Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost has been elected the 267th Successor of Saint Peter, Bishop of Rome, Vicar of Jesus Christ & Supreme Pontiff of the Universal Church.

He will be known as **Pope Leo XIV**.

Born in Chicago, United States, Prevost, 69, studied science and mathematics before joining the Order of St Augustine in 1977.

He spent many years in Peru as a missionary and teacher as well as two six-year terms as Prior General of the Augustinians, and also holds Peruvian citizenship.

In 2023 Pope Francis appointed him prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops.

Pope Leo XIV is the first Pope from the Order of Saint Augustine, but the seventh from orders that follow the Rule of Saint Augustine.

He enjoyed a close association with the Order, even before joining them.

He completed his secondary studies at a minor seminary run by the Order of Saint Augustine however upon graduation in 1973, he chose to pursue a science degree. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in mathematics at the Augustinian founded Villanova University in 1977. Later that year, he decided to join the Order of Saint Augustine.

He took his first vows as an Augustinian in September 1978 and solemn vows in August 1981. He was ordained a priest for the Order of Saint Augustine by Archbishop Jean Jadot in Rome on 19 June 1982.

The Order of Saint Augustine was founded in 1244, bringing together several groups in the Tuscany region who were following the Rule of Saint Augustine.

The Rule of Saint Augustine is a document written by Saint Augustine of Hippo outlining rules for

religious life lived in community and is the oldest monastic rule in the Western Church.

Presently, the Order is one of the largest in the world, ministering in over 50 countries.

The friars (as members are called) live in monastic communities and serve the spiritual needs of the people who live around them. While the heart of their vocation is living in monastic community, they also run parishes, schools and universities.

The Augustinians are also noted missionaries and have played a key role in the history of Catholicism in Australia.

The first Augustinian came to the continent in 1838. His name was Father James Alypius Goold OSA and he would go on to be the first Bishop of Melbourne. Since then, the Augustinians have ministered around Australia, and helped to build up many areas of the Church particularly in Northern Queensland.

Many people in Broken Bay will be familiar with the work of the Augustinians. Since 1952, the Order has had pastoral responsibility for St Kieran's, Manly Vale. They also run Saint Augustine's College, Brookvale.

Pope Leo XIV has held several senior leadership positions within the Order. He served as Provincial of the Augustinian Province of Chicago from 1999 until 2001, when he was elected Prior General of the Augustinians.

As Prior General, he was the head of the Order and its supreme authority.

Just as many people were eager to see how Pope Francis brought a strong Jesuit influence to the papacy, many will be interested in seeing what influence the Augustinian way of life has on Pope Leo XIV.

Dear Mothers,

Motherhood is a sacred vocation, and on this Mother's Day, Catholic mothers are called not only to reflect on their role as caregivers and nurturers but also as the first teachers of faith. In a world that often challenges or contradicts Christian values, the responsibility of forming children in faith has never been more essential—or more difficult. Being a Catholic mother today means living with intentionality. Society bombards our families with messages that promote materialism, self-interest, and relativism. Against this current, a Catholic mother is called to witness the love of Christ in her home. She is not perfect, but she is prayerful. She turns to the sacraments for strength, especially the Eucharist and Reconciliation, and she leads her children by example. Her life becomes a living Gospel, showing her children what it means to love sacrificially, forgive humbly, and trust God wholly.

Teaching children about faith is not merely about sending them to Catholic schools - it begins at home. Faith is first learned in the arms of a mother, in the gentle whisper of prayers before bedtime, and in the quiet conversations about God during life's everyday moments. Reading Scripture together, celebrating feast days, and praying the Rosary as a family are ways to weave God's presence into daily life. Even small rituals—like thanking God before meals or lighting a candle in prayer—help build a spiritual foundation. But beyond religious practices, instilling the values of God means teaching love, patience, kindness, humility, and truth. It means guiding children to recognize God's image in every person, to seek justice, and to live with integrity. It involves difficult conversations about right and wrong, and offering compassion when they fail.

A Catholic mother teaches her children that faith is not just a belief—it is a way of life rooted in relationship with Jesus Christ.

In a society that often glorifies independence and personal success, Catholic mothers remind their children that true greatness lies in serving others and loving God. They raise saints, not merely successful people. And though the world may not always affirm their choices, they remain steadfast, knowing their efforts echo into eternity.

This Mother's Day, may all Catholic mothers be encouraged and affirmed in their beautiful mission. May they find strength in Mary, the perfect model of motherhood, and trust that every act of love and faith they offer their children is a seed planted for God's Kingdom.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Paul and Barnabas carried on from Perga till they reached Antioch in Pisidia. Here they went to synagogue on the sabbath and took their seats.

When the meeting broke up, many Jews and devout converts joined Paul and Barnabas, and in their talks with them Paul and Barnabas urged them to remain faithful to the grace God had given them.

The next sabbath almost the whole town assembled to hear the word of God. When they saw the crowds, the Jews, prompted by jealousy, used blasphemies and contradicted everything Paul said. Then Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly, 'We had to proclaim the word of God to you first, but since you have rejected it, since you do not think yourselves worthy of eternal life, we must turn to the pagans. For this is what the Lord commanded us to do when he said: I have made you a light for the nations, so that my salvation may reach the ends of the earth.'

It made the pagans very happy to hear this and they thanked the Lord for his message; all who were destined for eternal life became believers. Thus the word of the Lord spread through the whole countryside.

But the Jews worked upon some of the devout women of the upper classes and the leading men of the city and persuaded them to turn against Paul and Barnabas and expel them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in defiance and went off to Iconium; but the disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.
