Reflecting on the words of the Scripture this weekend from the Gospel of Matthew; in the words of Peter. **"Lord, how often must I forgive my brother who wrongs me?"** The *Parable of the Unforgiving Servant* opens up that we are incapable of forgiving without first appreciating the forgiveness we have received from God.

(1) We are indebted, in our account with God's goodness. God has given us freely life, freedom, integrity and hope. We are incapable of achieving anything by our own resources---we have none! "Without me you can do nothing."

(2) "Pay me what you owe me!" We can be intolerant, demanding, inexcusable and arrogant. We can be unkind and unforgiving. We can injure our neighbour, and he can hurt us. We can elbow our way roughly through life. We can so easily hold a grudge and refuse to forgive.

(3) The ultimate reality of "God's goodness" is never simple-minded. Forgiveness only comes from realising that we have been forgiven. It is in pardoning that we are pardoned.

An unforgiving spirit creates a prison of its own. It

builds up walls of bitterness and resentment and there is no escape until we learn to forgive. We must ask from our merciful Lord for the power of forgiveness, for it is in forgiving that we are healed'.

I need to stress with the utmost urgency: *If you are feeling unwell, and especially if you have any flu-like symptoms you must cease work, stay home, isolate and get tested.* This advice is paramount to those who are in contact with such a wide range of people in the course of their ministry. *Please be hyper-vigilant for COVID-19 symptoms. These include:* • *Fever (37.5°C or higher)* • *Cough* • *Sore/scratchy throat* • *Shortness of breath* • *Loss of smell or loss of taste.*

If you have been in a COVID-19 hotspot cluster, immediately self-isolate until 14 days after you were last there and get tested even if you have no symptoms.

Let us be sure to look after one another with great care during these challenging times.
