NEW TESTAMENT COMMENTARY

MARTHA WELCOMED HIM INTO HER HOUSE.

Luke 10:38-42 (and Genesis 18:1-18)

The story of Martha and Mary is fraught with danger for any interpreter. The traditional approach sees Mary as a model of discipleship. She sits and listens to the word. This has even been presented as valuing the contemplative life over the active life. But it is not as simple as this. Last Sunday we heard a Gospel that criticised the Priest and Levite in their concern for 'religious' duties that led to their not giving practical care to the traveller in need. The one who reached out in service is the one praised. In fact, the Samaritan's service is presented as religious in the symbols of pouring oil and wine, which are usual votive offerings.

When reading this Gospel passage, paired in the liturgy with the account in Genesis of Abraham's hospitality to the angelic visitors, it seems even more likely that Martha's hospitality and service cannot be the problem. Martha is the one who offers welcome into her house and then service to the traveller. Two Sundays ago, we heard that this is the way that a disciple is to be made welcome and where this welcome is given; a blessing comes to the house.

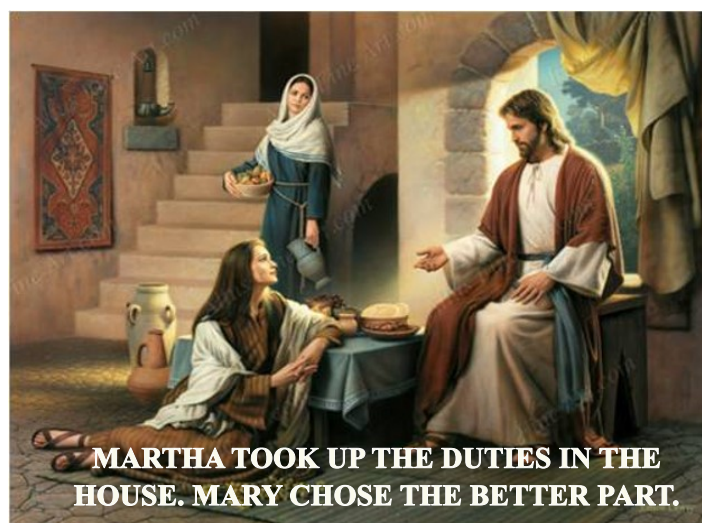
In many other places in Luke, the active ministry of women is subtly belittled in comparison with the way women's ministry is presented in the other three Gospels and the letters of Paul. In Luke, Mary's passive listening is praised over Martha's active table service. It is possible that as Luke's community developed, it became important for it to conform more closely to society, in order to be seen as a reputable religious group. This small passage could reflect the struggle in Luke's community to reclaim a more traditional and passive role for women within the Christian movement.

Usually I comment only on the New Testament passages but today I want to offer a reflection on the passage from Genesis, based on my experience in Israel/Palestine in 2012. I was in a group that went to Hebron, which is where the Genesis story occurs. It is both a painful and beautiful place. Here, in Hebron, are the memorials to our great ancestors in faith – Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, Jacob, Sarah, Rebecca, and Leah, who are all thought to be buried in the Cave of Machpelah which Abraham purchased for the burial site of Sarah. For this reason, this site is honoured by the Jewish people with a Synagogue and by the Muslims with a Mosque. Jews and Muslims live side by side with a barrier and bullet proof glass protecting these children of Abraham from each other.

When we arrived in Hebron, our bus was met by dozens of small children selling trinkets to the tourists. They were waiflike and eager for our shekels. Then, after visiting the Mosque, we walked through the ancient marketplace where tourists are rather rare. Overhead stretched a large net holding the garbage tossed down by the Israeli settlers whose homes backed onto the small market stalls of the Palestinians. These experiences of poverty and oppression left me very saddened, particularly by the plight of the children. Then, when we returned to the bus, I saw a moment of grace. One of our travellers was an Australian who had brought with him many Australian Rules footballs, and there he was, in his Collingwood jumper playing with these Palestinian children. The children were transformed. From beggars and merchants to playful eight year olds. This one incident stood out for me from my month stay in Israel – in this incident, I met Jesus in black and white, in the goodness and generosity of Steve. Steve was just being himself, and in this, he allowed the children to be children. It made me want to teach AFL to both Jews and Muslims as a way to peace.

What has this to do with Genesis? Everything. Abraham encountered God in the ordinariness of three travellers, and in this encounter, there was a promise of life. I encountered Jesus in the ordinariness of Steve and the children's play, and saw in this some promise that Hebron could mean more to me than tragedy and sadness.

In generosity and hospitality, God comes to Mary and Martha, Abraham and Steve, and blessed are those with eyes to see

BLESSED FRANCIS JORDAN

John Baptist Jordan was born on 16 June 1848 in Gurtweil, archdiocese of Freiburg (Germany) into a poor family. After ordination to the priesthood on 21 July 1878, he was sent to Rome, where he spent most part of his life. Motivated by apostolic zeal and a desire to make known and loved the only true God, revealed in Jesus Christ, Saviour of the world, Father Jordan founded the Apostolic Teaching Society in 1881 in Rome. In 1883 he changed his apostolic work in a religious institute and took the name of Francis Mary of the Cross. From the Apostolic Teaching Society were developed the Society of the Divine Saviour and the Congregation of the Sisters of the Divine Saviour. He died on 8 September 1918 in Tavers (Switzerland).

From the Chapter Talks of blessed Francis Mary of the Cross Trust in Divine Providence

Those who trust only in their own powers will accomplish nothing great for the glory of God. We must trust in divine providence, as an infant does its nurse, we must trust in the Lord in all things. The one who has trust will not fall, and the one who puts all his trust in the Lord will have the Lord on his side. How many times you have heard and read in the scriptures of what is promised to those who have hope. They have hoped in Me, they have hoped in the Lord, they will not be confounded. "In you, O Lord, have I hoped, I will not be put to shame." "Because he hoped in me, I will set him free: I will protect him because he has known my name." But surely we must not tempt God. Act in accordance with your hopes in the Lord. If you do not do what you should do, if you neglect to do what you should, you cannot have hope; if you offend God, how can you have hope in him? We must do what we ought to do and let us hope in the Lord! So, let us not trust in ourselves, not have trust or hope in princes, but hope in the Lord! He will help us. He himself will protect us! Have hope even in difficulties and in problems; if you are bereft of human resources, put all your hope in the Lord. You must toil and work and hope in the Lord. He will help us and free us. But do not trust, have no trust in your own strength, in your own abilities. So, let us be people of faith, of trust, if we want to accomplish great things. It is essential to have faith and very great hope. Trust in the Lord. Trust in Providence: "Who has ever trusted in God and been confounded?" Don't trust in yourself or in human aid. Don't trust in princes or influential people. Trust in God!

Merciful God, who inspired the Priest Blessed Francis Mary of the Cross to spread the knowledge of you through Jesus Christ your Son, whom you sent as the Saviour of the world, grant that, proclaiming the work of salvation to the nations, we too may be able to contemplate your glory forever in heaven. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen

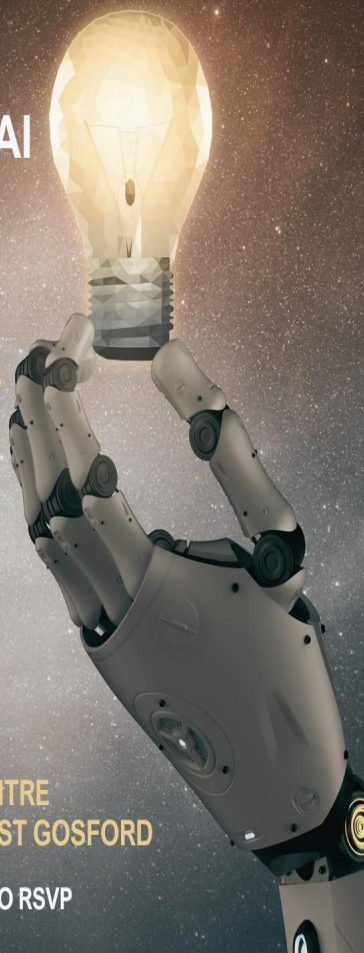


