THE IMPORTANCE OF BEING PRESENT FOR THE ENTIRE HOLY MASS

The Holy Mass is the highest form of worship in the Catholic Church. It is not just a religious obligation, but a sacred encounter with Jesus Christ Himself—through His Word, His Sacrifice, and His Real Presence in the Eucharist. For this reason, we should strive to be present for the entire celebration, from the opening sign of the cross to the final blessing and dismissal. Arriving late to Mass means we miss vital parts of the liturgy. The Introductory Rites, including the Penitential Act and the Gloria, prepare our hearts to receive God's Word and grace. Skipping them not only disrupts our personal preparation but also the unity of the community gathered in worship. It can also suggest, even unintentionally, that we are not giving God the full respect and attention He deserves.

Every part of the Eucharist is meaningful. The Liturgy of the Word opens our hearts to God's voice through Scripture and the homily, helping us understand His will for our lives. The Liturgy of the Eucharist brings us to the foot of the Cross, where Jesus offers Himself again for our salvation. By fully participating in each part, we not only honor God but also nourish our own spiritual lives. Likewise, leaving before the final blessing is more than just a physical departure—it can signify a lack of reverence or gratitude.

The final blessing sends us forth, strengthened by grace, to live as disciples in the world. Missing this is like walking out of a conversation just before the final, most important words are spoken. Mass is not something we "fit into" our schedule—it is a sacred gift we give our full attention to. Being punctual and staying until the end reflects love, respect, and devotion to God. When we give Him our time, He gives us far more in return: His peace, His presence, and His transforming grace.

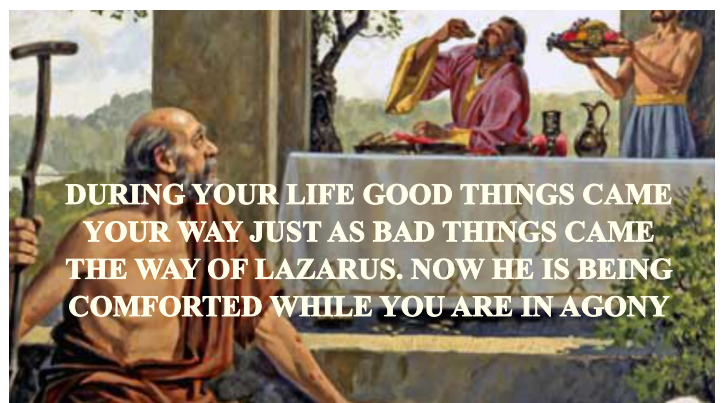

JUBILEE OF CATECHISTS

During all Masses this weekend, our Parish Catechist's will be invited to stand and receive a special blessing.

A note from Bishop Anthony -

From Friday, 26th September to Sunday, 28th September, the Church will celebrate the Jubilee of Catechists, a part of the Holy Jubilee 2025. Catechists play an important role within the life of the Church, but its one that can sometimes be hidden away. Through the work of The Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) Broken Bay, catechists are sent into public schools to provide Catholic Special Religious Education to young people. CCD catechists undertake a vital evangelising role, educating children and young people and forming them in the Catholic faith. For more and more people within our public school system, they have not heard of Jesus Christ or the Gospel, and so catechists can often represent their first encounter with the Good

News. The Jubilee also celebrates those who run Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) within their parishes, helping to introduce adults to the life of the Church and the fullness of the Christian faith. For many Saints, being a catechist has been an important part of their life and their sanctification. Saint Carlo Acutis, who was canonised earlier this month, served his parish as a catechist, helping to teach people about the faith. Blessed Peter To Rot, who will be canonised in October, was also a catechist in his village and helped to lead his parish during World War II when the Catholic missionaries were imprisoned by Imperial Japanese forces.

If you haven't considered being a catechist, now may be the time to start thinking about it. Maybe you feel called to help bring adult converts into the Church? Maybe you feel called to introduce the Gospel and Jesus Christ to children who have never heard of the Good News before?

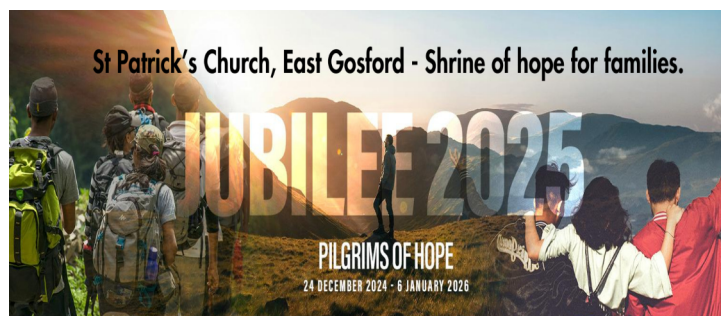

During your life good things came your way just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted while you are in agony.

Jesus said to the Pharisees: 'There was a rich man who used to dress in purple and fine linen and feast magnificently every day. And at his gate there lay a poor man called Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to fill himself with the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even came and licked his sores. Now the poor man died and was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried.

'In his torment in Hades he looked up and saw Abraham a long way off with Lazarus in his bosom. So he cried out, "Father Abraham, pity me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in agony in these flames." "My son," Abraham replied "remember that during your life good things came your way, just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony. But that is not all: between us and you a great gulf has been fixed, to stop anyone, if he wanted to, crossing from our side to yours, and to stop any crossing from your side to ours."

'The rich man replied, "Father, I beg you then to send Lazarus to my father's house, since I have five brothers, to give them warning, so that they do not come to this place of torment too." "They have Moses and the prophets," said Abraham "let them listen to them." "Ah no, father Abraham," said the rich man "but if someone comes to them from the dead, they will repent."
