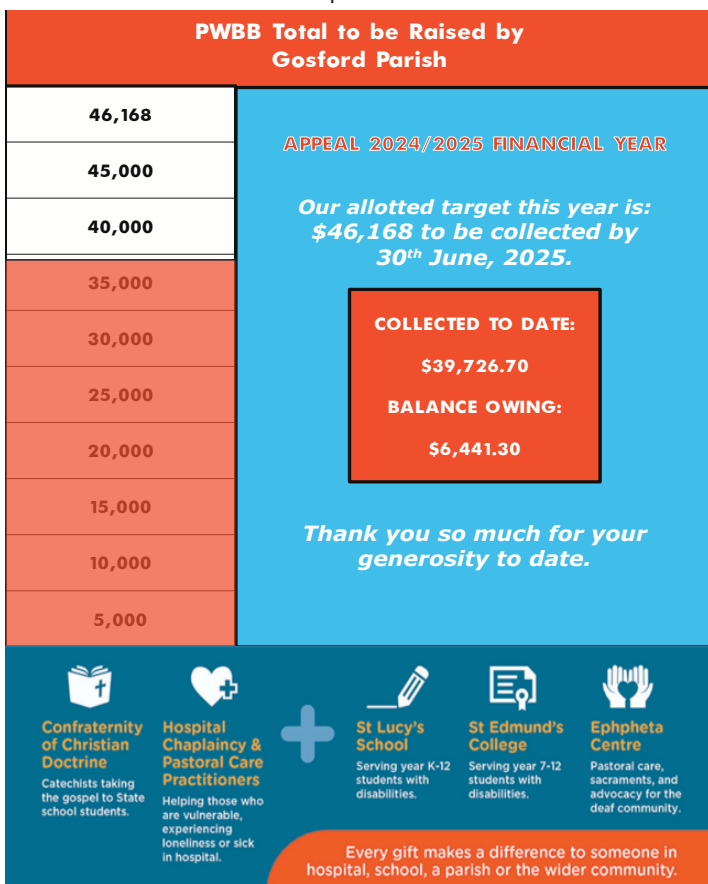
Dear Friends,

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

The faithful all used to meet by common consent in the Portico of Solomon. No one else ever dared to join them, but the people were loud in their praise and the numbers of men and women who came to believe in the Lord increased steadily. So many signs and wonders were worked among the people at the hands of the apostles that the sick were even taken out into the streets and laid on beds and sleeping-mats in the hope that at least the shadow of Peter might fall across some of them as he went past. A reading from the book of the Apocalypse

My name is John, and through our union in Jesus I am your brother and share your sufferings, your kingdom, and all you endure. I was on the island of Patmos for having preached God's word and witnessed for Jesus; it was the Lord's day and the Spirit possessed me, and I heard a voice behind me, shouting like a trumpet, 'Write down all that you see in a book.' I turned round to see who had spoken to me, and when I turned I saw seven golden lamp-stands and, surrounded by them, a figure like a Son of man, dressed in a long robe tied at the waist with a golden girdle.

When I saw him, I fell in a dead faint at his feet, but he touched me with his right hand and said, 'Do not be afraid; it is I, the First and the Last; I am the Living One. I was dead and now I am to live for ever and ever, and I hold the keys of death and of the underworld. Now write down all that you see of present happenings and things that are still to come.'

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you. 'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.
