
HORNSBY CATHEDRAL PARISH

Letter from Fr Peter de Souza 5 April 2020





My dear Parishioners,

Greetings! to each of you and your families.

The Church celebrates this weekend as both Palm Sunday and Passion Sunday. This is the time of year we stop to remember and relive the events which brought about our redemption and salvation. What we commemorate and relive during this week is not just Jesus' dying and rising, but our own dying and rising in Him, which will result in our healing, reconciliation and redemption.

Following from the same, we will enter into Holy Week liturgies, which are an invitation to deepen our relationship with God, increase our faith and strengthen our lives as disciples of Jesus.

On Holy Thursday, we celebrate three anniversaries:

- 1) The anniversary of the Institution of the Eucharist,
- 2) The anniversary of the Institution of the Ministerial Priesthood in order to perpetuate and celebrate the Eucharist, convey God's forgiveness to repentant sinners, and preach the Good News of salvation,
- 3) The anniversary of Jesus' promulgation of His new commandment of love: "Love one another as I have loved you" (Jn 13:34).

On Good Friday, we reflect on God's solidarity with suffering humanity demonstrated. Although God could have saved humanity in any number of ways, He allowed a cruel execution for His only Son to show His solidarity with suffering humanity. This gift enables us to find meaning for our own sufferings in the sufferings of Christ. Jesus' announcement, "It is finished" is clear and simple. Jesus had completed his task of reconciling sinful humanity with God, thus enabling us to accept our eternal salvation.

Easter celebrates

- The Resurrection of Christ is the basis of our Christian Faith. St. Paul writes: "If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain; and your Faith is in vain." (1 Cor 15:14)
- Easter is the promise of our own resurrection. Jesus assured Martha at the tomb of Lazarus: "I am the Resurrection and the life; whoever believes in Me will live even though he dies." (Jn 11:25-26)
- 3) Easter is a feast which gives us hope and encouragement in this world of pain, sorrows and tears. It reminds us that life is worth living.

In the coming days, we have a lot to reflect, meditate and pray upon. May I request you to please spend a few moments gathered in the same.

Fr Vincent Trung Nguyen joined the Hornsby Cathedral Parish team on the 17 May 2016. His Ministry was God's special gift to each of us. Sadly his term comes to an end, and he moves on to leafy shores. On behalf of each of you, I extend your personal gratitude to Fr Vincent. His Person, Ministry and his gift of Vocation has been a great blessing to us, and communities around us. As he moves on as a Chaplain to Royal North Shore Hospital, we wish him well, and many special blessings. When we gather once again as a community, we will be able to celebrate his gift to us. I am personally grateful for his assistance as the Master of Ceremonies."

Fr Biju Mathew Koikattil is just new to the country and will be joining us after Easter. Please make him feel welcome among us, and I ask you to offer him your welcome and support too.

As COVID-19, continues to be a part of our new long-term normal, we have been faced with new challenges in our day-to-day situation; new ways of thinking, learning, meeting and praying, and you could add on to the list all this *is being distant yet connected*.

In the past week, I had the opportunity to touch base with and say a big thank you to St Vincent de Paul Societies of our Parish and the Hornsby Circle, for meeting various needs, in a new and updated fashion, probably it has been a challenge to many of our members too.
