

God's plan for human happiness is mostly frustrated by a good person burying his or her personality traits, what one might call one's talents, which is really to bury oneself and to become invisible. In the old language of my schoolboy catechism, we should be concerned not just with sins of commission, but with sins of *omission* – failure of courage, failure to take risks, failure to put everything on the line with the personality and the moment in time given to you and to me. As Shakespeare says in Julius Caesar:

'There is a tide in the affairs of men which, taken at the flood, leads on to fortune; omitted, all the voyage of their life is bound in stillness and in miseries.'

The Divine Tide is flowing through human history. We should trust ourselves to that tide which can carry us to the shores of Heaven. Failure to take risks leads to Hellish stillness and miseries. We could pause for a moment to pray that we might use our talents so as to hear:

'Well done, good and faithful servant ... come and join in your Master's happiness.'

Month of the Holy Souls ~ Mass Offerings

It's a Catholic tradition that is almost as old as the Church itself. Records dating back to as early as the year 180 show evidence of early Christians having a Mass said for a loved one. Yet, it is one of the most commonly misunderstood practices in our faith.

"The Church believes that she will be heard, for she prays in union with Christ her Head and Spouse, who takes up this plea of his Bride and joins it to his own redemptive sacrifice." - St John Paul II

Here is what you should know about having a Mass said for a family member or a friend.

It is the single greatest prayer we can offer for the deceased. The Holy Souls benefit greatly from Masses offered for them.



It doesn't cost anything...but if you're able to give, an offering is appreciated.

There is no price tag on the Mass, however, it is customary to give an offering when requesting a Mass for an intention. That said, money should never be the reason for deciding against this beautiful tradition. Simply make your request known and talk with a priest who will make sure that a Mass is able to be said if your financial situation does not allow for a donation. It doesn't have to be a large sum.

A Mass can be offered for a person who is still living.

Though we often think of having a Mass said for those who have passed away, Masses can be offered for those who are still alive. The Council of Trent says that Mass may be said "for the living and the dead, for sins, punishments, satisfactions, and other necessities." In other words, if you know someone who could benefit from the spiritual graces that come with having a Mass said on their behalf, there is no need to delay in doing so.

You can have a Mass said in Thanksgiving or for a celebration

Again, most people remember to have a Mass said for the death of a loved one and a few may think to have a Mass offered for a special intention or friend who is suffering, but rarely do we think of having a Mass offered for a celebration! Is there a better way to show our gratitude to God? Masses can be said for birthdays, anniversaries, in celebration of the reception of the sacraments, or for prayers that have been answered!

It's not a long or difficult process to request a Mass.

Though the practice of offering a Mass is ancient, the method for doing so is not!

You can submit your Mass request *Jusing the envelopes at the back of the church and placing them on the collection* plate at any Mass], or a simple phone call to your parish will do the job.

Because the Mass is the highest form of worship on Earth, there are many fruits and graces that result from having a Mass said.

The reason that this tradition has been passed on for centuries is because of the many spiritual fruits that result from this form of prayer. The celebration of the Eucharist is the highest form of worship in the Catholic Church because we unite ourselves with Christ's sacrifice on the cross in worship of his Father.

St. John Paul II emphasized the graces that come when a Mass is offered (see above).

BOOKED OUT !!

Advise was received from the Diocese on Friday which has severely impacted the number of people who can attend this Mass.

The Facilities & WHS Officer of the DBB, Phil Greenwood (*), came out to clarify the situation for us. At a meeting between Archbishop Rev Anthony Fisher, with the State Premier, it was clarified that, under the order as it currently stands, an outdoor religious service is limited to **30** people; ... and not 300 as it is classified as an outdoor public gathering.

(*) "For the upcoming celebrations and other large feast days you will be able to have 61 per the current calculation and practice (confirmed today) as well as 12 in the Portico and 11 on the Veranda of the Church nearest to the Parish Office.'

Unfortunately, the maximum we can have present at the 50th Anniversary Mass is 84 people, and this number has already been reached in reservations. Our apologies for any disappoint which may arise to those of you who are no longer able to participate in this Thanksgiving Mass. Frs Shaju & Joy

A letter to the People of God in the Diocese of Broken Bay ~ [10 November 2020] My dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

Over the past few months there have been some wonderful areas of growth in our community of the Church.

We have a new Director of CatholicCare Broken Bay, Tim Curran. Together with the Team of dedicated workers, they have been the visible face of Jesus Christ to many people in need during these challenging times. Their vibrant and positive ministry which engages people where they are, no matter what their circumstances, is a reminder that God is merciful and compassionate.

Our Catholic Schools Broken Bay, under the leadership of Danny Casey and the Team, have commenced the opening up of the Towards 2025 vision for the education and formation of our children. The vision is stated simply so that we will commit to authentic, professional Catholic education, delivered with care and compassion. Our purpose is to inspire hearts and minds to know Christ, to love learning, to use their talents to be the very best they can be. I am also delighted that I have been able to visit every parish in the first year as Bishop of the Diocese. Normally this can take two or even three years to complete. One of the unforeseen opportunities provided by the COVID environment has been the possibility of these visits. It has been a delight to meet so many people, even if we have been restricted in our gatherings. I look forward to continuing these visits as we commit ourselves anew to the mission of proclaiming the Gospel.

Finally, I would ask your prayers at this time. Over these past couple of months, I have been praying and thinking about the upcoming transfer of clergy in our Diocese. During my visits I have been having conversations with the clergy and I have also had the opportunity to consult with people throughout the community. My hope is that the movement of our priests and deacons will ultimately allow them to thrive in their vocations and that our communities of faith will have happy, healthy, and holy priests and deacons to lead and serve.

Please pray that the Holy Spirit will guide me with the gift of wisdom. Pray also for the priests and deacons that they may respond with generosity and availability. Finally, pray for our communities of faith, that they will be welcoming and accepting of the gifts God gives, especially the gift of our clergy.

Personal Participation of the Eucharist

It is good to see the increasing number of our parishioners for the participation of our daily masses and Vatican calls for a weekend masses. "necessary and urgent" return to in-person Mass. Very recently, Cardinal Robert Sarah, the Prefect of the Congregation for Divine Worship has sent a letter to world's Episcopal conferences which says, "Broadcast liturgies can never replace personal participation in the Eucharist". He has encouraged them a return to the "normality of Christian life," in particular to the resumption of regular participation at Mass. He continues to say that "As soon as circumstances permit, it is necessary and urgent to return to the normality of Christian life, which has the church building as its home and the celebration of the liturgy, especially the Eucharist as the summit toward which the activity of the Church is directed ... ".

You have most likely heard that 'Places of Worship' can now have up to 300 people in attendance. What isn't heard often enough, is that the 4 square metre per person rule still determines the upper limit within a Church and it DOES NOT INCLUDE THE GROUNDS SURROUDING THE CHURCHES.

We can officially accommodate 101 people at Asquith and 61 people at Berowra.

Once the inside capacity of the church is reached additional parishioners will need to vacate the perimeter of the parish boundaries. **To avoid disappointment, it is MUCH PREFERRED that you BOOK IN ADVANCE** please. This will make entry into the Church much quicker as ushers simply "tick" your name & don't have to "take" details. Mass will not be disrupted either. *Thank you, Fr Shaju.*
