

Witness to the Light

If I ask you 'Who are you?' and you simply answer with your first name, then I will probably be dissatisfied.

I need to start to put you into a web of relationships to get an idea of who you are. I might need your family name or some hint as to your place of birth. So, when people came to see this strange man in the wilderness, living in dire poverty on the margins of society, if he had simply given his name 'John', that would have been woefully inadequate.

This Gospel immediately puts 'John' in relationship with another – that is how we are to understand who he is. This Gospel never calls him John the Baptist. No, he is John the Witness, 'a witness to speak for the Light'. Witness? Witness to what? To the Light.

Many religious traditions use light as a symbol. The sun is the most obvious, and in English, we play on the word at Easter, speaking of the Risen Son. Candles play a prominent part in most religions. They obviously indicate some power which can overcome the darkness, some power which can dispel even the shade of death. But the opening of this Gospel, and John the Witness, prepare us for the revelation that this darkness-defeating power will turn out to be the 'One Who'. The One who is to come is declared to be 'the Light', the radiant Glory of God embodied for us and come to fulfil Isaiah's prophecy by liberating human beings from the many dark captivities which imprison them.

John does not here identify who this 'One' is. Who is it who embodies the Light of Divine Glory? We know because that Truth was made evident at the Transfiguration. The Body of Jesus Christ radiated a beautiful Divine Light. His body had the translucent glow of Divinity.

Can we become partakers in this Divine Light? The answer is 'Yes, by becoming children of the Light.' This is wonderfully symbolised in baptism. During the baptism ceremony, a small candle is lit from the great candle lit at Easter, the Paschal Candle which represents Christ the Light of the World overcoming the darkness of death.

This symbolises the sacramental relationship of the newly baptised to Jesus Christ, the Light. Just as John was who he was by his relationship to the one he called 'the Light', so too our lives should *witness* to that relationship, and that can be done in many ways.

First, by relating to those on the margins of society. Didn't Our Lord say, 'I was hungry, and you gave me food.' Every time we are generous in our compassion for another we are relating to Jesus

Second, sharing a meal is the most normal human way of relating. By sharing in the spiritual drink and heavenly bread at Mass, we are brought into a wonderful relationship with Jesus Christ, so wonderful we call it 'Holy Communion'.

These are some of the ways in which we can answer as to who we are by relating to Jesus Christ. Advent invites us to keep focused on that relationship so that when the 25th of December comes, we relate to it not just as a holiday in the calendar, but as a Holy day which we call 'Christ-mass',

On that day we celebrate the coming into human history of a vulnerable baby. We relate to that baby as Jesus the Christ, the Divine Light come into human history, the Light of the World. © Fr Michael Tate

A letter to the People of God in the Diocese of Broken Bay \sim [8 December 2020] \sim My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

One hundred and fifty years ago today, Pope Pius IX proclaimed Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. We know Saint Joseph primarily through what we read in the Sacred Scriptures. In Matthew's Gospel we discover that Joseph was from the House of David and can trace his family all the way back to Abraham and Sarah (Matthew 1:1-17). We are told that Joseph lived in Nazareth (Luke2:4), was betrothed to Mary (Matthew 1:18), and went to Bethlehem to be registered in the census ordered by the Emperor Augustus (Luke 2:1-5). Joseph is known to be an honourable and righteous man who was sensitive to the needs of Mary and the child Jesus. He was discerning and obedient to the will of God. Joseph offered protection to the Holy Family when they were vulnerable, and he provided for their care. Saint Matthew describes Jesus as the son of the carpenter. The word used by Matthew in Greek is "tekton" which refers to an artisan who works with wood, stone, and iron. Saint Joseph was clearly a man of craft and talent. For centuries, Saint Joseph has been sought as an intercessor and protector. He is often referred to as the guardian of the family, the patron of unborn children, fathers, immigrants, workers, pilgrims, carpenters, and engineers. In our Catholic tradition, Saint Joseph is called upon for help by those who struggle against doubt and hesitation. His intercession is also sought for a happy death. As we commemorate the 150th anniversary of the universal patronage of Saint Joseph, I would like to announce an initiative for our Diocese beginning today. After much prayer, thought, and consultation, I have decided to initiate a house of discernment for young men which will be called "Joseph House." It will be located at Willoughby not far from the Church of Saint Thomas. Further details will be released in the coming months. It is also my desire to initiate a house of discernment for young women in the Diocese. Please pray for the success of both initiatives. Last week I announced the transfer of 20 of the clergy within the Diocese. This is no surprise to you, of course, because I have previously requested your prayers as I discerned and prayed for our priests and our parishes. I am delighted to say that when I spoke to each of the priests and deacon, they all responded with generosity and gratitude. I am not surprised by their response, as I have come to know our clergy as good, faithful men who are willing to serve God and you, God's holy people. Please support and pray for these fine men as they conclude their time in various communities and prepare to serve others in the mission. Page 2/2 For the couple of people who have expressed their disappointment at these transfers, please remember that we are ordained for the service of the whole community of the Church, and each of us knows what is expected of us when a need arises. Please remember that each of us made a promise of obedience when we were ordained. We do not need people urging us to be disobedient or to be stingy with our gifts or generosity. That is contrary to the spirit of the Gospel and is not the spirit of our community of the Church. I would ask you to be as generous in your acceptance of these transfers as the clergy themselves have been. We are fast approaching Christmas, and my thoughts and prayers are very much with those who have been especially burdened by the events and challenges of this year. Might I encourage all of us in Broken Bay to be alert to the particular needs of others at this time. With government restrictions being eased and larger numbers of people being able to attend churches for Mass, worship, and prayer, we need to keep up our vigilance for those who might find it a challenge to return to the church space. Don't be frightened to reach out to others, you may be the face of Christ for them this Christmas. Thank you for all that you do in our community of the Church. May God bless you and your families abundantly. + Authory

Personal Participation of the Eucharist ~



It is good to see the increasing number of our parishioners for the participation of our daily masses and weekend masses.

Vatican calls for a "necessary and urgent" return to in-person Mass. Very recently, Cardinal Robert Sarah, the Prefect of the Congregation for Divine Worship has sent a letter to world's Episcopal conferences which says, "Broadcast liturgies can never replace personal participation in the Eucharist". He has encouraged them a return to the "normality of Christian life," in particular to the resumption of regular participation at Mass. He continues to say that "As soon as circumstances permit, it is necessary and urgent to return to the normality of Christian life, which has the church building as its home and the celebration of the liturgy, especially the Eucharist as the summit toward which the activity of the Church is directed...".


