## Year of JOY



### IN WHAT WAYS CAN THE EUCHARIST I RECEIVE SHAPE HOW I LIVE, LOVE, AND WITNESS TO CHRIST BEYOND THE WALLS OF THE CHURCH?

The Eucharist is not only a sacred ritual celebrated within the walls of the church, but also a transformative encounter with Christ that extends into every aspect of daily life. When I receive the Eucharist, I am receiving the very presence of Jesus—His body, blood, soul, and divinity. This intimate communion is both a gift and a mission: it nourishes me spiritually and sends me forth to live, love, and witness as Christ did. The Eucharist becomes a source of strength that shapes how I act, relate to others, and bear witness to the Gospel in the world.

First, the Eucharist shapes how I live by deepening my sense of purpose and gratitude. In receiving Christ, I am reminded that my life is not my own—it is a gift meant to be shared. The Eucharist invites me to live a life of service and humility, mirroring the self-giving love of Jesus who offered Himself for humanity. It challenges me to see beyond selfish desires and to live with integrity, compassion, and justice. Each Mass becomes a renewal of my baptismal call to holiness, empowering me to bring Christ's light into the ordinary moments of life—whether in my work, studies, or relationships.

Second, the Eucharist profoundly influences how I love. It teaches me to love as Christ loves—unconditionally, sacrificially, and with mercy. When I partake in the Body and Blood of Christ, I am reminded that love is not simply a feeling, but an action rooted in self-giving. The Eucharist opens my eyes to the presence of Christ in others, especially the poor, the lonely, and the marginalized. It calls me to forgive, to seek reconciliation, and to be a person of peace. In this way, the love I receive in the Eucharist becomes the love I am called to share—a love that transforms families, friendships, and communities.

Finally, the Eucharist shapes how I witness to Christ beyond the church. After communion, the priest often says, "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life." This is not a dismissal but a commissioning. I am sent forth to be a living tabernacle, carrying Christ into the world. My words, choices, and actions become testimonies of God's presence and grace. Whether through acts of kindness, standing up for truth, or simply living with joy and hope, I am called to make Christ visible in a world that often forgets Him.

In essence, the Eucharist is not an end but a beginning—a daily renewal of faith that transforms how I live, love, and witness. It unites heaven and earth, faith and action, worship and mission. Through it, I become what I receive: the Body of Christ for the life of the world.

In every season of life, Christians are invited to proclaim with their lives that true joy is found in Christ, who is our strength, our peace, and our everlasting joy.

## LETTER FROM FATHER GREG

Dear Parishioners,

As many of you are aware, Bishop Anthony Randazzo announced a few weeks ago in his pastoral letter that the Precious Blood of Christ will soon be reintroduced during Holy Communion in all churches across our diocese. This is a wonderful and grace-filled moment for our faith community, as it allows us once again to share more fully in the Eucharistic mystery — receiving both the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Having said that, our parish is not yet ready to begin this practice immediately. Before we can do so, it is essential that our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and senior altar servers receive the proper preparation and training. This is a sacred and important ministry that calls for reverence, understanding, and careful attention to detail. We must ensure that everyone involved is confident and well prepared before we start distributing the Precious Blood of Christ again.

As the end of the year is a particularly busy time for many of us, I have decided to delay the reintroduction of the Chalice until beginning of next year. This will allow us to dedicate the necessary time to provide training and formation for all ministers involved.

Thank you for your patience, understanding, and ongoing commitment to our parish community. Together, we will approach this next step in our Eucharistic life with faith, reverence, and joy.

 Our Diocese of Broken Bay will be launching at the start of November the Pastoral Works (PWBB) November Appeal. The Appeal supports various charities in our Diocesan community, particularly the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) and the Hospital Chaplaincy and Pastoral Care Program.

The Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD). In the past year, 700 volunteer catechists in our diocese have received specialised training and have provided religious education to over 12,000 Catholic students who attend public schools in our local communities.

The Hospital Chaplaincy & Pastoral Care Program. In the last financial year, our Priests and CatholicCare Pastoral Care Practitioners engaged with around 2,000 individuals (including patients, their families/friends/carers, and even hospital staff) across the seven hospitals in which we minister, representing around 5,000 pastoral visits. Our special ministry supports patients and their families when they are most vulnerable, and we are there for those who may not have a family. Sometimes, it may mean a simple conversation, a listening ear, or providing prayerful and sacramental support.

PWBB also supports St Lucy's School and St Edmund's College for students with disabilities, and the Ephpheta Centre supports the deaf community. This financial year, 2025/2026, Gosford Parish has been asked to contribute to the charity works of our Diocese with \$40,273. These ministries need our community's generosity as they get little or no Government funding.

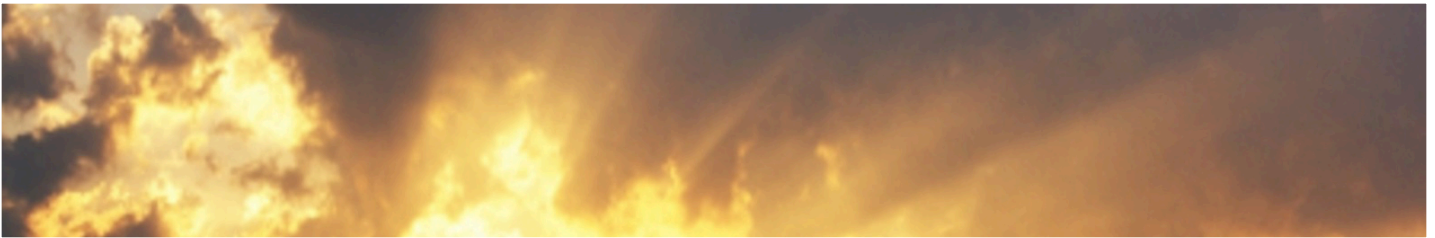

And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said, 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?'

'Take care not to be deceived,' he said, 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven.

'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name – and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict.

You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'
