# HOW DOES A GENUINE ENCOUNTER WITH CHRIST IN THE EUCHARIST RENEW MY HEART AND EMPOWER ME FOR MISSION IN THE WORLD?

A genuine encounter with Christ in the Eucharist is not simply a moment of devotion but a profound meeting that reshapes the heart at its deepest level. In the Eucharist, Christ offers Himself fully—His presence, His love, His sacrifice. When I come before Him with openness, this encounter becomes transformative. It reveals to me who I truly am: a beloved child of God who is invited into communion with Him. This realization softens what has grown hardened, heals what has become wounded, and reorders what has drifted off-center. In receiving the Eucharist, I am reminded that God's love is not distant or abstract; it is intimate, given directly into my hands, placed upon my lips, and welcomed into my very being.

This renewal happens because Christ does not enter my life merely as an idea but as a living presence. His peace steadies my anxieties. His compassion exposes the narrowness of my own heart and invites me into something wider and more generous. His humility calls me away from self-reliance and into trusting surrender. Slowly, the Eucharist trains my heart to beat more like His. It purifies my intentions and rekindles desires that perhaps had faded—desires for holiness, for communion, for deeper love.

But renewal is never meant to end in personal comfort. The Eucharist is also a commissioning. Each encounter sends me back into the world with Christ dwelling within me. I carry not only a memory of Him but His living presence. This empowers me for mission, because mission is not primarily about doing more; it is about allowing Christ to act in and through me. When I walk into ordinary spaces—my home, my work, my relationships—I do so strengthened by the One I have received.

The patience, courage, and charity I am called to offer others do not originate in my own strength They flow from the Eucharistic Christ who remains with me. Receiving Him teaches me to become bread for others: to be broken in service, poured out in love, and available in simplicity. The world hungers not only for truth but for tenderness, not only for answers but for authentic presence. The Eucharist equips me to respond to that hunger.

Ultimately, a true encounter with Christ in the Eucharist renews my heart by restoring me to love and sends me on mission by making me a vessel of His love for others.


### THANK YOU

Our school is blessed to begin a \$15 million building project in the Christmas holidays. The building company takes possession of 60% of the Victoria St Campus (Primary) on 20th December. At the conclusion of the project (May 2027) our whole school, K-6 will be located on the Church side of our school. Regarding the parking available on the school playground for weekend Masses, there will be reduced capacity. The capacity for parking will be approximately 50% of its current volume. We certainly appreciate and value your patience throughout the building project. The project company have stated that the building will be a complex and involved project. We understand it will present some difficulties over the next 18 months but kindly ask for your understanding.
















PWBB NOVEMBER APPEAL

Who does Pastoral Works Broken Bay support? Every year, your donations to Pastoral Works Broken Bay (PWBB) support two key Diocesan ministries. They are the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) and Hospital Chaplaincy and Pastoral Care Program. PWBB also contributes financially to St Lucy's School and St Edmund's College for students with disabilities and the Ephpheta Centre which supports the deaf community.

### 1. Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD)

In our Diocese, more than 700 volunteer catechists who have received specialised training provide religious education to over 12,000 Catholic students attending public primary and secondary schools in our local parish communities. CCD provides regular resources and newsletters for the students and their families. It is a vital evangelisation role and a vibrant, enriching, and rewarding ministry. Without your support, thousands of our young people in our Diocese would not receive Catholic education.

### 2. Hospital Chaplaincy and Pastoral Care Practitioner Program

In the last financial year, our Priests and CatholicCare Pastoral Care Practitioners engaged with around 2,000 individuals (including patients, their families/friends/carers, and even hospital staff) across the seven hospitals in which they minister, representing around 5,000 pastoral visits. Their special ministry supports patients and their families when they are at their most vulnerable, and they are there for those who may not have a family. Sometimes, it may mean a simple conversation, a listening ear, or providing prayerful and sacramental support.

### 3. St Lucy's School

St Lucy's School is a Catholic K-12 school in the Dominican tradition for students with disabilities. They provide a holistic education, offering outstanding academic programs taught by special educators. At St Lucy's they view each child individually to unlock their unique potential and to encourage them to become independent.


### 4. St Edmund's College

St Edmund's is a Catholic 7 -12 high school for students with a wide range of disabilities including sensory impairment, intellectual disability, and autism. St Edmunds creates a holistic learning environment incorporating academics and personal wellbeing through co-curricular activities.

### 5. The Ephpheta Centre

Ephpheta means "Be Open". The Ephpheta Centre provides pastoral care, sacramental services, support, and advocacy for the deaf or hard of hearing. The chaplaincy team visits people confined to their homes, nursing homes, hospitals, and those in prison, as well as friendship community gatherings catering to people across Sydney and the Central Coast.
