October is the Month of The Holy Rosary

My dear Parishioners,

The month of October each year is dedicated to the Holy Rosary and this is primarily due to the fact that the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7.

Devotion to the Rosary is one of the most distinguishable features of popular Catholic Spirituality. The Rosary inspires us to meditate on the mysteries of the lives of Jesus and Mary.

In the 16th century, Pope Pius V established the standard fifteen mysteries of the Rosaries which are grouped into three, the Joyful Mysteries, the Sorrowful Mysteries and the Glorious Mysterious.

In 2002, Pope John Paul II added a set of five to the existing fifteen mysteries and these became known as the Luminous Mysteries. Today, the total number of mysteries is twenty.

"The holy Rosary is a powerful weapon. Use it with confidence and you will be amazed at the results" says St. Josemaria Escriva. Countless miracles have been obtained and victories won through this prayer of immense power. Many hearts have been touched and many discouraged people have been uplifted because of the Rosary.

On reflection, we hope that the response to last Sunday's Psalm (the day of Bob and Jean's passing) brings comfort to their loved ones and their many friends;

"The Lord is near to all who call him."

"Which of the two did the father's will?"

Reflection

The human freedom which enables us to say "yes" or "no" to God demands that we be responsible for our conduct and accountable for our behaviour.

One day we will have to stand before the judgment seat of God and answer for our good or evil deeds.

The good news is that with God's grace we are capable of changing the direction of our lives for the better!

The two different attitudes of the siblings in the Gospel of today tell us that there is a mixture of these different attitudes in all of us.

There must be a connection between what we say and what we do.

Jesus sternly criticised the religious leaders of his day, for their promises were empty.

The trail of broken promises that each of us leaves behind points out the inconsistency between what we promise and what we do.

The lesson the Gospel offers us is that we may be saying "yes" to God during our Sunday worship but turn our back on what we profess the rest of the week.

We who say "yes" to the Body of Christ don't realise that we are often saying "no" to the community of Christ.






The Synod 2021-2023


Remember the CatholicCare's Homelessness Week fundraiser in August?
