A wonderful celebration in the Diocese last weekend on the occasion of the Ordination to the Priesthood of Deacon Joseph Martin Hien Vu.

Thursday, 29 August, is the Passion of St John the Baptist when the Church commemorates one of the oldest feasts within the Church, the beheading of John the Baptist. John gathered disciples from all walks of life whom he taught, called to repentance, and baptised with water.

After John reluctantly baptised Jesus, the Holy Spirit descended upon Jesus in the form of a dove – "...and a voice from Heaven said, "This is my beloved Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." (Matthew 3:17)

With that, John's life receded into the background, "He must increase; I must decrease." (John 3:30)

John's unapologetic decision to speak out for what he believed, and for the laws of God eventually cost him his life, but his determination and unwavering integrity gives us courage to stand up and speak out against injustices in our world.
