Sunday Reflection

My dear Parishioners,

The readings for the weekend speak of God's gracious initiative towards us. Their focus is not on what we do for God but on what God does for us. In the Book of Samuel, David plans to do a great service for God, no less than to build a beautiful temple as a house of prayer.

As Paul says in his epistle, 'God who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will also with him give us everything else!' In the Gospel of Luke, God's choice of Mary was not exclusive in that sense. In choosing Mary, He was choosing all of us. He chose Mary for all our sakes. The good news is that Mary did not let us down. Although initially disturbed and perplexed by the message, she eventually surrendered fully to that mysterious choice of God. Having been graced in this mysterious way, she responded wholeheartedly, "Let what you have said be done to me." And because of her response to God's choice, we can all sing, "the Almighty has done great things for us." We have all been graced through Mary's response to God's choice of her.

This is the special time of year when we allow God, to be the God of abundant graces, it is a time when we come before Him and open ourselves to His gracious love and presence.
