REFLECTION THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord marks an important moment in the life of Jesus and in the life of the Church. Jesus comes to the Jordan River to be baptized by John, not because He needs repentance, but to fully enter into our human story. By stepping into the waters, He stands in solidarity with humanity, with all who long for forgiveness, healing, and new life. This moment reveals who Jesus truly is and also helps us understand who we are through our own baptism.

When Jesus is baptized, the heavens open, the Spirit of God descends like a dove, and the voice of the Father is heard: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." This is a powerful revelation of the Holy Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—acting together at the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. It is also a moment that points directly to our own baptism, because what is revealed in Christ is shared with us.

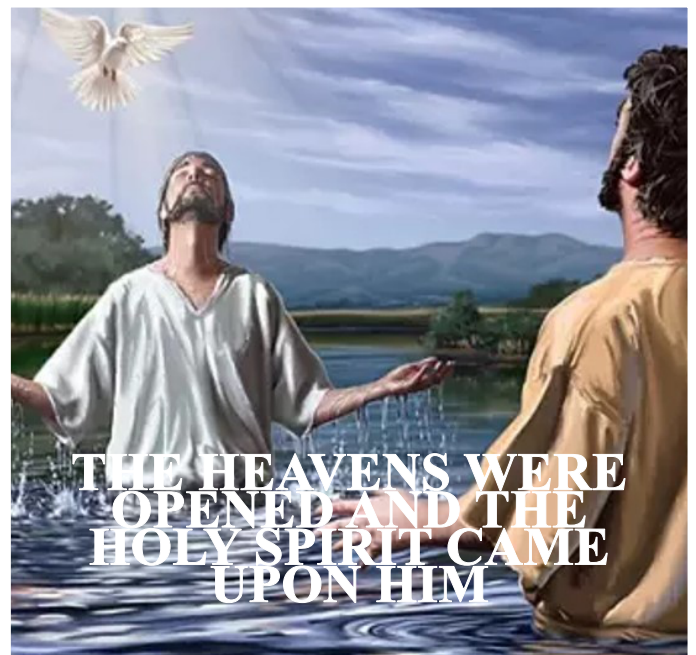
Through baptism, we become adopted children of God. This is not just a beautiful idea or symbolic language; it is a real and life-changing truth. In baptism, God claims us as His own and speaks the same words over us that He speaks over Jesus: "You are my beloved child." Our identity no longer depends on our achievements, failures, or the opinions of others. It is rooted in God's unconditional love.

Being an adopted child of God means that we belong to God's family, the Church. We are never alone. We are united with Christ and with one another. Baptism gives us a new dignity and a new purpose. We are called to live as sons and daughters who trust the Father, follow Jesus, and allow the Holy Spirit to guide our lives.

At the same time, baptism is not the end but the beginning. Just as Jesus' baptism marked the start

of His mission, our baptism begins a lifelong journey of faith. We are called to reject sin, to grow in holiness, and to reflect God's love in the world. This means living with compassion, forgiving others standing for truth, and serving those in need. Our daily choices should reflect who we are—children of God.

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord invites us to remember our own baptism with gratitude. It calls us to renew our commitment to live as God's beloved children. When we struggle or feel unworthy, we can return to this truth: we are loved, chosen, and claimed by God. May we live each day in the joy and freedom of our baptism confident that the Father delights in us and walks with us always.

1. Introduction

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Gosford Parish,

As I reflect on the past seven years of my ministry in Gosford Parish I give thanks to God for His abundant blessings upon our parish community. These years have been marked by growth, renewal, and deep faith. Through your generosity, collaboration, and commitment, we have strengthened our parish both spiritually and materially. This report highlights our journey from 2019 to 2025, outlining major achievements, developments, and initiatives that continue to shape the life of our parish.

2. Major Capital Works and Donations:

Our parish over those seven years has received significant donations for different extra projects from very generous people from our parish but also from outside the parish and because of that we were able to complete following projects: New church floor, new doors, glass wall in foyer, new door to Piety Shop, renovation of the presbytery, new sound system, establishment of St John Paul II Pastoral Centre, St John Paul II Statue, new furniture in the sacristy, electric sign board front of the church, new coffee machine for Jordan Room, marble for side altars, new ramp (Victoria Street entrance), new candle stands, air-conditioning system in the church and many other projects not mention here. Without those extra donations parish will not be able to afford any of those projects!

- Fundraising Efforts: Fundraising Committee established in 2019, and Dinner Committee in 2023. Together, they raised around \$140,000 extra through community events and parish dinners.

3. Pastoral and Spiritual Development

- Seven Pastoral Themes (2019–2025): Each year was marked by a focused spiritual theme, guiding parish formation, renewal, and mission: Year of Trust, Year of Love, Year of Community, Year of Courage, Year of Discipleship, Year of Hope, Year of Joy, Year of Prayer.

- Liturgy and Worship: Liturgy Committee established to enrich parish celebrations. New parish prayer to St Patrick introduced after every Mass. Blessing of the new statue of St Mary MacKillop, Installation of Blessed Francis Jordan's statue outside the church in 2023. First-class relics (blood and hair) of St John Paul II installed. St John Paul II Shrine established in 2022.

- Community Life: Parish picnics, parish dinners, Youth breakfasts (1st Sunday of each month), Seniors' lunches after First Friday Mass with Anointing of the Sick, Welcoming Committee, Family Group (later Domestic Church Movement) established. Parish Vision and Mission Statement renewed. Safeguarding Commitment Renewal introduced for clergy and school principals. A tree planting and commemorative plaque blessed to honour victims of abuse and reaffirm our safeguarding commitment. Publication of "Year of Love" Cookbook featuring parishioners' recipes. Parish Calendar published for Jubilee Year and 60th Anniversary of St Patrick's Church.

4. Formation, Evangelisation, and Mission

- Youth Ministry: Four youth age groups established with ongoing formation and activities. Participation in World Youth Day, ACYF, and local events. Launch of "Connecting Catholic Coasties", linking Catholic high school students across the region.

- Faith and Formation: Retreat days held regularly, with guest priests and speakers, healing evenings, encounter evenings, Faithful Counselling Ministry launched and continues every first Monday of the month. Parish Synodal

Assembly 2024 provided discernment and renewal. Five Fields of Mission adopted by Parish Pastoral Council to guide future ministry.

- Vocations: Two members of the Parish entered into the seminary, including Joseph Nicholls, and Matthew French who previously served as Youth Coordinator

- Adult and Family Formation: Domestic Church Movement provides ongoing formation for married couples and families. Fatima Nights established for Marian devotion and prayer. Many adults went through the formation to become Catholics (RCIA).

5. Significant Parish Events: Pilgrimage to Poland and Italy, Priestly Ordination of Fr Paul Tran SDS during 2020 lockdown (livestreamed), Beatification of Blessed Francis Jordan - founder of the Salvatorians, two parishioners committed as Lay Salvatorians, 20 Years of Salvatorian Ministry in Gosford celebrated in 2023, Gosford Church ranked #1 among all Christian churches on the Central Coast. 60th Anniversary of the church, 65th Anniversary of the school.

6. Communications and Media: New parish logo and bulletin design launched, Livestreaming and social media kept the community connected during lockdowns, Ongoing digital and print communication keeps parishioners informed and engaged.

7. Challenges: Sale by the diocese of St Francis of Assisi Mass centre in Somerby and arrangement of new Mass centre at St Nicolas Church (Greek Orthodox church).

8. Gratitude and Future Vision

I extend heartfelt gratitude to our parishioners, benefactors, committees, and volunteers for their dedication, generosity, and love for Gosford Parish. Together, we have built not only strong foundations for our parish but also a vibrant community of faith, hope, and service.

Parish priorities remain: Deepening our faith through worship and formation, Strengthening parish finances and infrastructure, Continuing outreach to youth, families, and the most vulnerable, Living faithfully the mission of Christ in the spirit of St Patrick, St John Paul II and Blessed Francis Jordan.

As I conclude my seven years of ministry here in the Gosford Parish, my heart is filled with deep gratitude and joy. These years have been a time of tremendous growth for me—both in my priesthood and in my service to God's people. Together, we have journeyed in faith, supported one another, and built a parish community that truly reflects the love and welcome of Christ.

I am profoundly thankful to all who have shared in this mission—parishioners, volunteers, staff, and countless others who have given their time, talents, and hearts to make our parish a vibrant and welcoming home for people of every walk of life. Your generosity, faith, and kindness have been a constant source of inspiration to me.

Every encounter, every prayer, and every shared moment of joy or sorrow has shaped my ministry in beautiful ways. I will carry with me the lessons, friendships, and memories we have built together.
