Year of JOY



REFLECTION by Nick Brodie

Musing on some of the key teachings of St Paul and St Augustine, Pope Leo reminds us that unity in diversity is one of the mystical treasures of the Church.

Unity and diversity need not be opposed. The Mystical Body of Christ, after all, requires eyes and hands, ears and feet. Without diversity we could, to use a common adage, be all thumbs.

Speaking to a group of bishops recently, the pope picked up this theme and exhorted them to 'go forward in unity, thinking especially of the synodal path.' To grasp what 'synodality' means we can start by recalling that we are a single Body, journeying together. It is, in short, a type of deliberative togetherness.

The pope encourages us to therefore embrace synodality as 'a mindset, in the heart, in decision-making processes and in ways of acting.' And, building on this, the pope wants us to 'look to tomorrow with serenity, and do not be afraid to make courageous choices.'

'No-one can prevent you from being close to the people, sharing life, walking with the last, serving the poor', he told that same group of bishops. In doing so, he reminds each one of us that 'God is greater than our mediocrity: let us allow ourselves to be drawn to Him! Let us trust in his providence.'

REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

Although the gospel is a report of ministerial commissioning, it contains elements of discipleship in general. Most obvious is the disciples' dependence on Jesus. They are not independent missionaries; they are followers. Furthermore, there is a communal dimension of discipleship. While there is certainly a personal relationship between Jesus and each disciple, discipleship itself is not a singular privilege that one hugs to oneself to the exclusion of others.

Disciples minister to the needs of others, whatever those needs may be and with whatever abilities the disciple may possess. There are various kinds of healing: a friendly smile, a word of gratitude, a soothing touch. We can teach the lessons of life in classrooms, in playrooms, in kitchens, in boardrooms. There are many ways that we can cast out the demons that hold our world by the throat; demons of poverty and oppression, demons of addiction and slavery, demons of disdain and neglect, demons of hatred and violence. If they are not cast out by us, then by whom?

The life of discipleship is not an unmixed blessing. Because disciples are marked by the sign of the cross, they must expect suffering. Because they do not live according to the standards of the world, disciples will be judged as fools. Some of them will be subjected to even greater suffering. Still, the disciple proclaims that true fulfilment is only found in God! In reality, it is the world that is upside down, not the life of discipleship. And it is the cross that sets things right.

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY by Dianne Bergant CSA

The first reading for today is an oracle of salvation calling for rejoicing over the future restoration of Jerusalem. The metaphor of motherhood characterises the relationship between the city and its inhabitants, as well as the loving care that this relationship will provide. What better way to describe the self-giving nature of God than as a nursing mother who protects and soothes and plays with her child? This touching maternal scene is interrupted for a moment as God promises anew to lavish abundant blessing on Jerusalem. Flowing water was considered living water and came to be a symbol for life itself.

Today's responsorial psalm begins with a threefold summons to praise God followed by reason for giving such praise, and it ends with individual expressions of thanksgiving. Each part of the summons adds a slightly different dimension to the praise that is sought. It is universal in scope; it is directed to God's name; it is not to be dismissed casually. The works of the God to which the psalmist refers are the wonders that God has accomplished in the history of Israel. The communal dimension of the first section of the responsorial psalm gives way to an individual focus. Others are invited to join the psalmist in grateful praise of God.

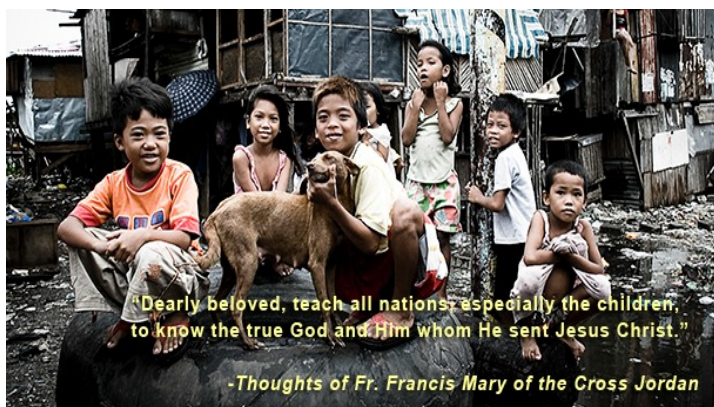

The Young

Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it.
Luke 18: 16-17

Signs of hope are also needed by those who are the very embodiment of hope, namely, the young. Sadly, they often see their dreams and aspirations frustrated. It is gratifying to see the energy they demonstrate, for example, by rolling up their sleeves and volunteering to help when disasters strike and people are in need. Yet it is sad to see young people who are without hope, who face an uncertain and unpromising future, who lack employment or job security, or realistic prospects after finishing school.

Without the hope that their dreams can come true, they will inevitably grow discouraged and listless. Escaping into drugs, risk-taking and the pursuit of momentary pleasure does greater harm to them in particular, since it closes them to life's beauty and richness, and can lead to depression and even self-destructive actions.

We are called to draw close to and listen to the young, for they are the joy and hope of the Church and of the world!

**A reading from the holy Gospel according to
Luke**

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and
sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the
towns and places he himself was to visit. He
said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the
labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the
harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start
off now, but remember, I am sending you out
like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no
haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the
road.

Whatever house you go into, let your first
words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man
of peace lives there, your peace will go and
rest on him; if not, it will come back to you.
Stay in the same house, taking what food and
drink they have to offer, for the labourer
deserves his wages; do not move from house to
house.

Whenever you go into a town where they make
you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure
those in it who are sick, and say, "The
kingdom of God is very near to you." But
whenever you enter a town and they do not
make you welcome, go out into its streets and
say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town


that clings to our feet, and leave it with you.
Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very
near." I tell you, that on that day it will not go
as hard with Sodom as with that town.'

The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,'
they said, 'even the devils submit to us when
we use your name.' He said to them, 'I
watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven.
Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot
serpents and scorpions and the whole strength
of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet
do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you;
rejoice rather that your names are written in
heaven.'

church or in a place that has
been specifically dedicated to
this purpose. The
conservation of ashes in the
home is not allowed.
