Letter from Fr Peter de Souza 19 April 2020





My dear Parishioners,

Greetings once again to you and your families and extended ones too! We are still in the Easter Season; hence we could greet one another Happy Easter again.

The opening prayer for this Sunday addresses the Father as "God of everlasting Mercy". God revealed His mercy, first and foremost, by sending His only begotten Son to become our Saviour and Lord by His suffering, death and Resurrection. His Mercy is freely available to us given in each celebration of the Sacraments, which were instituted to sanctify us.

Presenting Thomas' famous profession of Faith, "My Lord and my God", the Gospel illustrates how Jesus embraced the apostle in love and in His personal struggle and to reconcile the situation.

The challenge for each one of us is to be open to God's love, first in our personal lives and then in the Family and Community where we are. As agents of reconciliation, we are first called to reconcile with our personal struggles, be open to them and address them in God's love, and thus in all humility, celebrate God's mercy through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Thomas' expression of faith was an act of self-surrender to God and that leads us to serve those we encounter with love. St. Teresa of Calcutta (Mother Teresa) presents it this way: "If we pray, we will believe; if we believe, we will love; if we love, we will serve. Only then we put our love of God into action."

May our Living Faith enable us to see the risen Lord in everyone and give us the willingness to render to each one our loving service.

Divine Mercy Sunday is a recent addition to the Church's calendar, and it has links to both private revelation and the Bible. Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter. It is based on the private revelations to St. Faustina Kowalska, which recommended a particular devotion to the Divine Mercy.

Pope John Paul II (now Saint) canonized St. Faustina and, during the ceremony, he declared:

"It is important then that we accept the whole message that comes to us from the word of God on this Second Sunday of Easter, which from now on throughout the Church will be called 'Divine Mercy Sunday.' In the various readings, the liturgy seems to indicate the path of mercy which, while re-establishing the relationship of each person with God, also creates new relations of fraternal solidarity among human beings."
