**REFLECTION FOR FATHERS DAY AND FOR THE DEATH
ANNIVERSARY OF BLESSED FRANCIS JORDAN**



On September 8, we commemorate the death anniversary of Blessed Francis Mary of the Cross Jordan, the founder of the Salvatorians. His life continues to inspire countless people across the world, especially in his unwavering faith, missionary zeal, and deep love for humanity. In today's world, where fatherhood is often challenged by the complexities of modern life, Blessed Francis Jordan stands as a powerful role model for fathers striving to live with integrity, faith, and purpose.

Blessed Francis Jordan lived at a time of great societal change and religious tension. Yet, instead of being overwhelmed, he responded with courage, humility, and deep trust in God's providence. His spiritual fatherhood gave birth to the Salvatorian family, driven by the conviction that "as long as there is one person on earth who does not know and love God, you dare not rest." This passion for souls and self-giving love reflects the very heart of fatherhood — to guide, protect, and nurture life, not just physically, but spiritually and emotionally.

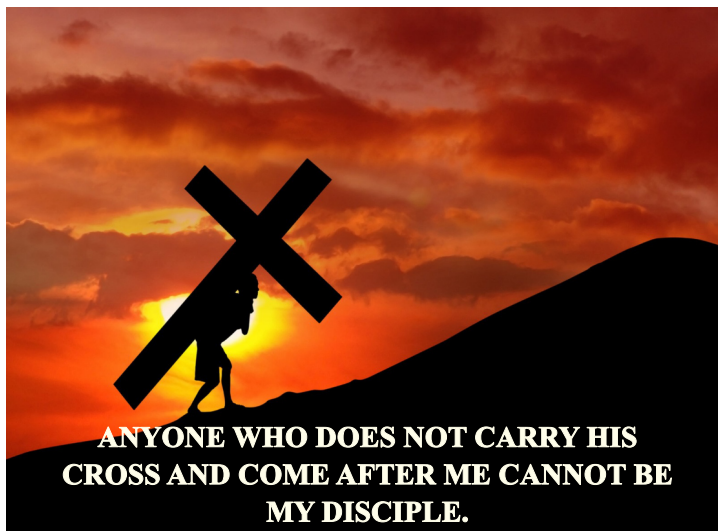
Fathers today are called to wear many hats — provider, protector, teacher, and mentor — often in a world that undervalues the sacred responsibility of fatherhood. Blessed Francis Jordan shows that a

father's strength lies not in dominance or control, but in faithfulness, service, and sacrificial love. He was a man of prayer, who surrendered daily to God's will, teaching us that a father's deepest power flows from his relationship with the Father above.

In his writings and actions, Blessed Francis emphasized encouragement over judgment, unity over division, and hope over fear. These are virtues every father is called to embody. In times of uncertainty, a father can bring peace. In times of weakness, he can offer strength. Like Jordan, a father's mission is to see the potential in others — especially his children — and draw it out with patience and love.

On this day, let us not only remember Blessed Francis Jordan for his foundational work in the Church but also hold him up as an intercessor for fathers. May they look to his example of humility, perseverance, and deep spiritual conviction as they navigate the joys and struggles of family life.

Blessed Francis Jordan, pray for all fathers, that they may be instruments of God's love, mirrors of His mercy, and beacons of His truth in their homes and in the world.

HEALING EVENING WITH FR ROZARIO PALIC (FR ROZO) 24 October 7pm

Fr Rozo's mission of healing has become well known in Europe and throughout the world. He was a Franciscan priest for 25 years before he was called to form his new order. He suffered 8 years of spiritual trial and desolation. Fr Rozo had a spiritual experience with the Holy Spirit in November 1985 followed by a 40 day fast when he lived solely on the Holy Eucharist.

Fr Rozo Palic is a priest in the diocese of Clonmel, Ireland. He has the approval of his Bishop for this healing ministry in Australia. He is the founder and manager of the clerical Brotherhood of the Triune Love and the believers' Association "Perpetual Adorers of the Holy Trinity." His community is in Trieste, Italy where he formerly lived and worked. He has written 3 books heavily based on Scripture. He graduated in Theology at the Pontifical Regional Seminary "San Pio X" in Chieti and completed a specialist training in catechism, pastoral care and liturgy at the Faculty of Theology in Zagreb. He promotes the devotion of the Most Pure Hands of Mary through spiritual renewals and seminars. He guides the believers to the "path of holiness and recovery".

Fr Rozo Palic is a renowned healing priest in Europe, America and Canada. There are 8 vocations from his family. The current Bishop of Medjugorje is his cousin. These vocations are a result of his uncle who was tortured and killed by the communist regime. Many miracles are attributed to his amazing healing ministry in Europe, America, Canada and Australia.

MINISTRATION OF THE HOLY EUCHARIST

Ministers who take the Eucharist to those unable to attend Mass are reminded to always handle the consecrated Host with the utmost reverence. The Host must be carried in a sacred vessel, known as a pyx, which both signifies and safeguards the sacredness of what it contains.

The use of a pyx provides a secure and dignified way to carry the Body of Christ, protecting it from damage or the risk of being dropped. Out of deep respect, those entrusted with carrying a pyx should always be mindful that they are transporting the Real Presence of Christ.

For additional protection and discretion, the pyx is then placed in a small purse-like case.

These purses are available for collection by Eucharistic Ministers from the Parish office.



ORDINATION ORDER OF DEACONS

On Friday, 12 September, Bishop Anthony Randazzo will ordain Shayne D'Cunha, Huy Tran and Tan Nguyen to the Order of Deacons at Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral, Waitara.

An ordination always presents a moment of joy for the Diocese, as Holy Orders are conferred on a man who has chosen to offer himself in service to the Church, either as a priest or as a deacon.

But the ordination of three men at once is a particular joy and one that most Dioceses across Australia have not experienced in decades.

The Diocese has been blessed in the past few years to have had many young men respond to God's call and offer themselves in service to the People of God in Broken Bay. But it hasn't happened by accident. It is a testament to the prayers and support of parishioners, the vocational culture built by successive Vocations Directors, and the guidance of the Bishops of the Diocese who have overseen their vocational journey.

In our parishes we should be encouraging our young men and women to discern where God is calling them, and support them if they follow His call into religious or priestly life.

We give thanks to Shayne, Huy and Tan for saying yes to God's call and for offering themselves to serve the people. May more young men follow in their footsteps and may we all continue to build a strong culture of vocations within our Diocese.

THE BIRTHDAY OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

The Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary on September 8 is a celebration of hope, grace, and the unfolding of God's plan for humanity. Though Scripture does not record Mary's birth, tradition holds this day as a joyful moment in salvation history. A reading from the letter of St Paul to Philemon

This is Paul writing, an old man now and, what is more, still a prisoner of Christ Jesus. I am appealing to you for a child of mine, whose father I became while wearing these chains: I mean Onesimus. I am sending him back to you, and with him – I could say – a part of my own self. I should have liked to keep him with me; he could have been a substitute for you, to help me while I am in the chains that the Good News has brought me. However, I did not want to do anything without your consent; it would have been forcing your act of kindness, which should be spontaneous. I know you have been deprived of Onesimus for a time, but it was only so that you could have him back for ever, not as a slave any more, but something much better than a slave, a dear brother; especially dear to me, but how much more to you, as a blood-brother as well as a brother in the Lord. So if all that we have in common means anything to you, welcome him as you would me.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

'And indeed, which of you here, intending to build a tower, would not first sit down and work out the cost to see if he had enough to complete it? Otherwise, if he laid the foundation and then found himself unable to finish the work, the onlookers would all start making fun of him and saying, "Here is a man

who started to build and was unable to finish." Or again, what king marching to war against another king would not first sit down and consider whether with ten thousand men he could stand up to the other who advanced against him with twenty thousand? If not, then while the other king was still a long way off, he would send envoys to sue for peace. So in the same way, none of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions.'
