WHY MASS AND PRAYERS OFFERED FOR SOULS HELP THEM IN ETERNITY

The Catholic Church teaches that our prayers, especially the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, have real spiritual power to assist souls who have passed from this life. This belief is rooted in the mystery of the Communion of Saints — the profound unity between the faithful on earth, the souls being purified in purgatory, and the saints in heaven. Though death separates us physically, it cannot break the bond of love that exists within the Body of Christ.

When we offer the Holy Mass or prayers for the departed, we participate in Christ's redemptive work. The Eucharist is not simply a memorial; it is the re-presentation of Christ's one sacrifice on Calvary. Every Mass draws its power from that same saving act, in which Jesus offered Himself for the salvation of all humanity. By offering Mass for a soul, we ask God to apply the infinite merits of Christ's sacrifice to that person — to purify them, heal them, and hasten their entrance into eternal glory.

The souls in purgatory are assured of heaven, but they still undergo purification from the remnants of sin — the lingering attachments or consequences that must be healed before they can fully share in the perfect joy of God's presence. Our prayers, almsgiving, sacrifices, and especially the Mass, help them because God, in His mercy, allows our intercessions to strengthen and console them. Just as love motivates us to care for our loved ones on earth, that same love moves us to pray for them after death.

Prayer is, therefore, the bridge between time and eternity. When we pray for our departed loved ones, we enter into a sacred conversation that transcends earthly limits. Though we cannot see them, our prayers reach them through the heart of God, and their gratitude and love reach us in return. This exchange of grace reminds us that love does not end at the grave — it is transformed.


By praying and offering Mass for the souls of the departed, we also grow in hope and charity. We are reminded of our own destiny and called to live with greater faith and compassion. In this way, prayer becomes not only a gift to the dead but also a blessing for the living — a profound act of communion with those who have gone before us into the embrace of eternal life.

DIFFERENCE BETWEEN ALL SAINTS DAY AND ALL SOULS DAY

All Saints' Day, celebrated on November 1, honors all the saints in heaven — both those officially canonized by the Church and the countless others who have reached eternal glory but are unknown to us. It is a joyful feast that reminds us of our call to holiness and celebrates the triumph of God's grace in the lives of His faithful servants.

All Souls' Day, observed on November 2, is dedicated to praying for the souls of the faithful departed who are still being purified in purgatory. On this day, the Church offers Masses and prayers for their repose, asking God to grant them eternal rest and bring them into His presence.

Together, these two feasts express the unity of the Communion of Saints — the Church triumphant (heaven), the Church suffering (purgatory), and the Church militant (on earth) — all bound together in Christ's love

Throughout November, 30 Masses will be offered each day for the repose of souls. This is a powerful spiritual gift. Our prayers and these Holy Masses help the souls in purgatory to be cleansed and prepared to enter eternal life with God. The Church teaches that our intercession, especially through the Eucharist, can bring great relief to these souls and hasten their journey to heaven.

This practice also strengthens our faith and hope in eternal life. It reminds us that love does not end with death, and that we are united in the Communion of Saints—the Church on earth, in purgatory, and in heaven. Offering Masses for the dead is a true work of mercy, showing our deep belief in God's mercy and our everlasting hope of being reunited with our loved ones in His kingdom.


We need your generosity and support!

Hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us. We were still helpless when at his appointed moment Christ died for sinful men. It is not easy to die

even for a good man - though of course for someone really worthy, a man might be prepared to die - but what proves that God loves us is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners. Having died to make us righteous, is it likely that he would now fail to save us from God's anger? When we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, we were still enemies; now that we have been reconciled, surely we may count on being saved by the life of his Son? Not merely because we have been reconciled but because we are filled with joyful trust in God, through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have already gained our reconciliation.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke
