# World Mission Sunday

"Here am I, send me!' (Is 6:8)

Pope Francis said at the conclusion of his message.

"World Mission Sunday will be a day on which we will be able to reaffirm through prayer, reflection and material help our active participation in Jesus' mission in His Church."

My dear Parishioners,

Jesus then said, "Give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar — and to God what belongs to God." (Mt 22:21)

In other words, we give to the Emperor the coin because his image is on it, and we give to God our own selves because we are created in the image of God (Gn 1:26). By birth, we become the citizens of the country of our birth, and by Baptism we become the citizens of Heaven. A loyal Christian is always a loyal citizen. Failure in good citizenship is also failure in Christian duty. "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's," the command really asks us whether we have invested our heart in the right place, in something that will yield a return that's worthy of a whole human life.

- Do not click on any links that may be included in the e-mails.
