NEW TESTAMENT COMMENTARY BY MARY COLOEI AM SENDING YOU WHAT THE FATHER HAS PROMISED.

Acts 1:1-11; Hebrews 9:24-28; 10:19-23; Luke 24:46-53

God's power

Luke is the only Gospel writer to give a forty-day time frame for the events of Easter:

Stage 1. The risen Jesus is present with his disciples for forty days, confirming their faith and preparing them for their future mission. This time is followed by Jesus' return to his Father.

Stage 2. Ten days later, the Spirit comes upon the disciples.

You might also notice that Luke in fact gives us two different times for Jesus' Ascension. In Luke 24, Jesus gathers his disciples on the same day as the Resurrection. All the events in Luke 24 are situated on the first day of the week. Then, in the Acts of the Apostles, also written by Luke, he provides a longer time-frame that separates Easter, the Ascension, Pentecost.

This fifty day time frame, found in the Acts, may well be governed by the Jewish liturgical calendar where the Feast of Pentecost or 'First Fruits' occurs fifty days after Passover (Easter). Within the Jewish Liturgy, Pentecost/First Fruits celebrates the arrival of the Israelites at Mt Sinai, following their escape from Egypt and crossing the Sea, which was celebrated at Passover.

The Ascension celebrates Jesus returning to God and his glorification at God's right hand. It is a further dimension of the Easter experience that Jesus has triumphed over evil and death, and his humanity is now within the Godhead. The Ascension also celebrates an experience of the early Christian communities. There was a time when they knew Jesus of Nazareth. He lived among them and they were attracted by his vision of God's reign. Then, following his death, there were brief moments of his presence. But there came a time when even these Risen appearances finished. The time of the Jesus bound by human history had come to an end.

And yet, when they gathered to share their memories and to

celebrate the Lord's Supper, they knew that he was still a presence in their midst. In fact, in the absence of Jesus of Nazareth, they had a new certainty of faith and an enthusiasm for spreading the Gospel message. This empowering and enlivening presence they called the Spirit, drawing on the words of their Jewish Scriptures that described the power of God's Spirit in people's lives. The Greek word for the power of the Spirit is dunamis, from where we get words such as 'dynamic' and 'dynamite'.

With the new experience of the Spirit as a power and

presence in their lives, Jesus' return to his Father is not a cause of grief but one of joy, for now people of all times can share the experience of those first disciples. The Risen Jesus lives on with us. Alleluia.

The reading from Hebrews moves from the Greek image of the exaltation in heaven, to the Jewish image of Jesus now present with God in the Temple's inner sanctuary, the Holy of Holies. The anonymous author likens Jesus' ascension into Heaven, to the Jewish High Priest entering once every year into the Holy

of Holies to sprinkle the blood from the lamb sacrificed for atonement from sin. This letter's theology is that through Christ's death, sin has been vanquished so that now there is no need for further sacrifices. Because of him, we now have the right/privilege of coming into God's presence. The curtain across the entrance to the Holy of Holies has now been permanently opened, giving all believers access to God. These images of sacrifice, sprinkling blood, and the Temple curtain would have been familiar to the audience of this letter. Speaking to Christians today such images need to be treated carefully. The line of this letter that perhaps could be developed is, through Jesus, we have the right to enter the sanctuary – or to enter God's presence.

The readings, using different images, all profess a theology of God's ongoing presence with us now – that Jesus' ascension does not mark an end of a relationship, but rather, models our own open access to God.

PILGRIMS OF HOPE - FOLLOWING IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF SAINT JOHN PAUL II

PILGRIMS OF HOPE - Day 7 -

On the seventh day of the pilgrimage, pilgrims headed to Zakopane (Krzeptówki) to the Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima, which was built as a votive for life saving of St John Paul II from an assassination attempt in 1981.

PILGRIMS OF HOPE - DAY 8 - Day 8 began in the small town of Wadowice, Saint John Paul II's birthplace. This peaceful town, nestled in southern Poland, is where Karol Wojtyła — the future Pope — spent his childhood and youth. Walking through the museum located in his family home, the pilgrims were able to trace his early years, learning about his family, his school life, his love for the theatre and sports, and the deep faith that shaped his future path.

They also visited the church where he was baptized, the Basilica of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Standing at the baptismal font where the future pope first received the sacrament that began his journey of faith was a powerful and humbling experience. After a very long day of spiritual experience, wonderful lessons of history, faith and hospitality. they left beautiful Poland and arrived safely to their next destination in Italy.

PILGRIM OF HOPE - DAY 9 - Was a deeply moving and unforgettable day for the entire group. They began the morning by going together to St. Peter's Square for the Regina Caeli prayer with Pope Leo XIV. The atmosphere was filled with emotion, reverence, and joy as thousands of faithful gathered in unity. Hearing the Holy Father speak and bless the crowd was a powerful spiritual moment that touched them all a truly a once-in-a-lifime experience

to be part of such a beautiful tradition in the heart of the Church.

Some of the pilgrims were especially blessed with the incredible opportunity to see Pope Leo XIV up close. Their joy was indescribable, and it added a special grace to the pilgrimage.

PILGRIMS OF HOPE - DAY 10 - The day marked a deeply moving and spiritually enriching day as they undertook the Walk of Hope during this Jubilee Year. The pilgrimage began at the heart of the Catholic faith — the magnificent Basilica of St. Peter. With reverence and anticipation, they passed through the Holy Door, a powerful symbol of mercy and grace, and entered the largest Catholic Church in the world. There, in silent prayer, they gathered at the tomb of St. Peter, the first pope and cornerstone of the Church. It was a moment of connection with their spiritual roots and a powerful reminder of the enduring mission of the Church. While inside the basilica, they also paused to pray at the tomb of St. John Paul II, whose life and teachings have inspired generations of faithful. The atmosphere was solemn and awe-inspiring, deepening their sense of communion with the saints and the universal Church. Following the visit, they crossed St. Peter's Square to the Salvatorian Mother House, situated just in front of the basilica. There, they were warmly welcomed and introduced to the history of the Salvatorian community. They learned about their founder, Blessed Francis Jordan, and their mission of making the Savior known to all people. A particularly emotional moment was spent in prayer at the tomb of Blessed Francis Jordan — a man of deep faith and vision. This quiet time allowed them to reflect on their own vocations and the call to holiness in everyday life.

THE MONTH OF JUNE DEDICATED TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS



The Sick

But a Samaritan while traveling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him.

Luke 10: 33-34

Signs of hope should be shown to the sick at home and in hospital. Their sufferings can be allayed by the closeness and affection of those who visit them. Works of mercy are also works of hope that give rise to immense gratitude. Gratitude should likewise be shown to all those healthcare workers who, often in precarious conditions, carry out their mission with constant care and concern for the sick and for those who are most vulnerable.

Inclusive attention should also be given to all those in particularly difficult situations. Care given to them is a hymn to human dignity, a song of hope that calls for the choral participation of society as a whole.

We are called to show to those who are ill, our love and communion, despite the pace of our own frenetic lives.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them. he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.' As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'




