My dear Parishioners,

Reflecting on the Trinity, the revelation of the mystery of God's inner life, The Father, Son and Holy Spirit, is an invitation for us to enter into the intimacy of God, and experience the indwelling of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

St Augustine in a most beautiful passage from his "Confessions" (p. 211). "What do I love when I love my God?" he asks. Then he continues: "Not material beauty or beauty of a temporal order; not the brilliance of earthly light, so welcome to our eyes; not the sweet melody of harmony and song; not the fragrance of flowers, perfumes and spices; not manna or honey; not limbs such as the body delights to embrace. It is not these that I love when I love my God. And yet, when I love him, it is true that I love a light of a certain kind, a voice, a perfume, a food, an embrace; but they are of the kind that I love in my inner self." "So tell me something of my God," he asks. And loud and clear they answered, "God is he who made us."



The call of the Trinity, is our day to day living as St Paul says, like mirrors we will reflect the brightness of the Lord, until finally we are changed into that image which we reflect (2 Cor 3:17f). For this great promise, Glory be to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, forever, Amen.

The fullness of love is represented in the Three Persons in the Trinity, the Father the Son and the Holy Spirit, our challenge to be so is seen in us as an image of love, created in the likeness of God. "If we have received the Holy Spirit, then we have love of the Father, the grace of the Son and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit himself." (from the letters of St Athanasius Office of the readings of the day).

And finally, we are all used to: **1+1+1 = 3 and not 1.**
Here is something worth thinking about: 1x1x1=1
