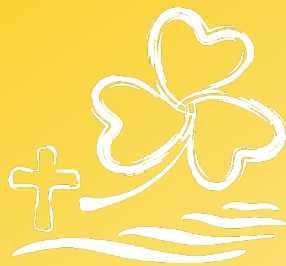

REFLECTION FOR THE FEAST OF HOLY FAMILY

On the Feast of the Holy Family, the Church invites us to contemplate the family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph as a model of love, faith, and trust in God amid life's challenges. The Gospel from Matthew presents a family that is far from sheltered or comfortable. Instead, the Holy Family experiences fear, displacement, and uncertainty, reminding us that holiness is not found in perfection, but in faithful love lived in difficult circumstances.

In today's Gospel, Joseph is once again called to act. Warned in a dream of Herod's plan to kill the child Jesus, he rises in the night and takes Mary and Jesus to Egypt. This moment reveals the family as a place of protection and self-giving love. Joseph risks everything to safeguard the life entrusted to him. Mary shares in this suffering and trust, while the child Jesus begins his life marked by vulnerability. From the very beginning, the Son of God enters a family that must flee violence in order to preserve life.

This Gospel highlights why the family is so important in our society. The family is the first and most vital community where life is welcomed, nurtured, and protected. It is within the family that children first learn love, sacrifice, faith, and moral values. The Holy Family shows us that when God is at the center, the family becomes a sanctuary of life and hope, even in the face of external threats.

Today, families face many challenges from forces that weaken their unity and dignity. Ideologies that diminish the meaning of marriage, blur the identity of family, or undermine the value of human life place families at risk. The Feast of the Holy Family calls us to protect the family as God's design: founded on faithful love, open to life, and rooted in truth. Families must be supported, not redefined or eroded, because a healthy society depends on strong families.

Central to this protection is the defense of human life itself. The Holy Family reminds us that every human life is sacred and deserving of care—from natural conception to natural death. Jesus' life was threatened even before He could speak or act. His survival depended entirely on the love and courage of His parents. In the same way, each member of the family—unborn, young, elderly, sick, or vulnerable—must be protected and cherished. When we defend life at every stage, we defend the dignity of the family and the foundation of society.

As we honor the Holy Family, we are called to renew our commitment to our own families. May we be homes of prayer, forgiveness, and faithful love. May parents, like Joseph and Mary, courageously protect life and guide their children in truth. And may the Holy Family of Nazareth watch over every family shielding them from harm, strengthening them in faith, and leading them closer to Christ.

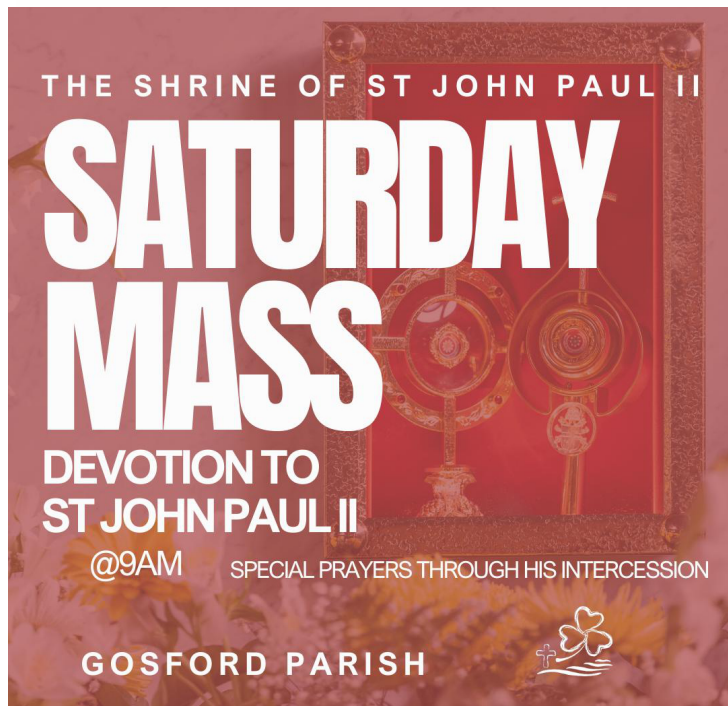

Over all these clothes, to keep them together and complete them, put on love. And may the peace of Christ reign in your hearts, because it is for this that you were called together as parts of one body. Always be thankful.

Let the message of Christ, in all its richness, find a home with you. Teach each other, and advise each other, in all wisdom. MATTHEW 2:13-15. 19-23

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

After the wise men had left, the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother with you, and escape into Egypt, and stay there until I tell you, because Herod intends to search for the child and do away with him.' So Joseph got up and, taking the child and his mother with him, left that night for Egypt, where he stayed until Herod was dead. This was to fulfil what the Lord had spoken through the prophet:

I called my son out of Egypt.

After Herod's death, the angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother with you and go back to the land of Israel, for those who wanted to kill the child are dead.' So

Joseph got up and, taking the child and his mother with him, went back to the land of Israel. But when he learnt that Archelaus had succeeded his father Herod as ruler of Judaea he was afraid to go there, and being warned in a dream he left for the region of Galilee. There he settled in a town called Nazareth. In this way the words spoken through the prophets were to be fulfilled:

He will be called a Nazarene.
