Sunday Reflection By Fr Manoj Manuel

Dear friends,

We are in the season of Lent once more! Praise to you Most Holy Trinity!

Lent is the most beautiful spiritual time in the liturgical year. As we travel with Church into the Lenten season, we come to many core realizations in life. How enriching is the Lenten time! A time that we get every year to stop, reflect and renew ourselves. This enables us to move closer to our life's goal as Christians to be united with God in this life and life after (cf. Rom 14:7-9). To unite ourselves with God calls us to renewal.

If we look into the second reading of this Sunday, St Peter compares how God saved few people (8 only) through the waters of the flood at the time of Noah in the Old Testament. St Peter continues saying in his 1st letter that now it is the water of Baptism that saves us. In that sense we are the chosen ones, all of us who are baptized. But does our spiritual journey end there with Baptismal water? No, it's the starting point. What are we to do then? We are then called to join in Jesus' mission. Lent is a divine call to participate in the mission of God's plan for the world through Jesus Christ. Pope Francis states it this way in his Lenten message of 2021, "Jesus revealed to his disciples the deepest meaning of his mission when he told them of his passion, death and resurrection, in fulfilment of the Father's will. He then called the disciples to share in this mission for the salvation of the world".

This Lenten season of 2021 need to be taken as a onetime opportunity in world's fight againstCovid-19 pandemic. We know in OT times, a lent was proclaimed by prophets when there was the visible evil that suppressed the people. So the prophets called for prayer, fasting and putting on sack cloth and ashes, in order to repent and do reparation for the evil affecting humanity. We too have this great burden of the Covid19 pandemic, we need to take this year's lent seriously and be spiritually active to pray for our world, that God may renew humanity, and make anew our world.

If we do not use this Lenten season to pray for our world, we will be too late. Let us join the rest of the world and intercede to God for the suffering humanity all over the world to be freed of Covid-19. As people of Nineveh repented and did reparation at the call of prophet Jonah for their waywardness, let us take upon ourselves the responsibility to pray ardently, do penance and amend life. I conclude with the words of Holy Father Pope Francis, "Lent is a time for believing, for welcoming God into our lives and allowing him to 'make his dwelling' among us" (cf. Jn 14:23).
