

## ACCEPTING DAILY CROSSES FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross invites us to gaze upon the cross—not as a symbol of defeat, but of triumph, love, and redemption. In exalting the cross, we are reminded of Christ's immense sacrifice and the transformative power of suffering embraced in love. Jesus did not flee from the cross; He carried it, fell under it, and died upon it for our sake. In doing so, He gave meaning to our own daily crosses. Accepting our daily crosses means embracing the trials, inconveniences, and sufferings of everyday life with faith and trust in God. These crosses may be small—like dealing with a difficult coworker, health struggles, loneliness, or anxiety—or they may be great, such as the loss of a loved one or deep personal failure. Yet each cross, united with Christ's, becomes an opportunity for grace and transformation. To accept our crosses is not to pretend they are easy, but to carry them with patience, surrender, and even love. It means saying "yes" to God in the midst of pain, just as Jesus did in the Garden of Gethsemane. We can look to the Blessed Virgin Mary, who stood at the foot of the cross, as a model of silent strength and unwavering faith. In our suffering, we are never alone. Christ walks with us, strengthening us, and giving purpose to our pain. Through our crosses, we participate in His redemptive work—not just for ourselves, but for others. Let us then not run from the cross, but embrace it with courage. For in the mystery of the cross, we discover not despair, but the promise of resurrection. Through our daily crosses, we are being made new—conformed to Christ and led ever closer to the heart of God.

Saint Carlo Acutis and Saint Pier Giorgio Frassati were canonized Saints by Pope Leo, at the Vatican on Sunday, 7<sup>th</sup> September. Following the Vatican's recognition of their heroic virtues and miracles, including medically inexplicable healings attributed to their intercession

# St. Carlo Acutis, the first canonized Millennial Saint!

St. Carlo Acutis, pray for us!

Saint Carlo Acutis, a tech-savvy youth who promoted Eucharistic devotion through a website, was canonized with a feast day on October 12 and named patron of young Catholics and internet users. Saint Carlo, who died of leukemia in 2006 at just 15 years old, will become the first millennial saint. Known as "God's Influencer," the Italian teenager used his computer skills to document Eucharistic miracles around the world and called the Eucharist his "highway to heaven." To always be united to Jesus — this is my life plan," Acutis once said.

The Vatican recently approved a second miracle attributed to him: the healing of 21-year-old Valeria Valverde from Costa Rica, who suffered a severe brain injury in 2022.

Saint Pier Giorgio Frassati, a joyful mountaineer and advocate for the poor, will likely be honored on July 4 as patron of young Catholics, mountaineers, and Catholic Action.

Saint Pier, who died of polio at 24 in 1925, is remembered for his adventurous spirit, mountaineering, and tireless charity for the poor and sick.

Saint Pier famously wrote "Verso L'Alto" (To the Heights) during his last climb, a phrase that has since inspired generations of Catholics to reach for holiness.

Pope John Paul II, who beatified Frassati in 1990, called him a "man of the Beatitudes."

### FIRST READING

**NUMBERS 21:4-9**

**A reading from the book of Numbers**

On the way through the wilderness, the Israelites lost patience. They spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why did you bring us out of Egypt to die in this wilderness? For there is neither bread nor water here; we are sick of this unsatisfying food.'

At this God sent fiery serpents among the people; their bite brought death to many in Israel. The people came and said to Moses, 'We have sinned by speaking against the Lord and against you. Intercede for us with the Lord to save us from these serpents.' Moses interceded for the people, and the Lord answered him, 'Make a fiery serpent and put it on a standard. If anyone is bitten and looks at it, he shall live.' So Moses fashioned a bronze serpent which he put on a standard, and if anyone was bitten by a serpent, he looked at the bronze serpent and lived.

But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved.' When this Feast falls on a Sunday, the Creed is said.
