HABEMUS PAPAM - WE HAVE A POPE Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost has been elected the 267th Successor of Saint Peter. He will be known as Pope Leo XIV.

Born in Chicago, United States, Prevost, 69, studied science and mathematics before joining the Order of St Augustine in 1977. He spent many years in Peru as a missionary and teacher as well as two six-year terms as Prior General of the Augustinians. In 2023 Pope Francis appointed him prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops.

In this moment of profound significance for the Church, let's rejoice in the guidance of the Holy Spirit and give thanks for the gift of our new Holy Father. As Successor of Saint Peter, our Holy Father carries the responsibility of shepherding the People of God, sustaining the unity of the Church, and bearing witness to the Gospel in every corner of the world. We look to him with love and loyalty as he assumes this sacred ministry.
