My dear Parishioners,

As we celebrate an amazing mystery — God is born into human history. The eternal God has taken human flesh, has pitched his tent among us. With joy in our hearts, we contemplate the mystery of the Word made flesh.

The Christmas invitation is, 'come to Jesus and feel welcome'. No matter what we have done, or how badly we may feel – he can help us become all that we are meant to be: beloved sons, beloved daughters of God. Come to him, to those who accept him this Christmas day, he gives power to become children of God.

Pope Francis says: 'There is no prayer in which Jesus does not inspire us to do something/ Our faith in Jesus is seen in strong action. The poor are helped at our pre-Christmas collections. We might ask not what we might get for Christmas, but how our Christmas might help others. We might ask that Christmas will be happy for others because of us – happy in body, with enough food for every family, happy in mind that we know the truth of God's coming into the world, and happy in forgiveness, as that is one of God's biggest gifts. What is the good news of Jesus for us just now?

Like the shepherds, we must search for Christ, hasten to him with eagerness, and in the quiet times of prayer understand anew our need for Christ. St Augustine held that before conceiving Christ in her womb, Mary first conceived him in her heart, by her faith. In some sense we too can bring Christ to birth, by fully embracing God's will, as we perceive it in our own lives.

May this Christmas be a special one for you and your families, and may the same continue to unfold in the New Year 2020. Be blessed and stay blessed.

STATION UPGRADE

Information on the planned upgrade of Waitara Station has been obtained from the government website via Matt Kean's office. The response is as follows: "Planning is underway for an accessibility upgrade at Waitara Station. As part of the planning process, preliminary investigations will be undertaken to help identify what upgrades will be required to make Waitara Station fully accessible. The upgrade may include new lifts, accessible pathways, and new accessible amenities such as a family accessible toilet."

All affected parishioners should continue to pursue this matter with the office of Member for Ku-ring-gai, Hon. Alistair Henskens and with the office of the Minister for Transport.

In the Final Report for the Plenary Council Phase I, the link between prayer, liturgy and renewal was a common theme. Many Catholics highlighted their desire and need for better training and formation as well as greater reflection and emphasis on liturgy and ministry in their local community.

The gathering provides a marvellous opportunity for pastoral ministers, catechists, musicians, educators and all who are interested inn the Church's liturgy to network. The keynote speaker is Fr Paul Turner STD from the Diocese of Kansas City-St Joseph, Missouri, USA.
