



The Church in Australia celebrates the Sunday of the Word of God on the first Sunday in February – February 5 in 2023 (Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A).

Pope Francis established the day, which is devoted to "the celebration, study and dissemination" of the Word of God.

As we listen attentively to God's life-giving Word on this Day of the Lord, let us be open to the promptings of the Holy Spirit and remember to pray for the needs of the Church, the world and our local community everyday.

Doctors and dietitians would have some difficulty with the first part of today's Gospel. Jesus does not seem to know that salt is bad for hypertension and cholesterol! Just as health professionals are encouraging us to be careful in using salt, Jesus is telling us to keep it up. Salt in Jesus' day, and for centuries before and after, was the primary preserving agent for food. That day-to-day usage gives us a clue as to the challenge being laid before us.

We are told that if salt has lost its taste it's good for nothing. So the challenge is to keep it fresh so it can keep doing its job. Jesus suggests that, in the same way, we have to be on guard to make sure that our faith remains fresh so it's able to do its job as well.

The fifth and sixth chapters of Matthew's Gospel are devoted to describing the elements of Christian faith. At the start of the fifth chapter we have the Beatitudes that tell us that the presence of God can be discovered in all of life's situations. It reminds us that as Christians we can find God wherever we want to. The rest of these two chapters go on to give us specific directions about the dangers and aides to faith.

Jesus tells us that a hollow attachment to the letter of the law, unbridled anger, an inability to forgive, being unfaithful in marriage, seeking revenge on our enemies, not being true to our word and being enslaved by money are all examples of bad faith. Think for a moment of people you know who are trapped by any of these vicious forces. It's sad to see the energy it takes them to remain angry, greedy, legalistic, fraudulent and unforgiving.

More positively Jesus tells us in these chapters that prayer, being generous to the poor, being discerning about whom we spend time with and what we see and hear, and going without things we often consider essential are helpful to living a faith-filled life. Think for a moment of people you know who live lives like this. Their detachment, sense of generosity and ease with others stands out in our stress-ridden world.

My professor of liturgy used to say 'Good liturgy enlivens faith and bad liturgy deadens it.' This is the same message Jesus gives us today about faith in general. It's crazy for us to keep spending time with people and doing things that deaden our faith. We know the impact of these people or activities by the bad taste they leave in our mouths. After an encounter with them or it we usually tell ourselves that we must not go back for more, but the bad spirit seduces us into repeating the entire episode with frightening frequency. St Ignatius Loyola tells us that in these situations we have to deal with the bad spirit quickly and consistently and learn a new pattern of behaviour that will lead us away from darkness into the light.

The job of faith is to enable us to live out and build Christ's reign of justice and love in this world as a foretaste of what awaits us in heaven. May this Eucharist enable us to seek out the people and places that will see the saltiness of our faith remain fresh and interesting so that we will have every chance of preserving our faith in the dryer times, and of our faith in Jesus preserving us in the face of the trials and tests that come our way.



Vox Episcopi - The Voice of the Bishop - 31 January 2023

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ. A new year already! I hope you were able to rest a little after the Christmas festivities. I am very pleased I was able to have a break to refresh and energise for what is shaping up to be another very busy year for ministry and mission in the diocese.

This year I trekked the Eastern Himalayan Mountains reaching 3600 metres – certainly quite a challenge but it was wonderful to visit a completely different part of the world.

As we commence the year 2023, I could not help thinking back in time and my mind settled fifty years ago to 1973. Like many of you, I have very clear memories of the opening of the Sydney Opera House which has since hosted thousands of cultural and artistic events. It has become a symbol of the arts and a sign of artistic beauty for our Nation and for the world.

In 1973 the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that the U.S. Constitution conferred the right on its citizens to choose to have an abortion. Known as *Roe versus Wade*, this decision has caused an ongoing abortion debate all around the world, including Australia. The debate is often around whether, or to what extent, abortion should be legal, who should decide the legality of abortion, and what the role of moral and religious views in the political sphere should be. Unfortunately, the debate rarely mentions the life of the unborn child or the right to life of the unborn child. In June 2022, the U.S. Supreme Court overturned *Roe v. Wade*. Again, there was a deafening silence on the part of the innocent unborn child.

In January 1973, ten years into his pontificate, Pope Paul VI announced that the 40th International Eucharistic



[from previous page] Congress would be hosted in Melbourne. Citing Archbishop James Knox's zeal and religious ardour, the Pope pointed out the Church's readiness, especially in pastoral renewal, for promoting closer and stronger bonds of charity. He noted that the greatest testimony and pledge of Christ's love is the Eucharist where the sacrifice of Calvary is seen and believed on the altar of the cross.

Closer to our homes while the first Mass was celebrated in Terrigal in 1931 and the first church was opened by Bishop Muldoon in 1961, it was not until 1973 that Our Lady Star of the Sea was formed as a parish in its own right. This year marks the Golden Jubilee of Our Lady Star of the Sea Catholic Parish, Terrigal. I am hopeful that this Jubilee Year will become an occasion throughout the diocese to reinvigorate and celebrate our community of the Church, to take up anew the mission to the young who are eager to hear the Word of God; to families who are great witnesses of community and love in the world: to the sick and dying who remind the world that life is precious in every moment; and to those who do not know Jesus Christ, but who long for love and joy and peace in their lives, in their homes: and in the world.

My brothers and sisters, as we commence the new year, might we be inspired by these four moments from the past: (1) to celebrate the beauty of life in art, music, drama, and culture; (2) to find a courageous voice to promote the rights of the unborn child; (3) to promote and encourage genuine pastoral renewal in our community of the Church with the Eucharist as the source and summit of our ministry and life; and (4) to reinvigorate our communities across Broken Bay for mission to the young, to families, to the sick and dying, and to those who do not know Christ.

The Message of Pope Francis for the XXXI World Day of the Sick ~ Saturday 11 February ~ the liturgical memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes. Theme: 'Take Care of him'.

Compassion as a synodal exercise of healing, the Pope's message highlights the evangelical figure of the Good Samaritan as an example of compassion with which the Church is invited to measure itself in order to "become a true field hospital", and counteract the condition of loneliness and neglect to which many brothers and sisters in need are left. In the text, Pope Francis points out that the parable of the Good Samaritan "suggests to us how the exercise of fraternity, which began with a face-to-face encounter, can be expanded into organized care"



and recalls the work of priests, health workers, family members and volunteers "through whom good stands up in the face of evil every day, in every part of the world". In this perspective, the Holy Father finally emphasised that the World Day of the Sick not only "calls for prayer and closeness towards those who suffer", but at the same time "aims to raise the awareness of God's people, healthcare institutions and civil society with regard to a new way of moving forward together".
