arrative of my own vocational journey. Rev Dr Biju Jose OSN

This year, I have been given the great privilege of celebrating 25 years of ministry as a priest. Life is a journey and over the past twenty-five years, I have travelled with a great number of people; many people have joined me on my personal journey and enriched my life with their love, friendship, support, and generosity.

Today, I would like to share with you a short history of my own vocational journey. I am the eldest of five children of Joseph and Mary. I have four siblings—Bincy, Binoy, Binu and Biby. Obviously, my parents had a significant role in my discernment and the fostering of my vocation to the priesthood. They strictly observed all the religious customs in the home. As a young boy, I attended daily Mass

with my parents, and they explained to me the purpose and value of the Holy Mass and the sacraments. They have always been actively involved in parish ministries and so I was given many opportunities to form a good relationship with our parish priests. In short, I believe my beloved parents are my first catechists and teachers of the Christian faith.

When I was in high school, vocation promoters from different dioceses and congregations introduced the importance of priestly and religious life. I was really attracted by the experiences of many priests and their examples.

Growing up, I was an altar boy in my parish. I was blessed to have my primary and high school education in Catholic Schools. After having completed my high school education, I chose to participate in the vocation camp in which Rectors from different seminaries introduced their way of life and formation programmes. I was attracted by the charism and spirituality of the Society of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. After a prayer and a serious consultation with my parents and then the parish priest, I joined the OSH Society.

The first three years I spent in our minor seminary and underwent an academic formation. Then I entered a novitiate and spent a whole year in prayer, meditation, and statute studies. It was a good time to think seriously about religious life, the priesthood, and contemporary challenges. After having completed my novitiate, I was sent to Bangalore for Philosophical studies and completed it with a B.Ph. degree. It was also a good time to think philosophically. After my Philosophical studies, I had the good fortune to do a one-year Pastoral placement and it was an occasion to learn more about my diocese and its activities. Many opportunities were offered to me to deal with the concrete problems of life. It enabled me to keep an equilibrium between apostolic activities and spiritual life.





Then I took my perpetual vows, and I was welcomed as a perpetually incorporated member of the Society. After my Pastoral placement I was sent to complete a 4-year Theological studies course and I completed it with a B.Th. degree in 1998. I was Ordained as a Priest on December 28, 1998. It was really a joyful and blessed day in my life.

After my ordination, I served two and a half years in different parishes in Kerala. It was indeed a wonderful time, and I experienced the real pastoral life of the Church. I came to know that every priest is a gift from God and priesthood is ever meaningful in the world. Then my Superior General asked me to go for higher studies in Rome. I certainly experienced the providential hand of God in that I could do my doctoral studies in the Bible. During that time, I travelled most of the European countries and learned Italian, German, and French. I also personally meet Pope John Paul II and Pope Benedict.

After having completed my PhD in the Pontifical

Gregorian University,

in 2007, I returned to my Society and was appointed as the Director of a Retreat Centre in Kerala and then as a PP. During this time as PP, under my leadership I was able to lead my flock in the building of a brandnew Parish Church. It was really a memorable time in my priestly life.

Simultaneously, I was teaching Scripture in different Seminaries as a visiting Professor. In 2014, at the request of the Seminary authorities, the then Superior General and his council asked me to take up the duty as a resident Bible Professor as well as the Vice-Rector in one of the major seminaries in India.

In November 2021, I came to Australia and was appointed as the assistant parish priest in Frenchs Forest. 2022 August onwards, I have been serving as the administrator of Ku-ring-gai Chase Parish.

I believe that my priesthood is a gift for me and a gift for all. I always give thanks to God for His wonderful and precious gift given to me for the service of God and His people.
