

Angelic Swords of Light © Fr Michael Tate

The first reading and the gospel speak of angels. So, so will I. What springs to mind?

Have you ever seen those pictures of angels – like babies with delicate gossamer wings and usually with lots of pink and eggshell blue colouring? How sentimental, how pathetically trivial, how untrue.

Angels are more like the light-swords wielded by Luke Skywalker in Star Wars. The good angels are lightning flashes of energy serving God's purpose in the battle against evil forces which can seem to dominate our worlds, private and social.

God loved us into existence in order to share in his life, but there are forces at work trying to frustrate that. There is a cosmic-scaled battle going on. Who is on our side in that battle?

The angels. Who are they?

Consider God's tremendous creativity, erupting the material world into existence, apparently billions of years ago: the giraffe, the stars, the platypus, you – and me!

Fantastic, but why should we limit God's creative imagination to variants on material existents? What about im-material beings, non-bodily beings of great intelligence and power, and like us, free to love or resist God's plan for the whole of creation?

Those are the angels, and those who have chosen to love and serve God are on our side. Some are princes amongst the angelic beings who serve God. We hear of one in the first reading: "... Michael, the great Prince who stands guard over your people."

Others are our individual, personal Guardian Angels, so that when powers of darkness seem to engulf us, we can turn to our Guardian Angel and say: 'Fight for me', and that light-sword of God will engage in battle because that is that sort of angel's way of serving God.

That is on the personal level. But, the same battle is being waged on the larger social and political scale. For whole societies and nations it can be as though the sun is darkened. There seems to be no source of light and energy giving hope. And yet the central fact of our faith assures us that the darkening of the sun is not the last word.

We read elsewhere in the Gospels that when Jesus was crucified, done to death on the Cross, 'the Sun was darkened'. But, three days later, out of the inky blackness of the tomb Our Lord emerged victorious and his empty tomb was flanked by angelic figures. That is what gives us confidence that the worldwide battle being waged by the forces of evil will not have the ultimate success.

Our Lord Jesus Christ with his angel-warriors, his swords of light led by Michael the Archangel, 'the great Prince who stands guard over your people', will have the final decisive victory for all peoples.

At the *end* of history, the Gospel tells us that our Lord Jesus Christ will require the angels to gather us in to the Heavenly Jerusalem.

In the *meantime*, let us engage in the battle of our earthly existence with confident hope. The good angels are on our side.

God the Creator, Sustainer, and Transformer of the Cosmos wields his Light-swords – for *us*.

Pastoral Mission Update (Inc. Synod of Bishops 2023)

Evangelisation Broken Bay will be releasing an initial document highlighting the six goals for our Pastoral Mission. These six goals will serve as the basis for how the Evangelisation Broken Bay team will endeavour to support the community in living out Bishop Anthony's vision and mission for the Church. On 19 March 2022, we will be releasing the complete document which will further highlight our objectives and strategies for these six goals.

In the meantime, we are keen to engage with the community on how we can better support you in living our this vision and mission in your particular context so that the complete document can take into consideration and include the ideas of the

community. We will, therefore, be creating a process of receiving feedback from the community, encouraging all to engage with the initial document that we are due to release within the next two weeks. This document will contain one question related to each goal that is also linked to the Synod of Bishops 2023 process. This process will be aligned with the Pastoral Discernment Central Coast project in a way where both processes will run congruently and complement one another. Those in the Central Coast who contribute to the PDCC process will – through their contribution – be giving feedback relating to the Pastoral Mission and Synod process as the questions covered in each process will correspond. We, therefore, particularly invite those in the community from the two other regions of our Diocese to engage with this Pastoral Mission process. In this way, all in the community will have the chance to engage with the Pastoral Mission as well as the Synod of Bishops 2023. Further information on this will be forthcoming.
