

My dear Parishioners,

On 2nd July 2019, I completed a year as your Pastor and leader. Every day of the past year I kept reminding myself of the motto of my Ordination, which states:



"called to joy in service, for God loves a cheerful giver".

As I continue to live the motto, I take this opportunity to thank each of you that have made this journey, with all its challenges, hopes and joys, and made it happen. Thank you for allowing me to serve you in the best way I could, understanding my strengths and weaknesses.

The year that I embarked on, will continue to remind you of the many developments that have happened in the Diocese as well as in our Community. Together we have sailed and continued our journey, and we still have miles to go, before we reach our final destination, and embark to a life lived well, and lived to its full.

Our community saw a number of unfinished projects, that were in progress slowly taking shape. Work continues behind the scenes, and let us be open to the Lord, so that He may continue to guide us through the events of each day.

The journey with the Korean Chaplaincy, which began 13 years ago, stands on its own from 1st July 2019. I ask you to say a special prayer for Fr Simon Park and the Korean Community, in this big task and Ministry ahead of them. The Chaplaincy reminds us that we are together in all this. It is not them and us, it is God's grace brought alive in and through a human culture,

and the joy that opens forth is the joy that allows the growth of His Kingdom here on earth and in our Parish Community. May God's blessings continue to journey with us all.

The formulation of the Filipino Chaplaincy and its launch in the Diocese. By its nature a totally different setup, opens us to embrace the love of God in the gifts and talents we are blessed with. They are used to serve one another through love. May the God of Love embrace all that we encounter, through the gifts of each of us as a human family.

As stewards of our Community, we have been able to bring about short-term solutions to our car park woes at the Cathedral, another ongoing challenge. All we can do is offer our best, and as someone put it, and I quote: "Car parking is a privilege, not a right."

Our renewal of the Cathedral Carpet is a testimony to what we all can do as a Community. We can make things happen jointly. So therefore, thank you for the ongoing support of assurance that we can achieve a lot in our joint efforts.

The new oil repository is a reminder that we, as a pilgrim people, are constantly on a renewal of our commitment, as a people on a sacramental journey and in turn being a sign to the people that we encounter.

The age-old problem that awaits its solution at our Normanhurst Community site with stormwater drainage, with our neighbours on Nelson Street, and the uneven forecourt at the Cathedral. All these need big attention. We are awaiting for them to happen, and I trust we can all make it happen.

With just Fr Vincent Trung Nguyen and myself, we continue to offer our Pastoral care, the best we can. I know some of you have said to us in various corners that it is a big ask, but with your prayers and ongoing support we can make it happen. We are in it together.

Our weekend Masses amount to four Masses each between the two of us, and on the first Sunday of every month Fr Vincent has an extra Mass in Vietnamese in Asquith. Also during the week on Wednesday and Fridays, we have three weekday Masses each, but in alternate weeks we celebrate two Masses each. Besides this, we also continue to meet the requests of our Hospitals, Nursing Homes, Retirement Villages and Private Homes.

If possible, we either combine or reduce some of the Masses, and make our community rich in human resources and greater strength in worship. With regard to these changes, it has to come from us all. So therefore, I invite you to pray and ask the Holy Spirit in a special way to guide us through this time. I am open to suggestions in terms of Worship and Pastoral Care, preferably in writing, as to how we can provide the best care to you, our faithful. I do understand that change can be difficult, for we all are creatures of habit, but if at least we are to give it a try, and see how it works, and then evaluate, that in itself is a big challenge, and I hope and pray it can happen.

In appeal for a volunteer Catechist Coordinator, I thank Louise Spencer for taking on the role. With her experience and expertise, in the same task as a catechist, and with the support of all of us, I am sure she will be able to undertake the task with great love and care for our children and their families in the State Schools.

In appeal for a volunteer Sacramental Coordinator, I do have a name, but it is a period of discernment that this person has undertaken, and I pray that the right decision will be made.

And finally our **upcoming Spring Ball**, I'm looking forward to it. Hopefully my dancing skills can be brought back to life. An opportunity for us all to relax, and enjoy the evening as a social event, filled with love, warmth and friendship.

And so, as we continue to be open to God's grace, I ask you to say a special prayer for each of us, Your Priests and all our faithful. We all need special prayers, and we all need to embrace God's love through prayer. May I request you to keep the prayers going.

Peter's Pence Collection

Peter's Pence Collection: This week we ioin with other Parishes across the world in taking up the Peter's Pence Collection. The Peter's Pence Collection



provides for the charitable works and structures of mercy identified by His Holiness, Pope Francis. By supporting this collection, you join with other Parishes across the world in supporting projects identified by the Pope including emergency assistance to those in need due to natural disaster, war, oppression and disease. Our generosity allows the Holy Father to respond to those suffering with love and compassion. Thank you for your generosity.

Donations using funds from the Peter's Pence appeal have assisted with these recent natural disasters including: The Indonesian island of Sulawesi affected by the earthquake and tsunami.

Between September and October 2018 violent earthquakes and a strong tsunami devastated several areas of Indonesia causing over 1,500 dead and thousands injured. The area most affected was the island of Sulawesi where the Mount Soputan volcano erupted threatening the already exhausted and worn out population.

In the first phase of emergency, Pope Francis, through the Department for the Integral Human Development Service, sent a contribution of \$100,000 that will be distributed, in collaboration with the Apostolic Nunciature, among the areas most affected by the catastrophe. During the Angelus of Sunday, September 30, 2018 the Holy Father prayed for those affected, "for the deceased, unfortunately many, for the injured and for those who have lost their homes and their jobs. May the Lord console them and support the efforts of those who are trying to bring help".
