

Come, Follow Me

In today's Gospel, Jesus begins His mission with a clear invitation: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand." He calls ordinary fishermen to follow Him, and they respond immediately, leaving behind their nets and familiar lives.

The disciples do not have everything figured out, but they trust the One who calls them. Their readiness reminds us that following Jesus begins with openness and faith, not perfection.

As Jesus teaches, proclaims the Good News, and heals, we see that God's Kingdom is already near—active wherever hearts are willing to respond. This Gospel invites us to hear Christ's call in our own lives and to follow Him with trust and courage.

Reflection Question:

What might Jesus be asking me to let go of so I can follow Him more closely?



How Hymns Are Chosen for Mass: The Liturgical Perspective

Have you sometimes wondered what guides music ministers in their selection of hymns for Mass? Can they just pick their personal favourites to sing? Well, there are three interrelated criteria that must be carefully assessed when choosing music for use in the Liturgy: the **Liturgical, Musical, and Pastoral**. Today we will focus on the Liturgical aspect.

The Liturgical judgement assesses the following aspects:

- Is the hymn text theologically sound and in accordance with Catholic doctrine?** Texts should always convey Catholic teaching, and those that reflect Protestant theology aren't appropriate for use in the Liturgy.
- Does the hymn reflect the sacred mysteries to be celebrated in a particular celebration or liturgical season?** For example, during the austere and penitential season of Lent, hymns should convey the need for repentance and personal conversion, whereas during Eastertide hymns should evoke the triumph and joy of the Risen Christ.
- Is the hymn suitable for use in a particular moment of the Liturgy?** For example, is it suitable for the Entrance procession but not as a Recessional? Or is it best suited to sing during the reception of Holy Communion?
- Is the text drawn chiefly from Holy Scripture or other liturgical sources and does it reflect the communal, shared nature of the Mass?** Or, is it written from an individual's perspective and instead emphasise a personal relationship with God? This might render a hymn more appropriate for a Praise and Worship concert instead of Mass.
