

### Increase Our Faith, Lord

In today's Gospel, the apostles ask Jesus, "Increase our faith." He reminds them that even faith as small as a mustard seed can do great things, because the power of faith rests not in us, but in God. At the same time, St. Paul encourages Timothy in the second reading to "fan into flame the gift of God"—a reminder that faith is not passive but something to be nurtured, strengthened, and lived with courage.

Together, these readings show us that God has already planted the seed of faith in us; our task is to trust Him, nurture that faith through prayer, Word, and Sacrament, and let it bear fruit in service. Jesus further reminds us that discipleship is lived in humble service, not for recognition, but as a daily offering to the

### **Parish Feast Day Message to the Community**

#### **Dear Parishioners**

As we celebrate the *Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary* this week, we are reminded that this ancient devotion to our Lady, so loved by so many saints and martyrs, brings us not only closer to her, but closer to her Son, our Lord, Jesus Christ, the Saviour of the world.

Each bead of the Rosary leads us to reflect on the mysteries of the Son of God, our Lord, Jesus Christ, and His Mother, Mary, our Lady. Our Lady always gently draws us ever closer to her Son, as she reminds us of her greatest advice, and Salvation History's greatest advice: "Do whatever He tells you" (Gospel of St John 2:5).

The Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, first established after the unlikely victory of the Christians at Lepanto in 1571, shows us that true victory does not come through human strength, but through faith in Christ, nurtured by prayer. Today, our struggles are on different battlefields - in our hearts, in our homes, at our work, at our school - moments when we are called to trust our Lord more deeply.

The Rosary is our daily school of discipleship, teaching us to see every joy, sorrow, and glory in the Light of Christ. As we pray, we walk with our Lady, step by step, bead by bead, into the mystery of God's Love revealed in our Lord, Jesus.

This October, may we take up this beautiful and ancient tradition of praying the Rosary - the favourite spiritual exercise of countless saints and martyrs - as a successful way of coming closer to Jesus, Mary and Joseph, and placing Christ, our only Way to heaven, at the very centre of our lives.

And remember, the Rosary only takes fourteen minutes.

### Why Pray the Rosary?

- 1 It keeps Christ at the center Each mystery leads us to reflect on Jesus' life, death, and resurrection.
- 2 It strengthens our faith In times of worry or struggle, the Rosary reminds us that Christ is our refuge.
- 3 It unites us with Mary Our Mother walks with us, teaching us to trust and follow her Son more faithfully.
- 4 "Through the Rosary, Mary takes us by the hand and leads us closer to Jesus."

#### The Four Mysteries of the Rosary

The Rosary is prayed by reflecting on the life of Jesus and Mary through four sets of Mysteries. Each set contains five events (decades).

#### Joyful Mysteries (Mondays & Saturdays)

- The Annunciation The Angel Gabriel announces to Mary that she will bear the Son of God.
- 2. The Visitation Mary visits her cousin Elizabeth.
- 3. The Nativity Jesus is born in Bethlehem.
- 4. The Presentation Mary and Joseph present Jesus in the Temple.
- The Finding in the Temple Mary and Joseph find Jesus teaching in the Temple.

#### Sorrowful Mysteries (Tuesdays & Fridays)

- 1. The Agony in the Garden Jesus prays in Gethsemane.
- 2. The Scourging at the Pillar Jesus is scourged before His crucifixion.
- 3. The Crowning with Thorns Jesus is mocked and crowned with thorns.
- 4. The Carrying of the Cross Jesus carries His Cross to Calvary.
- 5. The Crucifixion Jesus dies on the Cross for our salvation.

## Glorious Mysteries (Wednesdays & Sundays)

- 1. The Resurrection Jesus rises from the dead.
- 2. The Ascension Jesus ascends into heaven.
- The Descent of the Holy Spirit The Spirit comes upon Mary and the Apostles.
- 4. The Assumption Mary is taken body and soul into heaven.
- 5. The Coronation Mary is crowned Queen of Heaven and Earth.

#### **Luminous Mysteries (Thursdays)**

- 1. The Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan.
- 2. The Wedding Feast at Cana.
- 3. The Proclamation of the Kingdom of God.
- 4. The Transfiguration of Jesus.
- 5. The Institution of the Eucharist.

Together, these Mysteries help us walk through the Gospel and grow closer to Christ through Mary.


#### **ROSARY RALLY**

#### Congregational Singing in Mass

The 1967 Vatican document Musicam Sacram (Sacred Music) built upon the work of the Second Vatican Council in encouraging the "active participation" of all the assembly at Mass. It states: "One cannot find anything more religious and more joyful in sacred celebrations than a whole congregation expressing its faith and devotion in song."

While emphasising the importance of the assembly's participation, space is also allowed for the Choir to occasionally sing a piece by themselves, to enrich the liturgy with sacred music beyond the scope of an unrehearsed assembly. When this takes place, the assembly is encouraged to still actively participate by "uniting themselves interiorly to what the ministers or choir sing, so that by listening to them they may raise their minds to God."


