Congratulations to our Vigil Choir who will be celebrating 20 years on 18 February. Read their story by Dennis Harris below:

The Vigil Choir is 20, by Dennis Harris.

I have played piano nearly all my life: solo, in bands, pubs and bars in several countries, not professionally, but as a hobby. I love singalongs around the piano. In 1988 Janet and I (and the kids) moved to Sydney, and we became part of this parish. During the next 10 years I did not play piano much but at some time in the 90s, Sue Haertsch showed me how to open the organ in the church (not the organ we now play) and turn it on. My father had an organ in his living room and so I was not a complete novice, but the organ was then, and remains, a challenge I am far from mastering. The piano we had in the church (and is still used in the rehearsal room) was a hand-me-down from Fr Colin Blayney's mother, and was to be avoided if possible, so I started playing organ for Masses in about 2000, twice a month. I played alone but Fr Colin was pressuring me to find some singers.

One Saturday morning I was practicing on the organ in the church when a group of people walked in. Dette (Bernadette) Yu (prompted by her mother), was the spokesperson. Dette said: "We want to sing here". ("Why me?" I thought). Jay Mendoza was to play piano but I did not want to lose my gig so I suggested we work together and on Saturday 1 February 2003 at 6 pm we sang at our first Mass together.

Before rehearsals I would have several cups of coffee. These singers and guitarists knew much more about church music than I did. Rehearsals were joyful chaos, and the singers sang songs I had never heard of, harmonizing. I had to practice long and hard to be ready. I believe (others don't agree) that on that first night we sang "Fiat" and "Give Thanks". "Fiat" was written by a friend of one of the leaders of the group. "Give Thanks" was a bit "happy-clappy" for my taste at the time, but I found that both songs enabled me to bring in my love of jazz arrangements. Together with the inherent group talent for harmony, we had sound and feeling that were very attractive to my sense of music and uplifting and encouraging to the assembly which seemed to like singing along with us.

We became known as the "Filipino Choir", which was not our choice. There were a few of us who did not fit the description, but the name stuck. We tried calling ourselves the "Vigil Gospel Choir" (because we liked "gospel" rhythms) but that did not work. These days we call ourselves the "Vigil Choir".

Des Gaddi (Dette's Sister) was our first conductor but after she and her family moved to the USA in 2006, Amelee Say took over and is still leading us.

Founder members, Leo and Soc Herrera, travel from Marsden Park (closer to Richmond than Waitara) each month. Rachel De Leon travels from Chatswood. Maila Hay, Amelee Say, Ferdie Say, Betty Koh, Alan Villaneuva and Jay Mendoza were all founder members, and they still join us. Others like Inaki Gonzales and his family, joined within the first couple of years and all of them have made music with us from time to time. Helen Lee from the Korean community sang with us while in this parish and taught us to sing "Panis Angelicus" in Korean. In 2006 we sang "Shine Jesus Shine" in the piano bar of the Menzies Hotel and brought the place down. The Menzies manager said he thought "Sister Act" was in town. A fond memory for me was Fr John Wakeling's "that was b...... marvellous" approval of our initial rendition of the Br Colin Smith song "Sprinkle Us With Living Water" (solos by Crystal Amores and Bill Aitken), one of our favourite songs introduced to us by Donrita Reefman.

Over the years we have sung at all the major liturgical events: Easter Vigil, Christmas Midnight, Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Pentecost, as well as funerals (including for one of our own – Myrna Rodriguez) and weddings. Nearly 60 people have sung and played with us over the years. (We had quite a bass section back then with Gerry Enriquez, Bill Aitken and Ringo Wenceslao). We have sung at other parishes, notably we sang at the Easter Vigil at Warnervale for Fr John Hodgson. For many years, we composed music for the Responsorial Psalm introducing a little, jazz, gospel, Country and Western and even Rock 'n' Roll.

Members of the original choir founded and performed at Club Muzika, a jazz club which played at Hornsby RSL every two weeks from 2009 to 2013 with the aim of giving singers and musicians an opportunity to perform in public, and my own group with Marian Landers and Sonya Doyle came from the Jazz Club. Fr Jim McKeon and Fr Vince Casey encouraged and supported us in this venture.

Despite the happy and casual nature of the group, and the pressures of young families growing up, we have always taken our ministry seriously, rehearsing for 2 hours before each Mass. We still do.

We will celebrate our anniversary on 18 February at the Vigil Mass by singing "golden oldies", and at Magpies afterwards. We are hoping many of the people who have been part of this wonderful friendship in music for the Church will join us that evening. (It will be interesting if all 60 turn up to sing!) And then we will set out on our next 20 years of music for the Church.

I just keep on doing what I am told, the best I can, and with much pleasure, in support of my friends:

Musicians: Dennis Harris on piano and organ, Arlen Rivera and Paul Santillan on guitar, Stef Owen on harmonica and Rhys Owen on violin (and as a bass singer).

Singers: Amelee Say (Conductor), Rachel De Leon (also leader - organiser), Leo and Soc Herrera, Janet Harris, Candice Chin, Ofel Cuachon, Maila Hay, Hilda Matthews, Dette Yu, Inaki Gonzales, Jenny Jie, Rod Rodriguez, and Keith Farrelly (the legend).

Jenna Balaton, Lino Cuachon and Vivien Goh run the slide presentations for us, and sing too.

We are joined, when possible, by: Ferdie Say, Marian Landers, Gabbi Landers, Juliet Landers, Sonya Doyle, Jeremiah Cuachon (organ and vocals).

We are always looking for new members.
