BECOMING A MORE EUCHARISTIC PARISH COMMUNITY

To become a more Eucharistic parish community is to allow the grace we encounter at the altar to shape everything we do beyond it. The Eucharist is not only a sacrament we receive but a mystery meant to transform us—heart, mind, and action—so that Christ's love becomes visible in our daily lives. When a parish understands this, its worship naturally overflows into service, welcome, and charity.

Eucharistic First, а parish İS rooted thanksgiving and reverence. Regular participation at Mass forms us to recognize God's presence in all circumstances. When our liturgy celebrated with genuine faith and prayerfulness, it nourishes the community spiritually and reminds us that we are fed in feed others. Encouraging intentional preparation for Sunday worshipthrough prayer, Scripture reflection, or quiet moments before Mass—helps parishioners arrive ready to encounter Christ and be changed by Him.

Second, Eucharistic faith leads to active service. Jesus, who offers Himself in the Eucharist, calls His disciples to self-giving love. A parish that has truly embraced the Eucharistic mystery will naturally seek out those who are hungry, lonely, or marginalized. This may take the form of supporting food banks, visiting the sick, assisting struggling families, or offering ministries that respond to local needs. Service becomes not a project, but a way of life shaped by the sacrificial love of Christ we celebrate at the altar.

Third, a Eucharistic community is marked by radical hospitality. Just as Christ welcomes all to His table, so the parish must welcome everyone who walks through its doors—regulars, visitors, the disillusioned, and those returning after years away. Hospitality teams, welcoming committee,

and everyday parishioners can create an atmosphere

where people feel seen and valued. A simple smile, a warm greeting, or a personal invitation to join parish activities reflects the openness of Christ Himself.

Finally, a Eucharistic parish is committed to love rooted in unity. The Eucharist unites us with Christ and with one another. This unity grows when parishioners listen respectfully, resolve conflicts with charity, and work collaboratively in ministry. Small groups, prayer circles, and parish gatherings strengthen these bonds, fostering a community where members support, encourage, and accompany each other in faith.

Our school is blessed to begin a \$15 million building project in the Christmas holidays. The building company takes possession of 60% of the Victoria St Campus (Primary) on 20th December. At the conclusion of the project (May 2027) our whole school, K-6 will be located on the Church side of our school. Regarding the parking available on the school playground for weekend Masses, there will be reduced capacity. The capacity for parking will be approximately 50% of its current volume. We certainly appreciate and value your patience throughout the building project. The project company have stated that the building will be a complex and involved project. We understand it will present some difficulties over the next 18 months but kindly ask for your understanding.




