LETTER FROM FATHER GREG

Dear Parishioners of Gosford Parish,
Today we begin a special and grace-filled journey together as we officially launch our Year of Prayer—a twelve-month invitation for each of us to deepen our relationship with God and rediscover the true power and beauty of prayer in our daily lives.

We take our inspiration from the words of Jesus in Matthew 7:7:

"Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you."

These words remind us that prayer is not complicated or distant. It is a simple, sincere opening of the heart to God—a conversation in which we ask, seek, and knock with trust, knowing that the Lord always listens. When we pray, we step into a place of encounter where God's grace meets our needs, our hopes, and even our struggles.

Blessed Francis Jordan expressed this truth beautifully when he said, "Prayer is the greatest strength of the world." In a world filled with noise, uncertainty, and conflict, prayer remains our anchor. It is through prayer that we draw strength, wisdom, courage, and peace. It is through prayer that we understand who we are before God and who God calls us to become.

Why do we launch this Year of Prayer today?

Because our parish, our community, and our world need prayer—deep, committed, and faith-filled prayer. Over the next twelve months, we want to create space for every parishioner to encounter God more intimately. This year is not merely a program, but an opportunity. We want to grow together in understanding the deeper meaning of prayer—not just as words spoken, but as a relationship lived. Prayer transforms us. It shapes our choices, our families, our attitudes, and our ability to love.

We also dedicate this year to praying for intentions that weigh heavily on the hearts of many.

We pray for peace around the world, especially where conflict and suffering continue to wound nations and families. We pray for the conversion of hearts, that all people may come to know God's love and truth. And we pray for the countless personal intentions within our parish—those spoken and unspoken—trusting that God receives each one with compassion.

Throughout this Year of Prayer, may we commit ourselves to seeking God more intentionally: in the quiet of our homes, in the beauty of the liturgy, and in the simple moments of daily life. May our hearts grow in faith, our community grow in unity, and our parish become a shining witness to the strength that prayer brings.

ADVENT SEASON

Advent invites us into a sacred pause—a gentle slowing of the heart in a world that often rushes past mystery. As we enter this season, we step into a time of waiting, watching, and preparing. Yet Advent is not a passive waiting; it is an active readiness, a deliberate turning of our attention toward the light that is coming and the light already stirring within us.

In the warmth of early summer Advent speaks of hope. Not a shallow optimism, but a deep, steady hope that grows even when circumstances remain uncertain. This season teaches us that hope often begins as a small flame—fragile, easily overlooked—yet it has the power to warm and guide us. We are encouraged to notice those sparks in our own lives: moments of kindness, glimpses of grace, and the quiet assurances that we are not alone.


Advent also calls us to prepare room. Often our hearts feel crowded—with responsibilities, worries, or distractions. This season gently asks us: What needs to be cleared? What needs to be softened? What needs to be opened? The preparation is interior. It is a willingness to listen more deeply, to make space for compassion, and to allow God to meet us in our ordinary days.

Finally, Advent reminds us to be watchful. God often arrives in unexpected ways—in humility, in silence, in the lives of people we might overlook. As we journey through this season, we are invited to pay attention, to look for the ways God is already arriving among us.


May this Advent be a time of renewed hope, gentle preparation, and awakened hearts. As we begin this session, let us enter with openness, trusting that light is drawing near and that we are being led toward a deeper fullness of life.

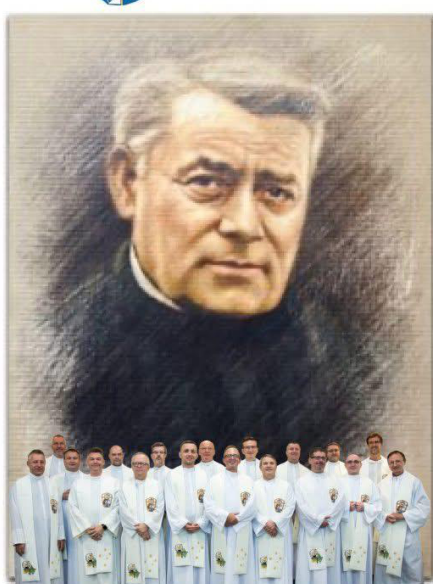
This years Advent Reflection Booklet is now available in the Church foyer. It continues the tradition of focusing on the Sunday Gospel readings, accompanied by personal reflections.

PWBB NOVEMBER APPEAL

Who does Pastoral Works Broken Bay support?

Every year, your donations to Pastoral Works Broken Bay (PWBB) support two key Diocesan ministries. They are the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) and Hospital Chaplaincy and Pastoral Care Program. PWBB also contributes financially to St Lucy's School and St Edmund's College for students with disabilities and the Ephpheta Centre which supports the deaf community.

1. Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD)

In our Diocese, more than 700 volunteer catechists who have received specialised training provide religious education to over 12,000 Catholic students attending public primary and secondary schools in our local parish communities. CCD provides regular resources and newsletters for the students and their families. It is a vital evangelisation role and a vibrant, enriching, and rewarding ministry. Without your support, thousands of our young people in our Diocese would not receive Catholic education.

2. Hospital Chaplaincy and Pastoral Care Practitioner Program

In the last financial year, our Priests and CatholicCare Pastoral Care Practitioners engaged with around 2,000 individuals (including patients, their families/friends/carers, and even hospital staff) across the seven hospitals in which they minister, representing around 5,000 pastoral visits. Their special ministry supports patients and their families when they are at their most vulnerable, and they are there for those who may not have a family. Sometimes, it may mean a simple conversation, a listening ear, or providing prayerful and sacramental support.

3. St Lucy's School

St Lucy's School is a Catholic K-12 school in the Dominican tradition for students with disabilities. They provide a holistic education, offering outstanding academic programs taught by special educators. At St Lucy's they view each child individually to unlock their unique potential and to encourage them to become independent.

4. St Edmund's College

St Edmund's is a Catholic 7 -12 high school for students with a wide range of disabilities including sensory impairment, intellectual disability, and autism. St Edmunds creates a holistic learning environment incorporating academics and personal wellbeing through co-curricular activities.

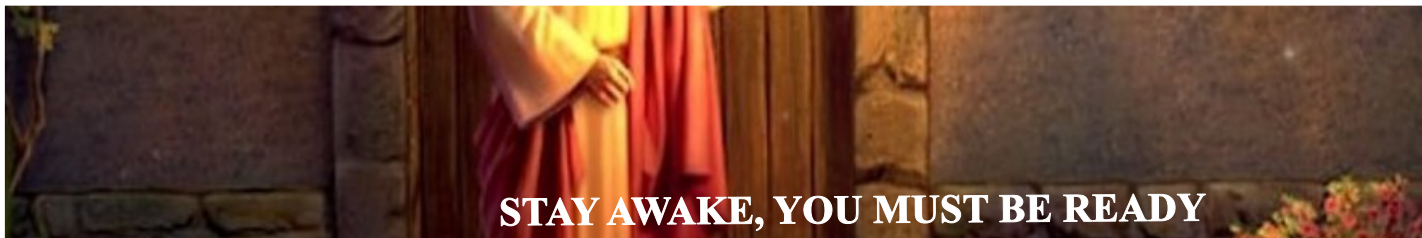
5. The Ephpheta Centre

Ephpheta means "Be Open". The Ephpheta Centre provides pastoral care, sacramental services, support, and advocacy for the deaf or hard of hearing. The chaplaincy team visits people confined to their homes, nursing homes, hospitals, and those in prison, as well as friendship community gatherings catering to people across Sydney and the Central Coast.
