PREPARING WELL FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE HOLY EUCHARIST.

The Holy Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. In it, we receive not just a symbol or a reminder, but the true Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. To approach the Eucharist with the reverence and depth it deserves requires intentional spiritual preparation and a heart fully open to God. Preparing well for participation in the Eucharist means recognizing the profound mystery we are entering into and responding with faith, humility, and love.

First, we prepare by examining our conscience. The Eucharist is not only a meal but also a sacrifice—Jesus offering Himself for our salvation. As such, we should not come to the table of the Lord carelessly or in a state of serious sin. Through an honest self-examination and, when necessary, the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we cleanse our hearts and restore our relationship with God and others. This step isn't about guilt, but about freeing ourselves to receive Christ fully, without anything blocking His grace.

Prayer is also essential in preparing for the Eucharist. Before Mass, taking time in silent prayer helps us shift our focus from worldly distractions to the sacred mystery we are about to witness. Reading and reflecting on the Scriptures of the day, especially the Gospel, opens our hearts to the Word that will be proclaimed and prepares us to receive Jesus, both in word and in sacrament. A heartfelt prayer such as "Lord, help me to receive You with a clean heart and a grateful spirit," can center our thoughts and deepen our receptivity.

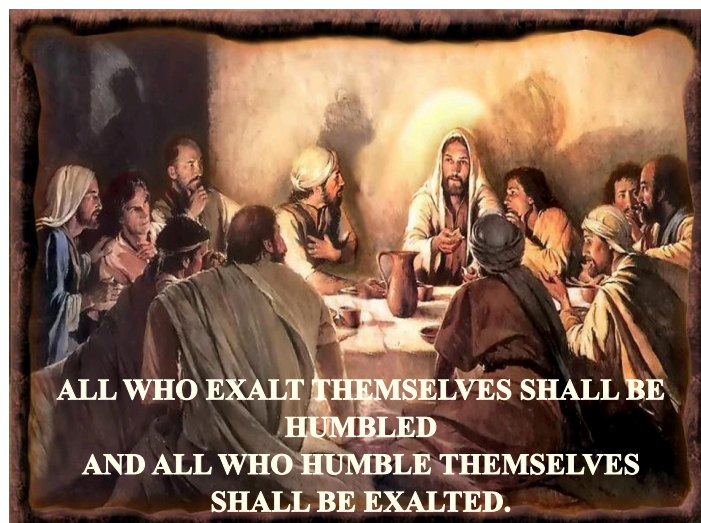
Another important aspect of preparation is cultivating a spirit of reverence and gratitude. The Eucharist is not a routine event or a religious obligation; it is a living encounter with the risen Christ. When we approach the altar, we are responding to His invitation to communion—not only physically, but spiritually and emotionally. We should approach with awe, acknowledging that we

are receiving God Himself. This can be expressed in the way we dress, our posture, and our attentiveness during the liturgy. Every gesture, from the Sign of the Cross to the way we say "Amen" when receiving Communion, should be filled with meaning.

To fully give ourselves to Eucharistic Jesus, we must surrender. This means bringing not only our joys and successes but also our wounds, fears, and failures. We lay everything before Him on the altar, trusting that He will transform us. After receiving the Eucharist, our hearts should remain in silent thanksgiving, allowing the presence of Christ to dwell within us. We are not just receiving; we are being made one with Him.

Finally, preparation doesn't end with the Mass. Our entire life becomes a reflection of the Eucharist we have received. By living in charity, serving others, and growing in holiness, we show that Christ truly lives in us.

To participate fully in the Holy Eucharist is to enter into the mystery of God's love. Let us prepare with devotion, approach with humility, and respond with our whole selves—fully giving ourselves to Jesus, who gives Himself entirely to us.

HEALING EVENING WITH FR ROZARIO PALIC (FR ROZO) 24 October 7pm

Fr Rozo's mission of healing has become well known in Europe and throughout the world. He was a Franciscan priest for 25 years before he was called to form his new order. He suffered 8 years of spiritual trial and desolation. Fr Rozo had a spiritual experience with the Holy Spirit in November 1985 followed by a 40 day fast when he lived solely on the Holy Eucharist. Fr Rozo Palic is a priest in the diocese of Clonmel, Ireland. He has the approval of his Bishop for this healing ministry in Australia. He is the founder and manager of the clerical Brotherhood of the Triune Love and the believers' Association "Perpetual Adorers of the Holy Trinity." His community is in Trieste, Italy where he formerly lived and worked. He has written 3 books heavily based on Scripture.

He graduated in Theology at the Pontifical Regional Seminary "San Pio X" in Chieti and completed a specialist training in catechism, pastoral care and liturgy at the Faculty of Theology in Zagreb. He promotes the devotion of the Most Pure Hands of Mary through spiritual renewals and seminars. He guides the believers to the "path of holiness and recovery".

Fr Rozo Palic is a renowned healing priest in Europe, America and Canada. There are 8 vocations from his family. The current Bishop of Medjugorje is his cousin. These vocations are a result of his uncle who was tortured and killed by the communist regime. Many miracles are attributed to his amazing healing ministry in Europe, America, Canada and Australia.

WHY WE OFFER MASS INTENTIONS?

We offer Mass intentions for our departed loved ones, living family members, and on special occasions like wedding anniversaries because the Holy Mass is the highest form of prayer and worship in the Catholic Church. It unites us with the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross and brings countless graces.

For the deceased, offering a Mass intention is an act of love and mercy. We believe in the communion of saints and the power of prayer to aid souls in purgatory. When we request a Mass for a departed loved one, we entrust them to God's mercy and ask that they be purified and welcomed into eternal life. It is a spiritual gift that expresses our hope in the resurrection and our continued connection with those who have gone before us.

For the living, Mass intentions are a way to seek God's blessings, protection, and guidance. Whether it's for a birthday, wedding anniversary, or a time of illness or hardship, offering a Mass helps us place our lives in God's hands. On a wedding anniversary, for example, a Mass can be a beautiful way to thank God for the gift of marriage and ask for continued grace to remain faithful and loving.

Offering Masses for our families is a sign of spiritual care and solidarity. It brings our intentions before God through the perfect prayer of the Church and deepens our unity as a family. Whether in joy or sorrow, the Mass reminds us that God walks with us in every season of life.

In short, Mass intentions are a powerful and sacred tradition that strengthen our faith, honor our loved ones, and invite God's presence into every aspect of our lives.

MINISTRATION OF THE HOLY EUCHARIST

Ministers who take the Eucharist to those unable to attend Mass are reminded to always handle the consecrated Host with the utmost reverence.

The Host must be carried in a sacred vessel, known as a pyx, which both signifies and safeguards the sacredness of what it contains.

The use of a pyx provides a secure and dignified way to carry the Body of Christ, protecting it from damage or the risk of being dropped. Out of deep respect, those entrusted with carrying a pyx should always be mindful that they are transporting the Real Presence of Christ.

For additional protection and discretion, the pyx is then placed in a small purse-like case. These purses are available for collection by Eucharistic Ministers from the Parish office.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'
