

Letter from Fr Peter de Souza 5 July 2020



Pope Francis's prayer intention for the month of July: We pray that today's families may be accompanied with love, respect and guidance.



My dear Parishioners,

The Gospel of Mathew offers us three Invitations, in the name of Jesus.

Come to me, all you who labour and are overburdened, and I will give you rest.

This is directed toward all those who live their religion as a heavy burden. If they personally meet Jesus, they will learn to be alive, trusting in God as Father. They will discover an inner joy that they don't know yet. They will follow Jesus, not out of obligation, but out of attraction.

Shoulder my yoke; it is easy, and my burden is light.

Living in the presence of Jesus doesn't weigh anyone down. On the contrary, he frees up what's best in us, since he proposes that we live our lives making them more human, worthy and whole.

Learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.

We need to learn from Jesus how to live like him. Jesus doesn't complicate our life. He makes it clearer and simpler, humbler, more whole. He offers rest. He never puts onto his followers something that he hasn't lived himself. He invites us to follow him on the same path that he has walked.

Every day/weekend we gather because we have heard the Lord's invitation: 'Come to me, all you who labour and are overburdened, and I will give you rest.' We rejoice that God in His generosity has given us this day of rest, this day of rejoicing, this day when we can just be happy and reflect on the wonder of the creation. We do need to reflect regularly on this and be 'thankful' to God for all his gifts — of which life is basic. That is why we Christians call on ourselves to stop regularly, relax and reflect on life and work and leisure, and to bless the Father for his goodness, and that is: The Eucharist.

Public Health Order – 1 July 2020 Update

My dear Parishioners,

With the new guidelines from the Public Health Order, I wish to share a few important thoughts:

What's new from 1 July 2020?

Under the Public Health Order (No 4) 2020, effective from 1 July 2020 the following restrictions have been revised:

 The number of people allowed inside indoor venues (including places of worship) will be determined by the 'one person per 4 square metre' rule, with no upper limit. All activity must be seated only.

What does this mean for places of worship?

- The number of people in a public place of worship must not exceed one person per 4 square metres. At the Cathedral we can hold 97 people at a time, and QOP Church 64 people.
- The calculation must be made by measuring the floor space of the areas open to the public. For our Churches, this means the sanctuary, sacristy, or other areas where people would not congregate are not included in the calculations.

Therefore, for the Cathedral and at QOP, we shall not take further bookings. You are welcome for any of the services. But please remember to come 15 minutes earlier so that you may sign in your name and telephone number. Remember it is our civic responsibility, and our Christian calling to care for one another, and to be charitable.
