# Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for August: The Maritime World: We pray for all those who work and live from the sea, among them sailors, fishermen and their families.

My dear Parishioners,

Mt 16:13-20: "Who do people say the Son of Man is?" But you, "Who do you say I am?"

In Matthew and Mark, Jesus asked certain questions about his identity. He asked a question in two parts. The first part of the question: "What is the public opinion?" The Apostles' answer was, "Some say John the Baptist, others say Elijah, still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets." The second part of the question: "What is your personal opinion?"

For the first time in their relationship, Peter, speaking for the other disciples, declared publicly: "You are the Christ



(Messiah), the Son of the living God." Peter was the first Apostle to recognise Jesus publicly as the Anointed One. The knowledge of Jesus as Lord and personal Saviour should become a living, personal experience for each Us. This means that we have to see Jesus as our Good Shepherd, our Saviour, and our Redeemer. He is our beloved Friend, who walks with us, loves us, forgives us, helps us, and transforms. 'Who do you say that I am?' is my personal answer to this question, It's my personal experience that I bring together in worship.
