Are we so bad?

Our news media give a rather depressing picture of human nature, incurably bent on war, destruction, social and political injustice, and on all types and forms of immorality. That, of course, is what is seen as making news. But it should blind none of us from being more aware in our daily lives of the basic goodness of human nature, and of noting the many selfless and quite unnoticed acts of love and charity. And by being positive about our human nature and its capabilities for good, we become more aware of our own potential to love selflessly.

This is what Jesus tries to help the lawyer to experience. Instead of giving him a dictionary definition of "neighbour," he presents him with the

parable about the Samaritan who acts not out of a sense of duty or of guilt, but out of sheer love and generosity. Though we are not told, we can hope that the lawyer is fired with enthusiasm to live in a similar manner.

Perhaps we get impatient with the slowness of our society to make changes for the common good. But perfect love is not so soon reached. It's well to remember that Deuteronomy's law of love was given while the people were on their journey to the Promised Land, and that the Gospel parables were told while the disciples were still on their way to Jerusalem. Perfect charity is a challenge all through life. Along that journey there can be stops and even wrong turnings, but if we remember the Good Samaritan we can renew our desire to follow his example.

To stress the negatives in the parable — the violence of the brigands, the neglect by the priest and the levite — would be pessimistic and miss the real point. The Samaritan shows the virtues of humanity - even in people of whom little good was expected. The Jews were meant to take special care of the stranger, the widow, and the orphan. 

A letter to the People of God in the Parish of Ku-ring-gai Chase ~ 7 July 2022

My dear brothers and sisters,

As you are aware, Fr Shaju John OSH has returned home after the Chapter of his Religious Institute and long service leave, but only to depart us again on 21 July 2022 to assume a new ministry on the General Council of the Oblates of the Sacred Heart. Fr Shaju is to be congratulated on this new appointment which is testimony to the confidence placed in him by his confreres. However, we are sad to lose such a good priest who has served our Diocese well for over ten years. We thank him for his generosity and dedication over this period. They have been greatly valued.

Fr Shaju's Religious Institute has offered us a replacement for him to the Diocese. However, recent changes in Australian immigration procedures for clergy means that we cannot apply for the visa of the new priest until January 2023. This presents me with a considerable challenge, as I cannot draw from the possibility of additional clergy entering our Diocese and must make decisions based on the number of priests I currently have available for pastoral placement.

The situation is further complicated by the impending absence of some of our priests for long service leave.

For these reasons, I need to put in place some temporary arrangements for the care of the Parish of Ku-ring-gai Chase before being able to determine one that might enjoy greater stability.

To this end, I share with you the following:

 From 20 July to 1 August 2022, I have appointed Fr Joy Kunnassery OSH as Administrator, with assistance from a neighbouring parish. Fr Joy leaves on 1 August for a three-month period of long service leave.

 From 2 August to 1 September 2022, I have appointed Fr Biju Jose OSH as Administrator, with assistance from a neighbouring parish. Fr Biju Jose is currently Assistant Priest at the Parish of Frenchs Forest.

Brothers and sisters, I realise that this will be disruptive for the life of the parish community. I ask for your patience and understanding as I seek to address a variety of situations across our Diocese with currently limited resources and personnel.

Please join me in thanking Fr Shaju as he departs the Parish and wishing him every good wish in this new chapter in his priestly and Religious life. I ask also that we collaborate with one another as fully as possible over the coming months to ensure that the life of the Parish continues with opportunity.
